The Saint Helena Psalter

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First Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 1

- 1 Happy are they who have not walked in the counsel of the wicked, * nor lingered in the way of sinners, nor sat in the seats of the scornful!
- 2 Their delight is in the law of the Holy One, * and they meditate on that law day and night.
- 3 They are like trees planted by streams of water, bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither; * everything they do shall prosper.
- 4 It is not so with the wicked; * they are like chaff which the wind blows away.
- 5 Therefore the wicked shall not stand upright when judgment comes, * nor the sinner in the council of the righteous;
- 6 For the Holy One knows the way of the righteous, * but the way of the wicked is doomed.

- 1 Why are the nations in an uproar; * why do the peoples mutter empty threats?
- 2 Why do the mighty of the earth rise up in revolt and the rulers plot together, * against God and against God's Anointed?
- 3 "Let us break their yoke," they say; * "let us cast off their bonds from us."
- 4 You whose throne is in heaven are laughing; * you have them in derision.
- 5 Then you speak to them in your wrath, * and your rage fills them with terror.
- 6 "I myself have set my monarch * upon my holy hill of Zion."
- 7 Let me announce the decree of God, * who has said to me, "You are my Son; this day have I begotten you.
- 8 Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for your inheritance * and the ends of the earth for your possession.
- 9 You shall crush them with an iron rod * and shatter them like a piece of pottery."
- 10 And now, you monarchs, be wise; * be warned, you rulers of the earth.
- 11 Submit to God with fear, * and with trembling bow before the Most High,
- 12 Lest God be angry and you perish, * for divine wrath is quickly kindled.
- 13 Happy are they all * who take refuge in God!

- 1 O God, how many adversaries I have; * how many there are who rise up against me!
- 2 How many there are who say of me, * there is no help for me in my God.
- 3 But you, O God, are a shield about me; * you are my glory, the one who lifts up my head.
- 4 I call aloud to you, O God, * and you answer me from your holy hill;
- 5 I lie down and go to sleep; * I wake again, because you sustain me.
- 6 I do not fear the multitudes of people * who set themselves against me all around.
- 7 Rise up, O God; set me free, O my God; * surely, you will strike all my enemies across the face; you will break the teeth of the wicked.
- 8 Deliverance belongs to you, O Most High. * Your blessing be upon your people!

Psalm 4

- Answer me when I call, O God, defender of my cause; * you set me free when I am hard-pressed; have mercy on me and hear my prayer.
- 2 "You mortals, how long will you dishonor my glory; * how long will you worship dumb idols and run after false gods?"
- 3 Know that God does wonders for the faithful; * when I call, God will hear me.
- 4 Tremble, then, and do not sin; * speak to your heart in silence upon your bed.
- 5 Offer the appointed sacrifices, * and put your trust in the Most High.
- 6 Many are saying,
 "Oh, that we might see better times!" *
 Lift up the light of your countenance upon us, O God.
- 7 You have put gladness in my heart, * more than when grain and wine and oil increase.
- 8 I lie down in peace; at once I fall asleep; * for only you, God, make me dwell in safety.

- 1 Give ear to my words, O God; * consider my meditation.
- 2 Hearken to my cry for help, my Sovereign and my God, * for I make my prayer to you.
- 3 In the morning you hear my voice; * early in the morning I make my appeal and watch for you.
- 4 For you are not a God who takes pleasure in wickedness, * and evil cannot dwell with you.
- 5 Braggarts cannot stand in your sight; * you hate all those who work wickedness.

- 6 You destroy those who speak lies; * the bloodthirsty and deceitful, O God, you abhor.
- 7 But as for me, through the greatness of your mercy I will go into your house; *
 - I will bow down toward your holy temple in awe of you.
- 8 Lead me, O God, in your righteousness, because of those who lie in wait for me; * make your way straight before me,
- 9 For there is no truth in their mouth; * there is destruction in their heart;
- 10 Their throat is an open grave; * they flatter with their tongue.
- 11 Declare them guilty, O God; * let them fall, because of their schemes.
- 12 Because of their many transgressions cast them out, * for they have rebelled against you.
- 13 But all who take refuge in you will be glad; * they will sing out their joy for ever.
- 14 You will shelter them, * so that those who love your Name may exult in you.
- 15 For you, O God, will bless the righteous; * you will defend them with your favor as with a shield.

First Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 6

- 1 O God, do not rebuke me in your anger; * do not punish me in your wrath.
- 2 Have pity on me, O God, for I am weak; * heal me, for my bones are racked.
- 3 My spirit shakes with terror; * how long, O God, how long?
- 4 Turn, O God, and deliver me; * save me for your mercy's sake.
- 5 For in death no one remembers you, * and who will give you thanks in the grave?
- 6 I grow weary because of my groaning; * every night I drench my bed and flood my couch with tears.
- 7 My eyes are wasted with grief * and worn away because of all my enemies.
- 8 Depart from me, all evildoers, * for God has heard the sound of my weeping.
- 9 God has heard my supplication; * God accepts my prayer.
- 10 All my enemies shall be confounded and quake with fear; * they shall turn back and suddenly be put to shame.

- 1 O Most High, I take refuge in you; * save and deliver me from all who pursue me;
- 2 Lest like a lion they tear me in pieces * and snatch me away with none to deliver me.

| 1 | O God our Governor, * |

- 10 O God, our Governor, * how exalted is your Name in all the world!

Second Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 9

- 1 I will give thanks to you, O God, with my whole heart; * I will tell of all your marvelous works.
- 2 I will be glad and rejoice in you; * I will sing to your Name, O Most High.
- 3 When my enemies are driven back, * they will stumble and perish at your presence.
- 4 For you have maintained my right and my cause; * you sit upon your throne judging right.
- 5 You have rebuked the ungodly and destroyed the wicked; * you have blotted out their name for ever and ever.
- 6 As for the enemy, they are finished, in perpetual ruin, * their cities plowed under, the memory of them perished;
- 7 But you, O God, are enthroned for ever; * you have set up your throne for judgment.
- 8 You rule the world with righteousness * and judge the peoples with equity.
- 9 You will be a refuge for the oppressed, * a refuge in time of trouble.
- 10 Those who know your Name will put their trust in you, * for you never forsake those who seek you, O God.
- 11 Sing praise to the Holy One who dwells in Zion; * proclaim to the peoples the things God has done.
- 12 The Avenger of blood will remember them * and will not forget the cry of the afflicted.
- 13 Have pity on me, O God; *see the misery I suffer from those who hate me,O you who lift me up from the gate of death,
- 14 So that I may tell of all your praises and rejoice in your salvation * in the gates of the city of Zion.
- 15 The ungodly have fallen into the pit they dug, * and in the snare they set is their own foot caught.
- 16 You are known, O God, by your acts of justice; * the wicked are trapped in the works of their own hands.
- 17 The wicked shall be given over to the grave * and also all the peoples that forget God.
- 18 For the needy shall not always be forgotten, * and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever.
- 19 Rise up, O God; let not the ungodly have the upper hand; * let them be judged before you.
- 20 Put fear upon them, O God; * let the ungodly know they are but mortal.

Psalm 10

1 Why do you stand so far off, O God, * and hide yourself in time of trouble?

- 2 The wicked arrogantly persecute the poor, * but they are trapped in the schemes they have devised.
- 3 The wicked boast of their heart's desire; * the covetous curse and revile God.
- 4 The wicked are so proud that they care not for God; * their only thought is, "God does not matter."
- 5 Their ways are devious at all times; your judgments are far above out of their sight; * they defy all their enemies.
- 6 They say in their heart, "I shall not be shaken; * no harm shall happen to me ever."
- 7 Their mouth is full of cursing, deceit, and oppression; * under their tongue are mischief and wrong.
- 8 They lurk in ambush in public squares and in secret places they murder the innocent; * they spy out the helpless.
- 9 They lie in wait, like a lion in a covert; they lie in wait to seize upon the lowly; * they seize the lowly and drag them away in their net.
- 10 The innocent are broken and humbled before them; * the helpless fall before their power.
- 11 They say in their heart, "God has forgotten; * God has looked away and will never notice."
- 12 Rise up, O Holy One; lift up your hand, O God; * do not forget the afflicted.
- 13 Why should the wicked revile God; * why should they say in their heart, "You do not care"?
- 14 Surely, you behold trouble and misery; * you see it and take it into your own hand.
- 15 The helpless commit themselves to you, * for you are the helper of orphans.
- 16 Break the power of the wicked and evil; * search out their wickedness until you find none.
- 17 God is sovereign for ever and ever; * the ungodly shall perish from the land.
- 18 God will hear the desire of the humble; * you will strengthen their heart and your ears shall hear,
- 19 To give justice to the orphan and oppressed, * so that mere mortals may strike terror no more.

- In God have I taken refuge; *
 how then can you say to me,
 "Fly away like a bird to the hilltop;
- 2 For see how the wicked bend the bow and fit their arrows to the string, * to shoot from ambush at the true of heart.
- 3 When the foundations are being destroyed, * what can the righteous do?"
- 4 You, O God, are in your holy temple; * your throne is in heaven.

- 5 Your eyes behold the inhabited world; * your piercing eye weighs our worth.
- 6 You weigh the righteous as well as the wicked, * but those who delight in violence you abhor.
- 7 Upon the wicked you shall rain coals of fire and burning sulfur; * a scorching wind shall be their lot.
- 8 For you are righteous;
 you delight in righteous deeds, *
 and the just shall see your face.

Second Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 12

- 1 Help me, O God, for there is no godly one left; * the faithful have vanished from among us.
- 2 They all speak falsely with their neighbors; * with a smooth tongue they speak from a double heart.
- 3 Oh, that God would cut off all smooth tongues, * and close the lips that utter proud boasts!
- 4 Those who say, "With our tongue will we prevail; * our lips are our own; who is ruler over us?"
- 5 "Because the needy are oppressed, and the poor cry out in misery, * I will rise up," says God, "and give them the help they long for."
- 6 The words of God are pure words, * like silver refined from ore and purified seven times in the fire.
- 7 O God, watch over us * and save us from this generation for ever.
- 8 The wicked prowl on every side, * and that which is worthless is highly prized by everyone.

Psalm 13

- How long, O God?
 Will you forget me for ever; *
 how long will you hide your face from me?
- 2 How long shall I have perplexity in my mind, and grief in my heart, day after day; * how long shall my enemy triumph over me?
- 3 Look upon me and answer me, O God, my God; * give light to my eyes, lest I sleep in death;
- 4 Lest my enemies say they have prevailed over me, * and my foes rejoice that I have fallen.
- 5 But I put my trust in your mercy; * my heart is joyful because of your saving help.
- 6 I will sing to the Holy One, who has dealt with me richly; * I will praise the Name of God Most High.

Psalm 14

1 The foolish have said in their hearts, "There is no God." * All are corrupt and commit abominable acts; there is none who does any good.

- 2 The Holy One looks down from heaven upon us all, * to see if there is any who is wise, if there is one who seeks after God.
- Every one has proved faithless;
 all alike have turned bad; *
 there is none who does good; no, not one.
- 4 Have they no knowledge, all those evildoers * who eat up my people like bread and do not call upon God?
- 5 See how they tremble with fear, * because God is in the company of the righteous.
- 6 Their aim is to confound the plans of the afflicted, * but God is their refuge.
- 7 Oh, that Israel's deliverance would come out of Zion! * When God restores the fortunes of the people, Jacob will rejoice and Israel be glad.

Third Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 15

- 1 O God, who may dwell in your tabernacle; * who may abide upon your holy hill?
- 2 Those who lead blameless lives and do what is right, * who speak truthfully from the heart.
- 3 There is no guile upon their tongues; they do no evil to their friends; * they do not heap contempt upon their neighbors;
- 4 In their sight the wicked are rejected, * but they honor those who fear God.
- 5 They have sworn to do no wrong * and do not take back their word.
- 6 They do not give their money in hope of gain, * nor do they take a bribe against the innocent.
- 7 Whoever does these things * shall never be overthrown.

- Protect me, O God, for I take refuge in you; *
 I have said to the Holy One, "You are my God, my good above all other."
- 2 All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land, * upon those who are noble among the people.
- 3 But those who run after other gods * shall have their troubles multiplied.
- 4 Their libations of blood I will not offer, * nor take the names of their gods upon my lips.
- 5 O God, you are my portion and my cup; * it is you who uphold my lot.
- 6 My boundaries enclose a pleasant land; * indeed, I have a goodly heritage.
- 7 I will bless you, O God, who gives me counsel; * my heart teaches me, night after night.
- 8 I have set you always before me; * because you are at my right hand I shall not fall.

- 9 My heart, therefore, is glad and my spirit rejoices; * my body also shall rest in hope.
- 10 For you will not abandon me to the grave, * nor let your holy one see the Pit.
- 11 You will show me the path of life; * in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

- Hear my plea of innocence, O God; give heed to my cry; * listen to my prayer, which does not come from lying lips.
- 2 Let my vindication come forth from your presence; * let your eyes be fixed on justice.
- 3 Weigh my heart, summon me by night, * melt me down; you will find no impurity in me.
- 4 I give no offense with my mouth as others do; * I have heeded the words of your lips.
- 5 My footsteps hold fast to the ways of your law; * in your paths my feet shall not stumble.
- 6 I call upon you, O God, for you will answer me; * incline your ear to me and hear my words.
- Show me your marvelous loving-kindness, *
 O Savior of those who take refuge at your right hand from those who rise up against them.
- 8 Keep me as the apple of your eye; * hide me under the shadow of your wings,
- 9 From the wicked who assault me, * from my deadly enemies who surround me.
- 10 They have closed their heart to pity, * and their mouth speaks proud things.
- 11 They press me hard, now they surround me, * watching how they may cast me to the ground,
- 12 Like a lion, greedy for its prey, *and like a young lion lurking in secret places.
- 13 Arise, O God; confront them and bring them down; * deliver me from the wicked by your sword.
- 14 Deliver me, O God, by your hand * from those whose portion in life is this world;
- 15 Whose bellies you fill with your treasure, * who are well supplied with children and leave their wealth to their little ones.
- 16 But at my vindication I shall see your face; * when I awake, I shall be satisfied, beholding your likeness.

Third Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 I love you, O God, my strength, * my stronghold, my crag, and my haven,
- 2 My God, my rock in whom I put my trust, * my shield, the horn of my salvation, and my refuge; you are worthy of praise.

- 3 I will call upon you, O God, * and so shall I be saved from my enemies.
- 4 The breakers of death rolled over me, * and the torrents of oblivion made me afraid.
- 5 The cords of hell entangled me, * and the snares of death were set for me.
- 6 I called upon you, O God, in my distress; * I cried out to you for help.
- 7 You heard my voice from your heavenly dwelling; * my cry of anguish came to your ears.
- 8 The earth reeled and rocked; * the roots of the mountains shook; they reeled because of your anger.
- 9 Smoke rose from your nostrils and a consuming fire out of your mouth; * hot burning coals blazed forth from you.
- 10 You parted the heavens and came down * with a storm cloud under your feet.
- 11 You mounted on cherubim and flew; * you swooped on the wings of the wind.
- 12 You wrapped darkness about you; * you made dark waters and thick clouds your pavilion.
- 13 From the brightness of your presence, through the clouds, * burst hailstones and coals of fire.
- 14 O God, you thundered out of heaven; * O Most High, you uttered your voice.
- 15 You loosed your arrows and scattered them; * you hurled thunderbolts and routed them.
- 16 The beds of the seas were uncovered, and the foundations of the world laid bare, * at your battle cry, O God, at the blast of the breath of your nostrils.
- 17 You reached down from on high and grasped me; * you drew me out of great waters.
- 18 You delivered me from my strong enemies and from those who hated me; * for they were too mighty for me.
- 19 They confronted me in the day of my disaster; * but you were my support.
- 20 You brought me out into an open place; * you rescued me because you delighted in me.
- 21 You rewarded me because of my righteous dealing; * because my hands were clean you rewarded me;
- 22 For I have kept your ways, O God, * and have not offended against you;
- 23 For all your judgments are before my eyes, * and your decrees I have not put away from me;
- 24 For I have been blameless with you * and have kept myself from iniquity;
- 25 Therefore you rewarded me according to my righteous dealing, * because of the cleanness of my hands in your sight.
- 26 With the faithful you show yourself faithful, O God; * with the forthright you show yourself forthright.

- 27 With the pure you show yourself pure, * but with the crooked you are wily.
- 28 You will save a lowly people, * but you will humble the haughty eyes.
- 29 You, O God, are my lamp; * my God, you make my darkness bright.
- 30 With you I will break down an enclosure; * with the help of my God I will scale any wall.
- 31 O God, your ways are perfect; your words are tried in the fire; * you are a shield to all who trust in you.
- 32 For who is God but you, O Holy One; * who is the Rock, except you, our God?
- 33 It is you who gird me about with strength * and make my way secure.
- 34 You make me sure-footed like a deer * and let me stand firm on the heights.
- 35 You train my hands for battle * and my arms for bending even a bow of bronze.
- 36 You have given me your shield of victory; * your right hand also sustains me; your loving care makes me great.
- 37 You lengthen my stride beneath me, * and my ankles do not give way.
- 38 I pursue my enemies and overtake them; * I will not turn back till I have destroyed them.
- 39 I strike them down, and they cannot rise; * they fall defeated at my feet.
- 40 You have girded me with strength for the battle; * you have cast down my adversaries beneath me; you have put my enemies to flight.
- 41 I destroy those who hate me; they cry out, but there is none to help them; * they cry to you, O God, but you do not answer.
- 42 I beat them small like dust before the wind; * I trample them like mud in the streets.
- 43 You deliver me from the strife of the peoples; * you put me at the head of the nations.
- 44 A people I have not known shall serve me; no sooner shall they hear than they shall obey me; * strangers will cringe before me.
- 45 The foreign peoples will lose heart; * they shall come trembling out of their strongholds.
- 46 You live, O God! You, my Rock, are blest; * exalted are you, O God of my salvation!
- 47 You are the one who gave me victory * and cast down the peoples beneath me.
- 48 You rescued me from the fury of my enemies; you exalted me above those who rose against me; * you saved me from my deadly foe.
- 49 Therefore will I extol you among the nations, O God, * and sing praises to your Name.

50 You multiply the victories of your king; * you show loving-kindness to your anointed, to David and his descendants for ever.

Fourth Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 19

- 1 The heavens declare your glory, O God, * and the firmament shows your handiwork.
- 2 One day tells its tale to another, * and one night imparts knowledge to another.
- 3 Although they have no words or language, * and their voices are not heard,
- 4 Their sound has gone out into all lands, * and their message to the ends of the world.
- 5 In the deep you have set a pavilion for the sun; * it comes forth like a bridegroom out of his chamber; it rejoices like a champion to run its course.
- 6 It goes forth from the uttermost edge of the heavens and runs about to the end of it again; * nothing is hidden from its burning heat.
- 7 Your law, O God, is perfect and revives the soul; * your testimony is sure and gives wisdom to the innocent.
- 8 Your statutes are just and rejoice the heart; * your commandment is clear and gives light to the eyes.
- 9 The fear of you is clean and endures for ever; * your judgments are true and righteous altogether.
- 10 More to be desired are they than gold, more than much fine gold, * sweeter far than honey, than honey in the comb.
- 11 By them also is your servant enlightened, * and in keeping them there is great reward.
- 12 Who can tell how often one offends? * Cleanse me from my secret faults.
- 13 Above all, keep your servant from presumptuous sins; let them not get dominion over me; * then shall I be whole and sound, and innocent of a great offense.
- 14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, * O God, my strength and my redeemer.

- 1 May the Most High answer you in the day of trouble, * the Name of the God of Jacob defend you;
- 2 Send you help from the holy place * and strengthen you out of Zion;
- 3 Remember all your offerings * and accept your burnt sacrifice;
- 4 Grant you your heart's desire * and prosper all your plans.
- 5 We will shout for joy at your victory and triumph in the Name of our God; * may the Most High grant all your requests.

- 6 Now I know that God gives victory to the anointed one; * out of the holy heaven God will answer, with a strong and victorious right hand.
- 7 Some put their trust in chariots and some in horses, * but we will call upon the Name of our God.
- 8 They collapse and fall down, * but we will arise and stand upright.
- 9 O God, give victory to our sovereign, * and answer us when we call.

- 1 The king rejoices in your strength, O God; * how greatly he exults in your victory!
- 2 You have given him his heart's desire; * you have not denied him the request of his lips.
- 3 For you meet him with blessings of prosperity * and set a crown of fine gold upon his head.
- 4 He asked you for life, and you gave it to him: * length of days, for ever and ever.
- 5 His honor is great, because of your victory; * splendor and majesty have you bestowed upon him.
- 6 For you will give him everlasting felicity * and will make him glad with the joy of your presence.
- 7 For the king puts his trust in God; *
 - because of the loving-kindness of the Most High, he will not fall. Your hand will lay hold upon all your enemies; *
- 8 Your hand will lay hold upon all your enemies; *
 your right hand will seize all those who hate you.
 You will work them like a form formage *
- 9 You will make them like a fiery furnace * at the time of your appearing, O God.
- 10 You will swallow them up in your wrath, * and fire shall consume them.
- 11 You will destroy their offspring from the land * and their descendants from among the peoples of the earth.
- 12 Though they intend evil against you and devise wicked schemes, * yet they shall not prevail.
- 13 For you will put them to flight * and aim your arrows at them.
- 14 Be exalted, O God, in your might; * we will sing and praise your power.

Fourth Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me, * and are so far from my cry and from the words of my distress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; * by night as well, but I find no rest.
- 3 Yet you are the Holy One, * enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- 4 Our forebears put their trust in you; * they trusted, and you delivered them.

- 5 They cried out to you and were delivered; * they trusted in you and were not put to shame.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm, and less than human, * scorned by all and despised by the people.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn; * they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 "You trusted in God for deliverance; * let God rescue you, if God delights in you."
- 9 Yet you, O God, are the one who took me out of the womb * and kept me safe upon my mother's breast.
- 10 I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born; * you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.
- 11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, * and there is none to help.
- 12 Many young bulls encircle me; * strong bulls of Bashan surround me.
- 13 They open wide their jaws at me, * like a ravening and a roaring lion.
- 14 I am poured out like water;all my bones are out of joint; *my heart within my breast is melting wax.
- 15 My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth, * and you have laid me in the dust of the grave.
- 16 Packs of dogs close me in, and gangs of evildoers circle around me; * they pierce my hands and my feet; I can count all my bones.
- 17 They stare and gloat over me; * they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing.
- 18 Be not far away, O God; * you are my strength; hasten to help me.
- 19 Save me from the sword, * my life from the power of the dog.
- 20 Save me from the lion's mouth, * my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls.
- 21 I will declare your Name to my people; * in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.
- 22 May all who fear you, O God, give praise; * may the offspring of Israel stand in awe, and all of Jacob's line give glory.
- 23 For you do not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty, neither do you hide your face from them, * but when they cry to you, you hear them.
- 24 My praise is of you in the great assembly; * I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship you.
- 25 The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek you shall praise you: * "May your heart live for ever!"
- 26 All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to you, * and all the families of the nations shall bow before you.

- 27 For yours is the royal power, O God; * you rule over the nations.
- 28 To you alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship; * all who go down to the dust fall before you.
- 29 My soul shall live for you;my descendants shall serve you; *they shall be known as yours for ever.
- 30 They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn * the saving deeds that you have done.

- 1 O God, you are my shepherd; * I shall not be in want.
- 2 You make me lie down in green pastures * and lead me beside still waters.
- 3 You revive my soul * and guide me along right pathways for the sake of your Name.
- 4 Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,
 - I shall fear no evil; * for you are with me;

your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

- 5 You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me; * you have anointed my head with oil, and my cup is running over.
- 6 Surely your goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, * and I will dwell in the house of God for ever.

Fifth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 The earth is God's and all that is in it, * the world and all who dwell therein.
- 2 For it is God who founded it upon the seas * and made it firm upon the rivers of the deep.
- 3 "Who can ascend the hill of the Most High, * and who can stand in God's holy place?"
- 4 "Those who have clean hands and a pure heart, * who have not pledged themselves to falsehood, nor sworn by what is a fraud.
- 5 They shall receive a blessing from the Holy One * and a just reward from the God of their salvation."
- 6 Such is the generation of those who seek God, * of those who seek your face, O God of Jacob.
- Lift up your heads, O gates;
 lift them high, O everlasting doors, *
 and the One who reigns in glory shall come in.
- 8 "Who is this who reigns in glory?" *
 "The Holy One, strong and mighty, the Holy One, mighty in battle."
- 9 Lift up your heads, O gates; lift them high, O everlasting doors, * and the One who reigns in glory shall come in.

10 "Who is this who reigns in glory?" *"This is God, the God of Hosts, who reigns in glory."

Psalm 25

- To you, O God, I lift up my soul; my God, I put my trust in you; * let me not be humiliated, nor let my enemies triumph over me.
- 2 Let none who look to you be put to shame; * let the treacherous be disappointed in their schemes.
- 3 Show me your ways, O God, * and teach me your paths.
- 4 Lead me in your truth and teach me, * for you are the God of my salvation; in you have I trusted all the day long.
- 5 Remember, O God, your compassion and love, * for they are from everlasting.
- 6 Remember not the sins of my youth and my transgressions; * remember me according to your love and for the sake of your goodness, O God.
- 7 Gracious and upright are you; * therefore you teach sinners in your way.
- 8 You guide the humble in doing right * and teach your way to the lowly.
- 9 All your paths are love and faithfulness * to those who keep your covenant and your testimonies.
- 10 For your Name's sake, O God, * forgive my sin, for it is great.
- 11 Who are they who fear you? * You will teach them the way that they should choose.
- 12 They shall dwell in prosperity, * and their offspring shall inherit the land.
- 13 You are a friend to those who fear you * and will show them your covenant.
- 14 My eyes are ever looking to you, * for you shall pluck my feet out of the net.
- 15 Turn to me and have pity on me, * for I am left alone and in misery.
- 16 The sorrows of my heart have increased; * bring me out of my troubles.
- 17 Look upon my adversity and misery * and forgive me all my sin.
- 18 Look upon my enemies, for they are many, * and they bear a violent hatred against me.
- 19 Protect my life and deliver me; * let me not be put to shame, for I have trusted in you.
- 20 Let integrity and uprightness preserve me, * for my hope has been in you.
- 21 Deliver the people of Israel, O God, * out of all their troubles.

- Give judgment for me, O God, for I have lived with integrity; * I have trusted in you and have not faltered.
- 2 Test me, O God, and try me; * examine my heart and my mind.
- 3 For your love is before my eyes; * I have walked faithfully with you.
- 4 I have not sat with the worthless, * nor do I consort with the deceitful.
- 5 I have hated the company of evildoers; * I will not sit down with the wicked.
- 6 I will wash my hands in innocence, O God, * that I may go in procession round your altar,
- 7 Singing aloud a song of thanksgiving * and recounting all your wonderful deeds.
- 8 O God, I love the house in which you dwell * and the place where your glory abides.
- 9 Do not sweep me away with sinners * nor my life with those who thirst for blood,
- 10 Whose hands are full of evil plots * and their right hand full of bribes.
- 11 As for me, I will live with integrity; * redeem me, O God, and have pity on me.
- 12 My foot stands on level ground; * in the full assembly I will bless you, O God.

Fifth Day: Evening Prayer

- God is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear? * God is the strength of my life; of whom then shall I be afraid?
- 2 When evildoers came upon me to eat up my flesh, * it was they, my foes and my adversaries, who stumbled and fell.
- 3 Though an army should encamp against me, * yet my heart shall not be afraid;
- 4 And though war should rise up against me, * yet will I put my trust in God.
- 5 One thing have I asked of you, O God; one thing I seek: *
 - that I may dwell in your house all the days of my life,
- 6 To behold your fair beauty, O God, * and to seek you in your temple.
- 7 For in the day of trouble you shall keep me safe in your shelter; * you shall hide me in the secrecy of your dwelling and set me high upon a rock.
- 8 Even now you lift up my head * above my enemies round about me.
- 9 Therefore I will offer in your dwelling an oblation with sounds of great gladness; * I will sing and make music to you.
- 10 Hearken to my voice, O Most High, when I call; * have mercy on me and answer me.

- 11 You speak in my heart and say, "Seek my face." * Your face, O God, will I seek.
- 12 Hide not your face from me, * nor turn away your servant in displeasure.
- 13 You have been my helper; cast me not away; * do not forsake me, O God of my salvation.
- 14 Though my father and my mother forsake me, * you will sustain me.
- 15 Show me your way, O God, * lead me on a level path, because of my enemies.
- 16 Deliver me not into the hand of my adversaries, * for false witnesses have risen up against me, and also those who speak malice.
- 17 What if I had not believed that I should see the goodness of my God * in the land of the living!
- 18 O tarry and await God's pleasure; be strong, and let your heart take comfort; * wait patiently for God.

- O God, I call to you; my Rock, do not be deaf to my cry; * lest, if you do not hear me, I become like those who go down to the Pit.
- 2 Hear the voice of my prayer when I cry out to you, * when I lift up my hands to your holy of holies.
- 3 Do not snatch me away with the wicked or with the evildoers, * who speak peaceably with their neighbors, while strife is in their hearts.
- 4 Repay them according to their deeds, * and according to the wickedness of their actions.
- 5 According to the work of their hands repay them, * and give them their just deserts.
- 6 They have no understanding of your doings, nor of the works of your hands; * therefore you will break them down and not build them up.
- 7 Blest are you, O God, * for you have heard the voice of my prayer.
- 8 You are my strength and my shield; * my heart trusts in you, and I have been helped;
- 9 Therefore my heart dances for joy, * and in my song will I praise you.
- 10 You are the strength of your people, * a safe refuge for your anointed.
- 11 Save your people and bless your inheritance; * shepherd them and carry them for ever.

Psalm 29

1 Ascribe to God, you heavenly beings, * ascribe to God glory and strength.

- 2 Ascribe due honor to God's holy Name; * worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness.
- 3 The voice of God is upon the waters; the God of glory thunders; * God is upon the mighty waters.
- 4 The voice of God is a powerful voice; * the voice of God is a voice of splendor.
- 5 The voice of God breaks the cedar trees; * God breaks the cedars of Lebanon;
- 6 God makes Lebanon skip like a calf * and Mount Hermon like a young wild ox.
- 7 The voice of God splits the flames of fire; the voice of God shakes the wilderness; * God shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.
- 8 The voice of God makes the oak trees writhe * and strips the forests bare.
- 9 And in the temple of the Holy One, * all are crying, "Glory!"
- 10 God sits enthroned above the flood, * enthroned as Sovereign for evermore.
- 11 God shall give strength to the people; * God shall give the people the blessing of peace.

Sixth Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 30

- I will exalt you, O God, because you have lifted me up * and have not let my enemies triumph over me.
- 2 O my God, I cried out to you, * and you restored me to health.
- 3 You brought me up, O God, from the dead; * you restored my life as I was going down to the grave.
- 4 Sing to God, you servants of God, * and give thanks for the remembrance of God's holiness.
- 5 For divine wrath endures but the twinkling of an eye, * divine favor for a lifetime.
- 6 Weeping may spend the night, * but joy comes in the morning.
- 7 While I felt secure, I said, "I shall never be disturbed. *

You, O God, with your favor, made me as strong as the mountains."

- 8 Then you hid your face, *
 - and I was filled with fear.
- 9 I cried to you, O God; * I pleaded with you, saying,
- 10 "What profit is there in my blood, if I go down to the Pit? * Will the dust praise you or declare your faithfulness?
- 11 Hear, O God, and have mercy upon me; * O God, be my helper."
- 12 You have turned my wailing into dancing; * you have put off my sack-cloth and clothed me with joy.
- 13 Therefore my heart sings to you without ceasing; * O God, my God, I will give you thanks for ever.

- In you, O God, have I taken refuge; 1 let me never be put to shame; * deliver me in your righteousness. $\mathbf{2}$ Incline your ear to me; * make haste to deliver me. Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe, 3 for you are my crag and my stronghold; * for the sake of your Name, lead me and guide me. Take me out of the net that they have secretly set for me, * 4 for you are my tower of strength. 5Into your hands I commend my spirit, * for you have redeemed me, O God of truth. 6 I hate those who cling to worthless idols, * and I put my trust in God. $\overline{7}$ I will rejoice and be glad because of your mercy, * for you have seen my affliction; you know my distress. You have not shut me up in the power of the enemy; * 8 you have set my feet in an open place. Have mercy on me, O God, for I am in trouble; * 9 my eye is consumed with sorrow, and also my throat and my belly. 10 For my life is wasted with grief and my years with sighing; * my strength fails me because of affliction, and my bones are consumed. 11 I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbors, a dismay to those of my acquaintance; * when they see me in the street they avoid me. 12 I am forgotten like the dead, out of mind; * I am as useless as a broken pot. 13 For I have heard the whispering of the crowd; fear is all around; * they put their heads together against me; they plot to take my life. 14 But as for me, I have trusted in you, O God. * I have said, "You are my God. 15 My times are in your hand; * rescue me from the hand of my enemies, and from those who persecute me. 16 Make your face to shine upon your servant, * and in your loving-kindness, save me." 17 O God, let me not be ashamed for having called upon you; * rather, let the wicked be put to shame; let them be silent in the grave. 18 Let the lying lips be silenced which speak against the righteous, * haughtily, disdainfully, and with contempt. 19 How great is your goodness, O God,
- which you have laid up for those who fear you; * which you have done in the sight of all for those who put their trust in you.

- 20 You hide them in the covert of your presence from those who slander them; * you keep them in your shelter from the strife of tongues.
- 21 Blessed be God! * For you have shown me the wonders of your love in a city under siege.
- 22 Yet I said in my alarm,
 - "I have been cut off from the sight of your eyes." * Nevertheless, you heard the sound of my entreaty when I cried out to you.
- 23 Love God, all you who worship God; *God protects the faithful,but repays to the full those who act haughtily.
- 24 Be strong and let your heart take courage, * all you who wait for God.

Sixth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 32

- 1 Happy are they whose transgressions are forgiven * and whose sin is put away!
- 2 Happy are they to whom God imputes no guilt * and in whose spirit there is no guile!
- 3 While I held my tongue, my bones withered away, * because of my groaning all day long.
- 4 For your hand was heavy upon me day and night; * my moisture was dried up as in the heat of summer.
- 5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you * and did not conceal my guilt.
- 6 I said, "I will confess my transgressions to God;" * then you forgave me the guilt of my sin.
- 7 Therefore all the faithful will make their prayers to you in time of trouble; * when the great waters overflow, they shall not reach them.
- 8 You are my hiding-place; you preserve me from trouble; * you surround me with shouts of deliverance.
- 9 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way that you should go; * I will guide you with my eye.
- 10 Do not be like horse or mule, which have no understanding, * who must be fitted with bit and bridle, or else they will not stay near you."
- 11 Great are the tribulations of the wicked, * but mercy embraces those who trust in the Most High.
- 12 Be glad, you righteous, and rejoice in God; * shout for joy, all who are true of heart.

- Rejoice in God, you righteous; *

 it is good for the just to sing praises.
- 2 Praise God with the harp; * play upon the psaltery and lyre.
- 3 Sing for God a new song; * sound a fanfare with all your skill upon the trumpet.
- 4 For your word, O God, is right, * and all your works are sure.

You love righteousness and justice; * 5your loving-kindness fills the whole earth. 6 By your word, O God, were the heavens made, * by the breath of your mouth all the heavenly hosts. You gather up the waters of the ocean as in a water-skin * $\overline{7}$ and store up the depths of the sea. Let all the earth fear you; * 8 let all who dwell in the world stand in awe of you. 9 For you spoke, and it came to pass; * you commanded, and it stood fast. 10 You bring the will of the nations to naught * and thwart the designs of the peoples. 11 But your will stands fast for ever, * and the designs of your heart from age to age. 12 Happy is the nation that worships you, O Most High; * happy the people you have chosen to be your own! 13 You look down from heaven * and behold all the people in the world. 14 From where you sit enthroned you turn your gaze * on all who dwell on the earth. 15 You fashion all the hearts of them * and understand all their works. 16 There is no ruler that can be saved by a mighty army; * the strong are not delivered by their great strength. 17 The horse is a vain hope for deliverance; * for all its strength it cannot save. 18 But your eye, O God, is upon those who fear you, * on those who wait upon your love, 19 To pluck their lives from death, * and to feed them in time of famine. 20 Our soul waits for you; * you are our help and our shield. 21 Indeed, our heart rejoices in you, * for in your holy Name we put our trust. 22 Let your loving-kindness, O God, be upon us, * as we have put our trust in you. Psalm 34 I will bless God at all times, * 1 and praise shall ever be in my mouth. $\mathbf{2}$ I will glory in the Most High; * let the humble hear and rejoice. 3Proclaim with me the greatness of God; * let us exalt God's Name together. I sought, and God answered me * 4

and delivered me out of all my terror. 5 Look upon the Most High and be radian

5 Look upon the Most High and be radiant, * and let not your faces be ashamed.

6 I called in my affliction, and God heard me * and saved me from all my troubles.

7 The angels encompass those who fear God, * and God will deliver them.

8 Taste and see that God is good; * happy are they who trust in the Most High!

9 Fear the Most High, you that are God's saints, * for those who fear God lack nothing.

10 The young lions lack and suffer hunger, * but those who seek God lack nothing that is good.

- 11 Come, children, and listen to me; * I will teach you the fear of God.
- 12 Who among you loves life * and desires long life to enjoy prosperity?
- 13 Keep your tongue from evil-speaking * and your lips from lying words.
- 14 Turn from evil and do good; *
 seek peace and pursue it.
- 15 The eyes of God are upon the righteous, * and the ears of God are open to their cry.
- 16 The face of God is against those who do evil, * to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17 The righteous cry, and God hears them * and delivers them from all their troubles.
- 18 God is near to the brokenhearted * and will save those whose spirits are crushed.
- 19 Many are the troubles of the righteous, * but God will deliver them out of them all.
- 20 God will keep safe all their bones; * not one of them shall be broken.
- 21 Evil shall slay the wicked, * and those who hate the righteous will be punished.
- 22 O God, you will ransom the life of your servants, * and none will be punished who trust in you.

Seventh Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 Fight those who fight me, O God; * attack those who are attacking me.
- 2 Take up shield and armor * and rise up to help me.
- 3 Draw the sword and bar the way against those who pursue me; * say to my soul, "I am your salvation."
- 4 Let those who seek after my life be shamed and humbled; * let those who plot my ruin fall back and be dismayed.
- 5 Let them be like chaff before the wind, * and let the angel of God drive them away.
- 6 Let their way be dark and slippery, * and let the angel of God pursue them.
- 7 For they have secretly spread a net for me without a cause; * without a cause they have dug a pit to take me alive.
- 8 Let ruin come upon them unawares; * let them be caught in the net they hid; let them fall into the pit they dug.
- 9 Then I will be joyful in you, O Most High; * I will glory in your victory.

10 My very bones will say, "O God, who is like you? * You deliver the poor from those who are too strong for them, the poor and needy from those who rob them." 11 Malicious witnesses rise up against me; * they charge me with matters I know nothing about. 12 They pay me evil in exchange for good; * my soul is full of despair. 13 But when they were sick I dressed in sack-cloth * and humbled myself by fasting; 14 I prayed with my whole heart, as one would for a friend or a neighbor; * I behaved like those who mourn for their mothers, bowed down and grieving. 15 But when I stumbled, they were glad and gathered together; they gathered against me; * strangers whom I did not know tore me to pieces and would not stop. 16 They put me to the test and mocked me; * they gnashed at me with their teeth. 17 O God, how long will you look on? * Rescue me from the roaring beasts, and my life from the young lions. 18 I will give you thanks in the great congregation; * I will praise you in the mighty throng. 19 Do not let my treacherous foes rejoice over me, * nor let those who hate me without a cause wink at each other. 20 For they do not plan for peace, * but invent deceitful schemes against the quiet in the land. 21 They opened their mouths at me and said, * "Aha! we saw it with our own eyes." 22 You saw it, O God; do not be silent; * O God, be not far from me. 23 Awake, arise, to my cause; * to my defense, my God and my Savior! 24 Give me justice, O my God, according to your righteousness; * do not let them triumph over me. 25 Do not let them say in their hearts, "Aha! just what we want!" * Do not let them say, "We have swallowed you up." 26 Let all who rejoice at my ruin be ashamed and disgraced; * let those who boast against me be clothed with dismay and shame. 27 Let those who favor my cause sing out with joy and be glad; * let them say always, "Great are you, O God, you desire the prosperity of your servant." 28 And my tongue shall be talking of your righteousness * and of your praise all the day long.

- 1 There is a voice of rebellion deep in the heart of the wicked; * there is no fear of God before their eyes.
- 2 They flatter themselves in their own eyes * that their hateful sin will not be found out.

- 3 The words of their mouths are wicked and deceitful; * they have left off acting wisely and doing good.
- 4 They think up wickedness upon their beds and have set themselves in no good way; * they do not abhor that which is evil.
- 5 Your love, O God, reaches to the heavens, * and your faithfulness to the clouds.
- 6 Your righteousness is like the strong mountains, your justice like the great deep; * you save all your creatures, O God.
- 7 How priceless is your love, O God; * your people take refuge under the shadow of your wings.
- 8 They feast upon the abundance of your house; * you give them drink from the river of your delights.
- 9 For with you is the well of life, * and in your light we see light.
- 10 Continue your loving-kindness to those who know you, * and your favor to those who are true of heart.
- 11 Let not the foot of the proud come near me, * nor the hand of the wicked push me aside.
- 12 See how they are fallen, those who work wickedness; * they are cast down and shall not be able to rise.

Seventh Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 Do not fret yourself because of evildoers; * do not be jealous of those who do wrong.
- 2 For they shall soon wither like the grass, * and like the green grass fade away.
- 3 Put your trust in God and do good; * dwell in the land and feed on its riches.
- 4 Take delight in God, * who shall give you your heart's desire.
- 5 Commit your way to God and put your trust in God, * who will bring it to pass.
- 6 God will make your righteousness as clear as the light * and your just dealing as the noonday.
- 7 Be still before God; * for God wait patiently.
- 8 Do not fret yourself over the one who prospers, * the one who succeeds in evil schemes.
- 9 Refrain from anger, leave rage alone; * do not fret yourself, it leads only to evil.
- 10 For evildoers shall be cut off, *
- but those who wait upon God shall possess the land. 11 In a little while the wicked shall be no more; *
- you shall search out their place, but they will not be there.
- 12 But the lowly shall possess the land; * they will delight in abundance of peace.
- 13 The wicked plot against the righteous * and gnash at them with their teeth.
- 14 God laughs at the wicked, * seeing that their day will come.

15 The wicked draw their sword and bend their bow to strike down the poor and needy, * to slaughter those who are upright in their ways.

16 Their sword shall go through their own heart, * and their bow shall be broken.

17 The little that the righteous has * is better than great riches of the wicked.

18 For the power of the wicked shall be broken, * but God upholds the righteous.

19 God cares for the lives of the faithful, * and their inheritance shall last for ever.

20 They shall not be ashamed in bad times, * and in days of famine they shall have enough.

21 As for the wicked, they shall perish, * and the enemies of God, like the glory of the meadows, shall vanish; they shall vanish like smoke.

22 The wicked borrow and do not repay, * but the righteous are generous in giving.

23 Those who are blest by God shall possess the land, * but those who are cursed shall be destroyed.

24 Our steps are directed by God, * who strengthens those whose ways are upright.

25 If they stumble, they shall not fall headlong, * for God holds them by the hand.

26 I have been young and now I am old, * but never have I seen the righteous forsaken, or their children begging bread.

27 The righteous are always generous in their lending, * and their children shall be a blessing.

28 Turn from evil and do good, * and dwell in the land for ever.

29 For God loves justice * and does not forsake the faithful ones.

30 They shall be kept safe for ever, * but the offspring of the wicked shall be destroyed.

31 The righteous shall possess the land * and dwell in it for ever.

32 The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, * and their tongue speaks what is right.

33 The law of their God is in their heart, * and their footsteps shall not falter.

34 The wicked spy on the righteous * and seek occasion to kill them.

35 But God will not abandon them to their hand, * nor let them be found guilty when brought to trial.

36 Wait upon God and keep God's way; * you will be raised up to possess the land, and when the wicked are cut off, you will see it.

37 I have seen the wicked in their arrogance, * flourishing like a tree in full leaf.

38 I went by, and behold, they were not there; * I searched for them, but they could not be found.

39 Mark those who are honest;

observe the upright; *

for there is a future for the peaceable.

- 40 Transgressors shall be destroyed, one and all; * the future of the wicked is cut off.
- 41 But the deliverance of the righteous comes from God * who is their stronghold in time of trouble.
- 42 God will help them and rescue them; * the Holy One will rescue them from the wicked and deliver them, because they seek refuge in God.

Eighth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 O God, do not rebuke me in your anger; * do not punish me in your wrath.
- 2 For your arrows have already pierced me, * and your hand presses hard upon me.
- There is no health in my flesh because of your indignation; *
 there is no soundness in my body because of my sin.
- 4 For my iniquities overwhelm me; * like a heavy burden they are too much for me to bear.
- 5 My wounds stink and fester * by reason of my foolishness.
- 6 I am utterly bowed down and prostrate; * I go about in mourning all the day long.
- 7 My loins are filled with searing pain; * there is no health in my body.
- 8 I am utterly numb and crushed; * I wail, because of the groaning of my heart.
- 9 O God, you know all my desires, * and my sighing is not hidden from you.
- 10 My heart is pounding, my strength has failed me, * and the brightness of my eyes is gone from me.
- 11 My friends and companions draw back from my affliction; * my neighbors stand afar off.
- 12 Those who seek after my life lay snares for me; * those who strive to hurt me speak of my ruin and plot treachery all the day long.
- 13 But I am like the deaf who do not hear, * like those who are mute and do not open their mouth.
- 14 I have become like one who does not hear * and from whose mouth comes no defense.
- 15 For in you, O God, have I fixed my hope; * you will answer me, O my God.
- 16 For I said, "Do not let them rejoice at my expense, * those who gloat over me when my foot slips."
- 17 Truly, I am on the verge of falling, * and my pain is always with me.
- 18 I will confess my iniquity * and be sorry for my sin.
- 19 Those who are my enemies without cause are mighty, * and many in number are those who wrongfully hate me.

- 20 Those who repay evil for good slander me, * because I follow the course that is right.
- 21 O Holy One, do not forsake me; * be not far from me, O my God.
- 22 Make haste to help me, * O God of my salvation.

8

- 1 I said, "I will keep watch upon my ways, * so that I do not offend with my tongue.
- 2 I will put a muzzle on my mouth * while the wicked are in my presence."
- 3 So I held my tongue and said nothing; * I refrained from rash words, but my pain became unbearable.
- My heart was hot within me;
 while I pondered, the fire burst into flame; *
 I spoke out with my tongue:
- 5 O God, let me know my end and the number of my days, * so that I may know how short my life is.
- 6 You have given me a mere handful of days, and my lifetime is as nothing in your sight; * truly, even those who stand erect are but a puff of wind.
- We walk about like a shadow, and in vain we are in turmoil; * we heap up riches and cannot tell who will gather them.
 - And now, what is my hope? * O God, my hope is in you.
- 9 Deliver me from all my transgressions, * and do not make me the taunt of the fool.
- 10 I fell silent and did not open my mouth, * for surely it was you that did it.
- 11 Take your affliction from me; *I am worn down by the blows of your hand.
- 12 With rebukes for sin you punish us; like a moth you eat away all that is dear to us; * truly, everyone is but a puff of wind.
- 13 Hear my prayer, O God, and give ear to my cry; * hold not your peace at my tears,
- 14 For I am but a sojourner with you, * a wayfarer, as all my forebears were.
- 15 Turn your gaze from me, that I may be glad again, * before I go my way and am no more.

- 1 I waited patiently for you, O God; * you stooped to me and heard my cry.
- 2 You lifted me out of the desolate pit, out of the mire and clay; * you set my feet upon a high cliff and made my footing sure.
- 3 You put a new song in my mouth,

a song of praise to our God; * many shall see, and stand in awe, and put their trust in you.

- 4 Happy are they who trust in you; * they do not resort to evil spirits or turn to false gods.
- 5 Great things are they that you have done, O God, how great your wonders and your plans for us; * there is none who can be compared with you.
- 6 Oh, that I could make them known and tell them, * but they are more than I can count.
- 7 In sacrifice and offering you take no pleasure * (you have given me ears to hear you);
- 8 Burnt-offering and sin-offering you have not required, * and so I said, "Behold, I come.
- 9 In the roll of the book it is written concerning me: *
 'I love to do your will, O my God; your law is deep in my heart.' "
- 10 I proclaimed righteousness in the great congregation; * behold, I did not restrain my lips, and that, O God, you know.
- 11 Your righteousness have I not hidden in my heart;I have spoken of your faithfulness and your deliverance; *I have not concealed your love and faithfulness from the great congregation.
- 12 You are the Holy One;do not withhold your compassion from me; *let your love and your faithfulness keep me safe for ever.
- 13 For innumerable troubles have crowded upon me; my sins have overtaken me, and I cannot see; * they are more in number than the hairs of my head, and my heart fails me.
- 14 Be pleased, O God, to deliver me; * O God, make haste to help me.
- 15 Let them be ashamed and altogether dismayed who seek after my life to destroy it; * let them draw back and be disgraced who take pleasure in my misfortune.
- 16 Let those who say to me "Aha!" and gloat over me be confounded, * because they are ashamed.
- 17 Let all who seek you rejoice in you and be glad; * let those who love your salvation continually say, "Great is the Holy One!"
- 18 Though I am poor and afflicted, * you will have regard for me.
- 19 You are my helper and my deliverer; * do not tarry, O my God.

Eighth Day: Evening Prayer

- Happy are they who consider the poor and needy! * God will deliver them in the time of trouble.
- 2 God preserves them and keeps them alive, so that they may be happy in the land, * and does not hand them over to the will of their enemies.

- 3 God sustains them on their sickbed * and ministers to them in their illness.
- 4 I said, "O God, be merciful to me; * heal me, for I have sinned against you."
- 5 My enemies are saying wicked things about me, * wondering when I will die and my name perish.
- 6 Even if they come to see me, they speak empty words; * their heart collects false rumors; they go outside and spread them.
- 7 All my enemies whisper together about me * and devise evil against me.
- 8 They say a deadly thing has fastened on me, * that I have taken to my bed and will never get up again.
- 9 Even my best friend, whom I trusted, who broke bread with me, * has spurned me and turned against me.
- 10 But you, O God, be merciful to me and raise me up, * and I shall repay them.
- 11 By this I know you are pleased with me, * that my enemy does not triumph over me.
- 12 In my integrity you hold me fast, * and shall set me before your face for ever.
- 13 Blessed be the God of Israel, * from age to age. Amen. Amen.

- 1 As the deer longs for the water-brooks, * so longs my soul for you, O God.
- 2 My soul is athirst for God, athirst for the living God; * when shall I come to appear before the presence of God?
- 3 My tears have been my food day and night, * while all day long they say to me, "Where now is your God?"
- 4 I pour out my soul when I think on these things: * how I went with the multitude and led them into the house of God,
- 5 With the voice of praise and thanksgiving, * among those who keep holy-day.
- 6 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, * and why are you so disquieted within me?
- 7 Put your trust in God, * for I will yet give thanks to the Holy One, who is the help of my countenance, and my God.
- 8 My soul is heavy within me; * therefore I will remember you from the land of Jordan, and from the peak of Mizar among the heights of Hermon.
- 9 One deep calls to another in the noise of your cataracts; * all your rapids and floods have gone over me.
- 10 You grant me your loving-kindness in the daytime; * in the night season your song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life.
- 11 I will say to the God of my strength,
 "Why have you forgotten me, * and why do I go so heavily while the enemy oppresses me?"

- 12 While my bones are being broken, * my enemies mock me to my face;
- 13 All day long they mock me * and say to me, "Where now is your God?"
- 14 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, * and why are you so disquieted within me?
- 15 Put your trust in God, * for I will yet give thanks to the Holy One, who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

- Give judgment for me, O God, and defend my cause against an ungodly people; * deliver me from the deceitful and the wicked.
- 2 For you are the God of my strength; why have you put me from you, * and why do I go so heavily while the enemy oppresses me?
- 3 Send out your light and your truth, that they may lead me, * and bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling;
- That I may go to the altar of God,
 to the God of my joy and gladness, *
 and on the harp I will give thanks to you, O God, my God.
- 5 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, * and why are you so disquieted within me?
- 6 Put your trust in God, * for I will yet give thanks to the Holy One, who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Ninth Day: Morning Prayer

- We have heard with our ears, O God, our forebears have told us, * the deeds you did in their days, in the days of old.
- 2 How with your hand you drove the peoples out and planted our forebears in the land; * how you destroyed nations and made your people flourish.
- 3 For they did not take the land by their sword, nor did their arm win the victory for them; * but your right hand, your arm, and the light of your countenance, because you favored them.
- 4 You are my Ruler and my God; * you command victories for Jacob.
- 5 Through you we pushed back our adversaries; * through your Name we trampled on those who rose up against us.
- 6 For I do not rely on my bow, * and my sword does not give me the victory.
- 7 Surely, you gave us victory over our adversaries * and put those who hate us to shame.
- 8 Every day we gloried in God, * and we will praise your Name for ever.

- 9 Nevertheless, you have rejected and humbled us * and do not go forth with our armies.
- 10 You have made us fall back before our adversary, * and our enemies have plundered us.
- 11 You have made us like sheep to be eaten * and have scattered us among the nations.
- 12 You are selling your people for a trifle * and are making no profit on the sale of them.
- 13 You have made us the scorn of our neighbors, * a mockery and derision to those around us.
- 14 You have made us a byword among the nations, * a laughing-stock among the peoples.
- 15 My humiliation is daily before me, * and shame has covered my face,
- 16 Because of the taunts of the mockers and blasphemers, * because of the enemy and avenger.
- 17 All this has come upon us; * yet we have not forgotten you, nor have we betrayed your covenant.
- 18 Our heart never turned back, * nor did our footsteps stray from your path,
- 19 Though you thrust us down into a place of misery, * and covered us over with deep darkness.
- 20 If we have forgotten the Name of our God, * or stretched out our hands to some strange god,
- 21 Will God not find it out, * for God knows the secrets of the heart.
- 22 Indeed, for your sake we are killed all the day long; * we are accounted as sheep for the slaughter.
- 23 Awake, O God! Why are you sleeping? * Arise; do not reject us for ever.
- 24 Why have you hidden your face * and forgotten our affliction and oppression?
- 25 We sink down into the dust; * our body cleaves to the ground.
- 26 Rise up, and help us, * and save us, for the sake of your steadfast love.

- My heart is stirring with a noble song; let me recite what I have fashioned for the king; * my tongue shall be the pen of a skilled writer.
- 2 You are the fairest of men; * grace flows from your lips, because God has blest you for ever.
- 3 Strap your sword upon your thigh, O mighty warrior, * in your pride and in your majesty.
- 4 Ride out and conquer in the cause of truth * and for the sake of justice.
- 5 Your right hand will show you marvelous things; * your arrows are very sharp, O mighty warrior.
- 6 The peoples are falling at your feet, * and the king's enemies are losing heart.

- 7 Your throne, O God, endures for ever and ever; * a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of your realm; you love righteousness and hate iniquity.
- 8 Therefore God, your God, has anointed you * with the oil of gladness above your companions.
- 9 All your garments are fragrant with myrrh, aloes and cassia, * and the music of strings from ivory palaces makes you glad.
- 10 The royal daughters stand among the ladies of the court; * on your right hand is the queen, adorned with the gold of Ophir.
- 11 "Hear, O daughter, consider and listen closely; * forget your people and your parents' house.
- 12 The king will have pleasure in your beauty; * you are committed to him, therefore do him honor.
- 13 The people of Tyre are here with a gift; * the rich among the people seek your favor."
- 14 All glorious is the princess as she enters; * her gown is cloth-of-gold.
- 15 In embroidered apparel she is brought to the king; * after her the bridesmaids follow in procession.
- 16 With joy and gladness they are brought * and enter into the palace of the king.
- 17 "In place of fathers, O king, you shall have sons; * you shall make them princes over all the earth.
- 18 I will make your name to be remembered from one generation to another, * therefore nations will praise you for ever and ever."

- 1 God is our refuge and strength, * a very present help in trouble.
- 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, * and though the mountains be toppled into the depths of the sea;
- 3 Though its waters rage and foam, * and though the mountains tremble at its tumult.
- 4 The God of hosts is with us; * the God of Jacob is our stronghold.
- 5 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, * the holy habitation of the Most High.
- 6 God is in the midst of the city;it shall not be overthrown; *God shall help it at the break of day.
- 7 The nations make much ado, and the realms are shaken; * God has spoken, and the earth shall melt away.
- 8 The God of hosts is with us; * the God of Jacob is our stronghold.
- 9 Come now and look upon the works of the Most High, * who does awesome things on earth.
- 10 It is God who makes war to cease in all the world, * who breaks the bow, and shatters the spear, and burns the shields with fire.

- 11 "Be still, then, and know that I am God; * I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth."
- 12 The God of hosts is with us; * the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

Ninth Day: Evening Prayer Psalm 47

1

- Clap your hands, all you peoples; * shout to God with a cry of joy.
- $\mathbf{2}$ For God Most High is to be feared; * God is the great Sovereign over all the earth. God subdues the peoples under us * 3and the nations under our feet.
- God chooses our inheritance for us, * 4the pride of Jacob whom God loves.
- God has gone up with a shout, * 5the Most High with the sound of the ram's-horn.
- Sing praises to God, sing praises; * 6 sing praises to our Sovereign, sing praises.
- 7 For God is Sovereign over all the earth; * sing praises with all your skill.
- God reigns over the nations; * 8 God sits upon the holy throne.
- 9 The nobles of the peoples have gathered together * with the people of the God of Abraham.
- 10 The rulers of the earth belong to God, * who is highly exalted.

- God is great and highly to be praised; * 1 in the city of our God is the holy hill.
- Beautiful and lofty, the joy of all the earth, is the hill of Zion, * \mathcal{Q} the very center of the world and the city of the great Sovereign.
- God is in its citadels; * \mathcal{S} God is known to be its sure refuge.
- Behold, the monarchs of the earth assembled * 4and marched forward together.
- They looked and were astounded; * 5they retreated and fled in terror.
- Trembling seized them there; * 6 they writhed like a woman in childbirth, like ships of the sea when the east wind shatters them.
- As we have heard, so have we seen, 7 in the city of the God of hosts, in the city of our God; * God has established it for ever.
- We have waited in silence on your loving-kindness, O God, * 8 in the midst of your temple.
- Your praise, like your Name, O God, reaches to the world's end; * 9 your right hand is full of justice.
- 10 Let Mount Zion be glad and the cities of Judah rejoice, * because of your judgments.

11 Make the circuit of Zion; walk round about it; * count the number of its towers.

- 12 Consider well its bulwarks; examine its strongholds, * that you may tell those who come after:
- 13 This God is our God for ever and ever * and shall be our guide for evermore.

- Hear this, all you peoples; hearken, all you who dwell in the world, * you of high degree and low, rich and poor together.
- 2 My mouth shall speak of wisdom, * and my heart shall meditate on understanding.
- 3 I will incline my ear to a proverb * and set forth my riddle upon the harp.
- 4 Why should I be afraid in evil days, * when the wickedness of those at my heels surrounds me,
- 5 The wickedness of those who put their trust in their goods, * and boast of their great riches?
- 6 We can never ransom ourselves, * or deliver to God the price of our life;
- 7 For the ransom of our life is so great, * that we should never have enough to pay it,
- 8 In order to live for ever and ever, * and never see the grave.
- 9 For we see that the wise die also;
 like the dull and stupid they perish *
 and leave their wealth to those who come after them.
- 10 Their graves shall be their homes for ever, their dwelling places from generation to generation, * though they call the lands after their own names.
- 11 Even though honored, they cannot live for ever; * they are like the beasts that perish.
- 12 Such is the way of those who foolishly trust in themselves, * and the end of those who delight in their own words.
- 13 Like a flock of sheep they are destined to die; Death is their shepherd; * they go down straightway to the grave.
- 14 Their form shall waste away, * and the land of the dead shall be their home.
- 15 But God will ransom my life * and will snatch me from the grasp of death.
- 16 Do not be envious when some become rich * or when the grandeur of their house increases,
- 17 For they will carry nothing away at their death, * nor will their grandeur follow them.
- 18 Though they thought highly of themselves while they lived, * and were praised for their success,
- 19 They shall join the company of their forebears, * who will never see the light again.

20 Those who are honored, but have no understanding, * are like the beasts that perish.

Tenth Day: Morning Prayer

- The God of gods has spoken; * God has called the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.
- 2 Out of Zion, perfect in its beauty, * God is revealed in glory.
- 3 O God, you will come and will not keep silence; * before you there is a consuming flame, and round about you a raging storm.
- 4 You call the heavens and the earth from above * to witness the judgment of your people.
- 5 "Gather before me my loyal followers, * those who have made a covenant with me and sealed it with sacrifice."
- 6 Let the heavens declare the rightness of your cause, * for you alone are judge.
- 7 "Hear, O my people, and I will speak:O Israel, I will bear witness against you, * for I am God, your God.
- 8 I do not accuse you because of your sacrifices; * your offerings are always before me.
- 9 I will take no bull-calf from your stalls, * nor he-goats out of your pens;
- 10 For all the beasts of the forest are mine, * the herds in their thousands upon the hills
- 11 I know every bird in the sky, * and the creatures of the fields are in my sight.
- 12 If I were hungry, I would not tell you, * for the whole world is mine and all that is in it.
- 13 Do you think I eat the flesh of bulls, * or drink the blood of goats?
- 14 Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving * and make good your vows to the Most High.
- 15 Call upon me in the day of trouble; * I will deliver you, and you shall honor me."
- 16 But to the wicked God says: *"Why do you recite my statutes and take my covenant upon your lips,
- 17 Since you refuse discipline *and toss my words behind your back?
- 18 When you see thieves, you make them your friends, * and you cast in your lot with adulterers.
- 19 You have loosed your lips for evil * and harnessed your tongue to a lie.
- 20 You are always speaking evil of your family * and slandering your own mother's child.
- 21 These things you have done, and I kept still, * and you thought that I am like you."
- 22 "I have made my accusation; * I have put my case in order before your eyes.

23 Consider this well, you who forget God, *

lest I rend you and there be none to deliver you.

24 Whoever offers me the sacrifice of thanksgiving honors me; * but to those who keep in my way will I show the salvation of God."

Psalm 51

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your loving-kindness; * in your great compassion blot out my offenses.
- 2 Wash me through and through from my wickedness * and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I know my transgressions, * and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned * and done what is evil in your sight.
- 5 And so you are justified when you speak * and upright in your judgment.
- 6 Indeed, I have been wicked from my birth, * a sinner from my mother's womb.
- 7 For behold, you look for truth deep within me, * and will make me understand wisdom secretly.
- 8 Purge me from my sin, and I shall be pure; * wash me, and I shall be clean indeed.
- 9 Make me hear of joy and gladness, * that the body you have broken may rejoice.
- 10 Hide your face from my sins, * and blot out all my iniquities.
- 11 Create in me a clean heart, O God, * and renew a right spirit within me.
- 12 Cast me not away from your presence, * and take not your holy Spirit from me.
- 13 Give me the joy of your saving help again, * and sustain me with your bountiful Spirit.
- 14 I shall teach your ways to the wicked, * and sinners shall return to you.
- 15 Deliver me from death, O God, * and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness, O God of my salvation.
- 16 Open my lips, O God, * and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- 17 Had you desired it, I would have offered sacrifice, * but you take no delight in burnt-offerings.
- 18 The sacrifice of God is a troubled spirit; * a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- 19 Be favorable and gracious to Zion, * and rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.
- 20 Then you will be pleased with the appointed sacrifices, with burnt-offerings and oblations; * then shall they offer young bullocks upon your altar.

- 1 You tyrant, why do you boast of wickedness * against the godly all day long?
- 2 You plot ruin;

your tongue is like a sharpened razor, * O worker of deception.

- 3 You love evil more than good * and lying more than speaking the truth.
- 4 You love all words that hurt, * O you deceitful tongue.
- 5 Oh, that God would demolish you utterly, * topple you, and snatch you from your dwelling, and root you out of the land of the living!
- 6 The righteous shall see and tremble, * and they shall laugh at the tyrant, saying,
- 7 "This is the one who did not take God for a refuge, * but trusted in great wealth and relied upon wickedness."
- 8 But I am like a green olive tree in the house of God; * I trust in the mercy of God for ever and ever.
- 9 I will give you thanks for what you have done * and declare the goodness of your Name in the presence of the godly.

Tenth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 53

- The foolish say in their hearts, "There is no God." * All are corrupt and commit abominable acts; there is none who does any good.
- 2 God looks down from heaven upon us all, * to see if there is any who is wise, if there is one who seeks after God.
- Every one has proved faithless;
 all alike have turned bad; *
 there is none who does good; no, not one.
- 4 Have they no knowledge, those evildoers * who eat up my people like bread and do not call upon God?
- 5 See how greatly they tremble, such trembling as never was, *
 for God has scattered the bones of the enemy; they are put to shame, because God has rejected them.
- 6 Oh, that Israel's deliverance would come out of Zion! * When God restores the fortunes of the people, Jacob will rejoice and Israel be glad.

- 1 Save me, O God, by your Name; * in your might, defend my cause.
- 2 Hear my prayer, O God; * give ear to the words of my mouth.
- 3 For the arrogant have risen up against me, and the ruthless have sought my life, * those who have no regard for God.
- 4 Behold, God is my helper; * it is God who sustains my life.
- 5 Render evil to those who spy on me; * in your faithfulness, destroy them.

- 6 I will offer you a freewill sacrifice * and praise your Name, O God, for it is good.
- 7 For you have rescued me from every trouble, * and my eye has seen the ruin of my foes.

- Hear my prayer, O God; * do not hide yourself from my petition.
- 2 Listen to me and answer me; *I have no peace, because of my cares.
- 3 I am shaken by the noise of the enemy * and by the pressure of the wicked;
- 4 For they have cast an evil spell upon me * and are set against me in fury.
- 5 My heart quakes within me, * and the terrors of death have fallen upon me.
- 6 Fear and trembling have come over me, * and horror overwhelms me.
- 7 And I said, "Oh, that I had wings like a dove! * I would fly away and be at rest.
- 8 I would flee to a far-off place * and make my lodging in the wilderness.
- 9 I would hasten to escape * from the stormy wind and tempest."
- 10 Swallow them up, O God; confound their speech, * for I have seen violence and strife in the city.
- 11 Day and night the sentries make their rounds upon its walls, * but trouble and misery are in the midst of it.
- 12 There is corruption at its heart; *
 its streets are never free of oppression and deceit.
- 13 For had it been an adversary who taunted me, then I could have borne it; * or had it been enemies who vaunted themselves against me, then I could have hidden from them.
- 14 But it was you, someone after my own heart, * my companion, my own familiar friend.
- 15 We took sweet counsel together, * and walked with the throng in the house of God.
- 16 Let death come upon them suddenly;let them go down alive into the grave, *for wickedness is in their dwellings, in their very midst.
- 17 But I will call upon God, * and God will deliver me.
- 18 In the evening, in the morning, and at noonday, I will complain and lament, * and God will hear my voice.
- 19 God will bring me safely back from the battle waged against me, * for there are many who fight me.
- 20 God, who is enthroned of old, will hear me and bring them down; * they never change; they do not fear God.
- 21 My companions have stretched forth their hands against their comrade; * they have broken their covenant.

22 Their speech is softer than butter, * but war is in their hearts.

- 23 Their words are smoother than oil, * but they are drawn swords.
- 24 Cast your burden upon God, who will sustain you; * God will never let the righteous stumble.
- 25 For you will bring the bloodthirsty and deceitful * down to the pit of destruction, O God.
- 26 They shall not live out half their days, * but I will put my trust in you.

Eleventh Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 56

 Have mercy on me, O God, for my enemies are hounding me; * all day long they assault and oppress me.

- 2 They hound me all the day long; * truly there are many who fight against me, O Most High.
- 3 Whenever I am afraid, * I will put my trust in you.
- 4 In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust and will not be afraid, * for what can flesh do to me?
- 5 All day long they damage my cause; * their only thought is to do me evil.
- 6 They band together; they lie in wait; * they spy upon my footsteps, because they seek my life.
- 7 Shall they escape despite their wickedness? * O God, in your anger, cast down the peoples.
- 8 You have noted my lamentation; put my tears into your bottle; * are they not recorded in your book?
- 9 Whenever I call upon you, my enemies will be put to flight; * this I know, for God is on my side.
- 10 In God, whose word I praise, in God I trust and will not be afraid, * for what can mortals do to me?
- 11 I am bound by the vow I made to you, O God; * I will present to you thank-offerings;
- 12 For you have rescued my soul from death and my feet from stumbling, * that I may walk before you in the light of the living.

- Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful, for I have taken refuge in you; * in the shadow of your wings will I take refuge until this time of trouble has gone by.
- 2 I will call upon you, O Most High God, * you who maintain my cause.
- 3 You will send from heaven and save me;

you will confound those who trample upon me; * you will send forth your love and your faithfulness.

- 4 I lie in the midst of lions that devour the people; * their teeth are spears and arrows, their tongue a sharp sword.
- 5 They have laid a net for my feet,
 - and I am bowed low; * they have dug a pit before me, but have fallen into it themselves.
- 6 Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, * and your glory over all the earth.
- 7 My heart is firmly fixed, O God, my heart is fixed; * I will sing and make melody.
- 8 Wake up, my spirit;
 awake, lute and harp; *
 I myself will waken the dawn.
- 9 I will confess you among the peoples, O God; * I will sing praise to you among the nations.
- 10 For your loving-kindness is greater than the heavens, * and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
- 11 Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, * and your glory over all the earth.

Psalm 58

- 1 Do you indeed decree righteousness, you rulers; * do you judge the peoples with equity?
- 2 No; you devise evil in your hearts, * and your hands deal out violence in the land.
- 3 The wicked are perverse from the womb; * liars go astray from their birth.
- 4 They are as venomous as a serpent; * they are like the deaf adder which stops its ears,
- 5 Which does not heed the voice of the charmer, * no matter how skillful the charming.
- 6 O God, break their teeth in their mouths; * pull the fangs of the young lions, O God.
- 7 Let them vanish like water that runs off; * let them wither like trodden grass.
- 8 Let them be like the snail that melts away, * like a stillborn child that never sees the sun.
- 9 Before they bear fruit, let them be cut down like a brier; * like thorns and thistles let them be swept away.
- 10 The righteous will be glad when they see the vengeance; * they will bathe their feet in the blood of the wicked.
- 11 And they will say,"Surely, there is a reward for the righteous; * surely, there is a God who rules in the earth."

Eleventh Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 59

Rescue me from my enemies, O God; *
protect me from those who rise up against me.

- 2 Rescue me from evildoers * and save me from those who thirst for my blood.
- 3 See how they lie in wait for my life, how the mighty gather together against me; * not for any offense or fault of mine, O God.
- 4 Not because of any guilt of mine, * they run and prepare themselves for battle.
- 5 Rouse yourself, come to my side and see, * for you, O God of hosts, are Israel's God.
- 6 Awake, and punish all the ungodly; * show no mercy to those who are faithless and evil.
- 7 They go to and fro in the evening; * they snarl like dogs and run about the city.
- 8 Behold, they boast with their mouths, and taunts are on their lips; *
 "For who," they say, "will hear us?"
- 9 But you, O God, you laugh at them; * you laugh all the ungodly to scorn.
- 10 My eyes are fixed on you, O my Strength; * for you, O God, are my stronghold.
- 11 My merciful God comes to meet me; * God will let me look in triumph on my enemies.
- 12 Slay them, O God, lest my people forget; * send them reeling by your might and put them down, O God our shield.
- 13 For the sins of their mouths, for the words of their lips, for the cursing and lies that they utter, * let them be caught in their pride.
- 14 Make an end of them in your wrath; * make an end of them, and they shall be no more.
- 15 Let everyone know that God rules in Jacob, * and to the ends of the earth.
- 16 They go to and fro in the evening; * they snarl like dogs and run about the city.
- 17 They forage for food, * and if they are not filled, they howl.
- 18 For my part, I will sing of your strength; * I will celebrate your love in the morning;
- 19 For you have become my stronghold, * a refuge in the day of my trouble.
- 20 To you, O my Strength, will I sing; * for you, O God, are my stronghold and my merciful God.

- O God, you have cast us off and broken us; * you have been angry; oh, take us back to you again.
- 2 You have shaken the earth and split it open; * repair the cracks in it, for it totters.
- 3 You have made your people know hardship; * you have given us wine that makes us stagger.
- 4 You have set up a banner for those who fear you, * to be a refuge from the power of the bow.

- 5 Save us by your right hand and answer us, * that those who are dear to you may be delivered.
- God spoke from the holy place and said: *
 "I will exult and parcel out Shechem; I will divide the valley of Succoth.
- 7 Gilead is mine and Manasseh is mine; * Ephraim is my helmet and Judah my scepter.
- 8 Moab is my wash-basin; on Edom I throw down my sandal to claim it, * and over Philistia will I shout in triumph."
- 9 Who will lead me into the strong city; * who will bring me into Edom?
- 10 Have you not cast us off, O God? * You no longer go out, O God, with our armies.
- 11 Grant us your help against the enemy, * for all human help is in vain.
- 12 With you, O God, we will do valiant deeds, * and you will tread our enemies under foot.

- 1 Hear my cry, O God, * and listen to my prayer.
- 2 I call upon you from the ends of the earth with heaviness in my heart; * set me upon the rock that is higher than I.
- 3 For you have been my refuge, * a strong tower against the enemy.
- 4 I will dwell in your house for ever; * I will take refuge under the cover of your wings.
- 5 For you, O God, have heard my vows; * you have granted me the heritage of those who fear your Name.
- 6 Add length of days to the king's life; * let his years extend over many generations.
- 7 Let him sit enthroned before God for ever; * bid love and faithfulness watch over him.
- 8 So will I always sing the praise of your Name, * and day by day I will fulfill my vows.

Twelfth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 For God alone my soul in silence waits; * from God comes my salvation.
- 2 God alone is my rock and my salvation, * my stronghold, so that I shall not be greatly shaken.
- 3 How long will you assail me to crush me, all of you together, * as if you were a leaning fence, a toppling wall?
- 4 They seek only to bring me down from my place of honor; * lies are their chief delight.
- 5 They bless with their lips, * but in their hearts they curse.
- 6 For God alone my soul in silence waits; * truly, there is my hope.

- 7 God alone is my rock and my salvation, * my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
- 8 In God is my safety and my honor; * God is my strong rock and my refuge.

9 Put your trust in God always, O people; * pour out your hearts before the One who is our refuge.

- 10 Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath, * even those of low estate cannot be trusted.
- 11 On the scales they are lighter than a breath, * all of them together.

12 Put no trust in extortion;in robbery take no empty pride; *though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.

- 13 God has spoken once, twice have I heard it, * that power belongs to God.
- 14 Steadfast love is yours, O God, * for you repay everyone according to their deeds.

Psalm 63

- 1 O God, you are my God; eagerly I seek you; * my soul thirsts for you, my flesh faints for you, as in a barren and dry land where there is no water.
- 2 Therefore I have gazed upon you in your holy place, * that I might behold your power and your glory.
- 3 For your loving-kindness is better than life itself; * my lips shall give you praise.
- 4 So will I bless you as long as I live * and lift up my hands in your Name.
- 5 My soul is content, as with marrow and fatness, * and my mouth praises you with joyful lips,
- 6 When I remember you upon my bed, * and meditate on you in the night watches.
- 7 For you have been my helper, * and under the shadow of your wings I will rejoice.
- 8 My soul clings to you; * your right hand holds me fast.
- 9 May those who seek my life to destroy it * go down into the depths of the earth;
- 10 Let them fall upon the edge of the sword, * and let them be food for jackals.
- 11 But the sovereign will rejoice in God; all those who swear by God will be glad, * for the mouth of those who speak lies shall be stopped.

- 1 Hear my voice, O God, when I complain; * protect my life from fear of the enemy.
- 2 Hide me from the conspiracy of the wicked, * from the mob of evildoers.
- 3 They sharpen their tongue like a sword, * and aim their bitter words like arrows,
- 4 That they may shoot down the blameless from ambush; * they shoot without warning and are not afraid.

- 5 They hold fast to their evil course; * they plan how they may hide their snares.
- 6 They say, "Who will see us; who will find out our crimes? * We have thought out a perfect plot."
- 7 The human mind and heart are a mystery, * but God will loose an arrow at them, and suddenly they will be wounded.
- 8 God will make them trip over their tongues, * and all who see them will shake their heads.
- 9 Everyone will stand in awe and declare God's deeds; * they will recognize the works of the Most High.
- 10 The righteous will rejoice and put their trust in God, * and all who are true of heart will glory.

Twelfth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 65

- 1 You are to be praised, O God, in Zion; * to you shall vows be performed in Jerusalem.
- 2 To you that hear prayer shall all flesh come, * because of their transgressions.
- 3 Our sins are stronger than we are, * but you will blot them out.
- 4 Happy are they whom you choose and draw to your courts to dwell there; * they will be satisfied by the beauty of your house, by the holiness of your temple.
- 5 Awesome things will you show us in your righteousness,0 God of our salvation, *0 Hope of all the ends of the earth

and of the seas that are far away.

- 6 You make fast the mountains by your power; * they are girded about with might.
- 7 You still the roaring of the seas, * the roaring of their waves, and the clamor of the peoples.
- 8 Those who dwell at the ends of the earth will tremble at your marvelous signs; * you make the dawn and the dusk to sing for joy.
- 9 You visit the earth and water it abundantly; you make it very plenteous; *

the river of God is full of water.

- 10 You prepare the grain, * for so you provide for the earth.
- 11 You drench the furrows and smooth out the ridges; * with heavy rain you soften the ground and bless its increase.
- 12 You crown the year with your goodness, * and your paths overflow with plenty.
- 13 May the fields of the wilderness be rich for grazing, * and the hills be clothed with joy.
- 14 May the meadows cover themselves with flocks, and the valleys cloak themselves with grain; * let them shout for joy and sing.

 Be joyful in God, all you lands; * sing the glory of God's Name; sing the glory of God's praise.

2 Say to God, "How awesome are your deeds; * because of your great strength your enemies cringe before you.

3 All the earth bows down before you, * sings to you, sings out your Name."

4 Come now and see the works of God, * how wonderful are these doings toward all people.

God turned the sea into dry land,
 so that they went through the water on foot, *
 and there we rejoiced in God,

6 Whose might rules for ever; whose eyes keep watch over the nations; * let not the rebellious lift up their heads.

7 Bless our God, you peoples; * let the sound of praise be heard;

- 8 God holds our souls in life, * and will not allow our feet to slip.
- 9 For you, O God, have proved us; * you have tried us just as silver is tried.
- 10 You brought us into the snare * and laid heavy burdens upon our backs.
- 11 You let enemies ride over our heads; we went through fire and water, * but you brought us out into a place of refreshment.
- 12 I will enter your house with burnt-offerings and will pay you my vows, * which I promised with my lips and spoke with my mouth when I was in trouble.
- 13 I will offer you sacrifices of fat beasts with the smoke of rams; * I will give you oxen and goats.
- 14 Come and listen, all you who fear God, * and I will tell you what God has done for me.
- 15 I called out to God with my mouth, * and high praise was on my tongue.
- 16 If I had found evil in my heart, * God would not have heard me;
- 17 But in truth God has heard me * and has attended to the voice of my prayer.
- 18 Blessed be God, who has not rejected my prayer, * nor withheld steadfast love from me.

- Be merciful to us, O God, and bless us, * show us the light of your countenance and come to us.
- 2 Let your ways be known upon earth, * your saving health among all nations.
- 3 Let the peoples praise you, O God; * let all the peoples praise you.

- 4 Let the nations be glad and sing for joy, * for you judge the peoples with equity and guide all the nations upon earth.
- 5 Let the peoples praise you, O God; * let all the peoples praise you.
- 6 The earth has brought forth its increase; * may you, our own God, give us your blessing.
- 7 May you give us your blessing, * and may all the ends of the earth stand in awe of you.

Thirteenth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 Arise, O God, and let your enemies be scattered; * let those who hate you flee before you.
- 2 Let them vanish like smoke when the wind drives it away; * as the wax melts at the fire, so let the wicked perish at your presence, O God.
- 3 But let the righteous be glad and rejoice before you; * let them also be merry and joyful.
- 4 We sing praises to your holy Name; we exalt the One who rides upon the heavens; * yours is the Name in which we rejoice!
- 5 Guardian of orphans, defender of widows, * God, in your holy habitation!
- 6 You give the solitary a home and bring forth prisoners into freedom, * but the rebels shall live in dry places.
- 7 O God, when you went forth before your people, * when you marched through the wilderness,
- 8 The earth shook, and the skies poured down rain, at the presence of God, the God of Sinai, * at the presence of God, the God of Israel.
- 9 You sent a gracious rain, O God, upon your inheritance; * you refreshed the land when it was weary.
- 10 Your people found their home in it; * in your goodness, O God, you have made provision for the poor.
- 11 You gave the word; * great was the company of those who bore the tidings:
- 12 "Rulers with their armies are fleeing away; * the ones at home are dividing the spoils."
- 13 Though you lingered among the sheepfolds, * you shall be like a dove whose wings are covered with silver, whose feathers are like green gold.
- 14 When the Almighty scattered rulers, * it was like snow falling in Zalmon.
- 15 O mighty mountain, O hill of Bashan! * O rugged mountain, O hill of Bashan!
- 16 Why do you look with envy, O rugged mountain, at the hill which God chose for a resting place? * Truly, God will dwell there for ever.
- 17 Your chariots, O God, are twenty thousand, even thousands of thousands; * you come in holiness from Sinai.
- 18 You have gone up on high and led captivity captive;

you have received gifts even from your enemies, * that the Holy One might dwell among them. 19 Blest are you, O God, day by day, * the God of our salvation, who bears our burdens. 20 You are our God, the God of our salvation; * you are the one by whom we escape death. 21 You will crush the heads of your enemies * and the hairy scalp of those who go on still in their wickedness. 22 You have said, "I will bring my people back from Bashan; * I will bring them back from the depths of the sea; 23 That their feet may be dipped in blood, * the tongues of their dogs in the blood of their enemies." 24 They see your procession, O God, * your procession into the sanctuary, my God and my sovereign. 25 The singers go before, musicians follow after, * in the midst of maidens playing upon the hand-drums. 26 Bless God in the congregation; * bless God, you that are of the fountain of Israel. 27 There is Benjamin, least of the tribes, at the head; the rulers of Judah in a company; * and the rulers of Zebulon and Naphtali. 28 Send forth your strength, O God; * establish, O God, what you have wrought for us. 29 Rulers shall bring gifts to you, * for your temple's sake at Jerusalem. 30 Rebuke the wild beast of the reeds, * and the peoples, a herd of wild bulls with its calves. 31 Trample down those who lust after silver; * scatter the peoples that delight in war. 32 Let tribute be brought out of Egypt; * let Ethiopia stretch out its hands to you. 33 Sing to God, O nations of the earth; * sing praises to the Holy One, 34 Who rides in the heavens, the ancient heavens, * who sends forth a voice, a mighty voice. 35 Ascribe power to God, * whose majesty is over Israel, whose strength is in the skies. 36 How wonderful is God in the holy places; * the God of Israel giving strength and power to the people: blessed be God! Thirteenth Day: Evening Prayer Psalm 69 Save me, O God, * 1 for the waters have risen up to my neck. I am sinking in deep mire, * 2

- and there is no firm ground for my feet.
- 3 I have come into deep waters, * and the torrent washes over me.
- I have grown weary with my crying;
 my throat is inflamed; *
 my eyes have failed from looking for my God.

- 5 Those who hate me without a cause are more than the hairs of my head; my lying foes who would destroy me are mighty. * Must I then give back what I never stole?
- 6 O God, you know my foolishness, * and my faults are not hidden from you.
- 7 Let not those who hope in you be put to shame through me, O God of hosts; * let not those who seek you be disgraced because of me, O God of Israel.
- 8 Surely for your sake have I suffered reproach, * and shame has covered my face.
- 9 I have become a stranger to my own kindred, * an outcast to my mother's children.
- 10 Zeal for your house has eaten me up; * the scorn of those who scorn you has fallen upon me.
- 11 I humbled myself with fasting, * but that was turned to my reproach.
- 12 I put on sack-cloth also, * and became a byword among them.
- 13 Those who sit at the gate murmur against me, * and the drunkards make songs about me.
- 14 But as for me, this is my prayer to you, * at the time you have set, O God.
- 15 "In your great mercy, O God, * answer me with your unfailing help.
- 16 Save me from the mire; do not let me sink; * let me be rescued from those who hate me and out of the deep waters.
- 17 Let not the torrent of waters wash over me, neither let the deep swallow me up; * do not let the Pit shut its mouth upon me.
- 18 Answer me, O God, for your love is kind; * in your great compassion, turn to me."
- 19 "Hide not your face from your servant; * be swift and answer me, for I am in distress.
- 20 Draw near to me and redeem me; * because of my enemies deliver me.
- 21 You know my reproach, my shame, and my dishonor; * my adversaries are all in your sight."
- 22 Reproach has broken my heart, and it cannot be healed; * I looked for sympathy, but there was none, for comforters, but I could find no one.
- 23 They gave me gall to eat, * and when I was thirsty, they gave me vinegar to drink.
- 24 Let the table before them be a trap * and their sacred feasts a snare.
- 25 Let their eyes be darkened, that they may not see, * and give them continual trembling in their loins.
- 26 Pour out your indignation upon them, * and let the fierceness of your anger overtake them.
- 27 Let their camp be desolate, * and let there be none to dwell in their tents.
- 28 For they persecute the one whom you have stricken * and add to the pain of those whom you have pierced.

- 29 Lay to their charge guilt upon guilt, * and let them not receive your vindication.
- 30 Let them be wiped out of the book of the living * and not be written among the righteous.
- 31 As for me, I am afflicted and in pain; * your help, O God, will lift me up on high.
- 32 I will praise your Name, O God, in song; * I will proclaim your greatness with thanksgiving.
- 33 This will please you more than an offering of oxen, * more than bullocks with horns and hoofs.
- 34 The afflicted shall see and be glad; * those who seek God, their heart shall live.
- 35 For you, O God, listen to the needy, * and your prisoners you do not despise.
- 36 Let the heavens and the earth praise you, * the seas and all that moves in them;
- 37 For you will save Zion and rebuild the cities of Judah; * your people shall live there and have it in possession.
- 38 The children of your servants will inherit it, * and those who love your Name will dwell therein.

- 1 Be pleased, O God, to deliver me; * O God, make haste to help me.
- 2 Let those who seek my life be ashamed and altogether dismayed; * let those who take pleasure in my misfortune draw back and be disgraced.
- 3 Let those who say to me "Aha!" and gloat over me turn back, * because they are ashamed.
- 4 Let all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; * let those who love your salvation say for ever, "Great is the Holy One!"
- 5 But as for me, I am poor and needy; * come to me speedily, O God.
- 6 You are my helper and my deliverer; * O God, do not tarry.

Fourteenth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 In you, O God, have I taken refuge; * let me never be ashamed.
- 2 In your righteousness, deliver me and set me free; * incline your ear to me and save me.
- 3 Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe; * you are my crag and my stronghold.
- 4 Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked, * from the clutches of the evildoer and the oppressor.
- 5 For you are my hope, O God, * my confidence since I was young.
- 6 I have been sustained by you ever since I was born; from my mother's womb you have been my strength; * my praise shall be always of you.

- 7 I have become a portent to many, * but you are my refuge and my strength.
- 8 Let my mouth be full of your praise * and your glory all the day long.
- 9 Do not cast me off in my old age; * forsake me not when my strength fails.
- 10 For my enemies are talking against me, * and those who lie in wait for my life take counsel together.
- 11 They say that God has forsaken me, that they may pursue and seize me * because there is none who will save.
- 12 O God, be not far from me; * come quickly to help me, O my God.
- 13 Let those who set themselves against me be put to shame and be disgraced; * let those who seek to do me evil be covered with scorn and reproach.
- 14 But I shall always wait in patience, * and shall praise you more and more.
- 15 My mouth shall recount your mighty acts and saving deeds all day long, * though I cannot know the number of them.
- 16 I will begin with your mighty works, O God; * I will recall your righteousness, yours alone.
- 17 O God, you have taught me since I was young, * and to this day I tell of your wonderful works.
- 18 And now that I am old and gray-headed, O God, do not forsake me, * till I make known your strength to this generation and your power to all who are to come.
- 19 Your righteousness, O God, reaches to the heavens; * you have done great things; who is like you, O God?
- 20 You have shown me great troubles and adversities, * but you will restore my life and bring me up again from the deep places of the earth.
- 21 You strengthen me more and more; * you enfold and comfort me,
- 22 Therefore I will praise you upon the lyre for your faithfulness, O my God; * I will sing to you with the harp, O Holy One of Israel.
- 23 My lips will sing with joy when I play to you, * and so will my soul, which you have redeemed.
- 24 My tongue will proclaim your righteousness all day long, * for they are ashamed and disgraced who sought to do me harm.

- 1 Give the King your justice, O God, * and your righteousness to the King's Son,
- 2 That he may rule your people righteously * and the poor with justice;
- 3 That the mountains may bring prosperity to the people, * and the little hills bring righteousness.
- 4 He shall defend the needy among the people; * he shall rescue the poor and crush the oppressor.
- 5 He shall live as long as the sun and moon endure, * from one generation to another.

- 7 In his time shall the righteous flourish; * there shall be abundance of peace till the moon shall be no more.
- 8 He shall rule from sea to sea * and from the River to the ends of the earth.

- 10 The rulers of Tarshish and of the isles shall pay tribute, * and the rulers of Arabia and Saba offer gifts.
- 11 All rulers shall bow down before him, * and all the nations do him service.
- 12 For he shall deliver the poor who cries out in distress * and the oppressed who has no helper.
- 13 He shall have pity on the lowly and poor; * he shall preserve the lives of the needy.
- 14 He shall redeem their lives from oppression and violence, * and dear shall their blood be in his sight.
- 15 Long may he live; and may there be given to him gold from Arabia; * may prayer be made for him always, and may they bless him all the day long.
- 16 May there be abundance of grain on the earth, growing thick even on the hilltops; * may its fruit flourish like Lebanon, and its grain like grass upon the earth.
- 17 May his name remain for ever and be established as long as the sun endures; * may all the nations bless themselves in him and call him blest.
- 18 Blest are you, O God of Israel; * you alone do wondrous deeds!
- 19 And blest is your glorious Name for ever! * May all the earth be filled with your glory. Amen. Amen.

Fourteenth Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 Truly, God is good to Israel, * to those who are pure in heart.
- 2 But as for me, my feet had nearly slipped; * I had almost tripped and fallen;
- 3 Because I envied the proud * and saw the prosperity of the wicked:
- 4 For they suffer no pain, * and their bodies are sleek and sound;
- 5 In the misfortunes of others they have no share; * they are not afflicted as others are;
- 6 Therefore they wear their pride like a necklace * and wrap their violence about them like a cloak.
- 7 Their iniquity comes from gross minds, * and their hearts overflow with wicked thoughts.
- 8 They scoff and speak maliciously; * out of their haughtiness they plan oppression.

9 They set their mouths against the heavens, * and their evil speech runs through the world.

- 10 And so the people turn to them * and find in them no fault.
- 11 They say, "How should God know; * is there knowledge in the Most High?"
- 12 So then, these are the wicked; * always at ease, they increase their wealth.
- 13 In vain have I kept my heart clean * and washed my hands in innocence.
- 14 I have been afflicted all day long * and punished every morning.
- 15 Had I gone on speaking this way, *I should have betrayed the generation of your children.
- 16 When I tried to understand these things, * it was too hard for me,
- 17 Until I entered the sanctuary of God * and discerned the end of the wicked.
- 18 Surely, you set them in slippery places; * you cast them down in ruin.
- 19 Oh, how suddenly do they come to destruction, * come to an end, and perish from terror!
- 20 Like a dream when one awakens, O God, * when you arise you will make their image vanish.
- 21 When my mind became embittered, * I was sorely wounded in my heart.
- 22 I was stupid and had no understanding; * I was like a brute beast in your presence.
- 23 Yet I am always with you; * you hold me by my right hand
- 24 You will guide me by your counsel, * and afterwards receive me with glory.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but you? * And having you I desire nothing upon earth.
- 26 Though my flesh and my heart should waste away, * God is the strength of my heart and my portion for ever.
- 27 Truly, those who forsake you will perish; * you destroy all who are unfaithful.
- 28 But it is good for me to be near God; * I have made the Most High my refuge.
- 29 I will speak of all your works * in the gates of the city of Zion.

- 1 O God, why have you utterly cast us off; * why is your wrath so hot against the sheep of your pasture?
- 2 Remember your congregation that you purchased long ago, * the tribe you redeemed to be your inheritance, and Mount Zion where you dwell.
- 3 Turn your steps toward the endless ruins; * the enemy has laid waste everything in your sanctuary.
- 4 Your adversaries roared in your holy place; * they set up their banners as tokens of victory.

- 5 They were like people coming up with axes to a grove of trees; * they broke down all your carved work with hatchets and hammers.
- 6 They set fire to your holy place; * they defiled the dwelling-place of your Name and razed it to the ground.
- 7 They said to themselves, "Let us destroy them altogether." * They burned down all the meeting-places of God in the land.
- 8 There are no signs for us to see; there is no prophet left; * there is not one among us who knows how long.
- 9 How long, O God, will the adversary scoff; * will the enemy blaspheme your Name for ever?
- 10 Why do you draw back your hand; * why is your right hand hidden in your bosom?
- 11 Yet God is my sovereign from ancient times, * victorious in the midst of the earth.
- 12 You divided the sea by your might * and shattered the heads of the dragons upon the waters;
- 13 You crushed the heads of Leviathan, * which you gave to the people of the desert for food.
- 14 You split open spring and torrent; * you dried up ever-flowing rivers.
- 15 Yours is the day, yours also the night; * you established the moon and the sun.
- 16 You fixed all the boundaries of the earth; * you made both summer and winter.
- 17 Remember, O God, how the enemy scoffed, * how a foolish people despised your Name.
- 18 Do not hand over the life of your dove to wild beasts; * never forget the lives of your poor.
- 19 Look upon your covenant; * the dark places of the earth are haunts of violence.
- 20 Let not the oppressed turn away ashamed; * let the poor and needy praise your Name.
- 21 Arise, O God, maintain your cause; * remember how fools revile you all day long.
- 22 Forget not the clamor of your adversaries, * the unending tumult of those who rise up against you.

Fifteenth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 We give you thanks, O God, we give you thanks, * calling upon your Name and declaring all your wonderful deeds.
- 2 "I will appoint a time," says God; *"I will judge with equity.
- 3 Though the earth and all its inhabitants are quaking, * I will make its pillars fast.
- 4 I will say to the boasters, 'Boast no more,' * and to the wicked, 'Do not toss your horns;
- 5 Do not toss your horns so high, * nor speak with a proud neck.'
- 6 For judgment is neither from the east nor from the west, * nor yet from the wilderness or the mountains."

- 7 You are judge, O God; * you put down one and lift up another.
- 8 For in your hand there is a cup, full of spiced and foaming wine, which you pour out, * and all the wicked of the earth shall drink and drain the dregs.
- 9 But I will rejoice for ever; *
 I will sing praises to you, O God of Jacob.
- 10 For you will break off all the horns of the wicked; * but the horns of the righteous shall be exalted.

- 1 In Judah you are known, O God; * your Name is great in Israel.
- 2 At Salem is your tabernacle, * and your dwelling is in Zion.
- 3 There you broke the flashing arrows, * the shield, the sword, and the weapons of battle.
- 4 How glorious you are, * more splendid than the everlasting mountains!
- 5 The strong of heart have been despoiled; they sink into sleep; * none of the warriors can lift a hand.
- 6 At your rebuke, O God of Jacob, * both horse and rider lie stunned.
- 7 What terror you inspire; * who can stand before you when you are angry?
- 8 From heaven you pronounced judgment; * the earth was afraid and was still,
- 9 When God rose up to judgment * and to save all the oppressed of the earth.
- 10 Truly, wrathful Edom will give you thanks, * and the remnant of Hamath will keep your feasts.
- 11 Make a vow to your God and keep it; * let the nations bring gifts to the One who is worthy to be feared,
- 12 Who breaks the spirit of princes, *and strikes terror in the rulers of the earth.

- I will cry aloud to God; *

 I cry aloud to the One who will hear me.

 In the day of my trouble I sought after God; *
 my hands were stretched out by night and did not tire;
 - I refused to be comforted.
- 3 I think of God; I am restless; * I ponder and my spirit faints.
- 4 You will not let my eyelids close; * I am troubled and I cannot speak.
- 5 I consider the days of old; * I remember the years long past;
- 6 I commune with my heart in the night; * I ponder and search my mind.
- 7 Will you cast me off for ever; * will you no more show your favor?

| 8 | Has your loving-kindness come to an end for ever; * |

- 9 Have you forgotten to be gracious; * have you, in your anger, withheld your compassion?
- 10 And I said, "My grief is this: * the right hand of the Most High has lost its power."
- 11 I will remember the works of God * and call to mind your wonders of old time.
- 12 I will meditate on all your acts * and ponder your mighty deeds.
- 13 Your way, O God, is holy; * who is so great a god as our God?
- 14 You are the God who works wonders * and have declared your power among the peoples.
- 15 By your strength you have redeemed your people, * the children of Jacob and Joseph.
- 16 The waters saw you, O God; the waters saw you and trembled; * the very depths were shaken.
- 17 The clouds poured out water; the skies thundered; * your arrows flashed to and fro;
- 18 The sound of your thunder was in the whirlwind; your lightnings lit up the world; * the earth trembled and shook.
- 18 Your way was in the sea, and your paths in the great waters, * yet your footsteps were not seen.
- 20 You led your people like a flock * by the hand of Moses and Aaron.

Fifteenth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 78:1-39

- Hear my teaching, O my people; *
 incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2 I will open my mouth in a parable; * I will declare the mysteries of ancient times.
- 3 That which we have heard and known, and what our forebears have told us, * we will not hide from their children.
- 4 We will recount to generations to come your praiseworthy deeds and your power, O God, * and the wonderful works you have done.
- 5 You gave your decrees to Jacob and established a law for Israel, * which you commanded them to teach their children;
- 6 That the generations to come might know, and the children yet unborn, * that they in their turn might tell it to their children;
- 7 So that they might put their trust in you, * and not forget your deeds, but keep your commandments;
- 8 And not be like their forebears,

a stubborn and rebellious generation, * a generation whose heart was not steadfast, and whose spirit was not faithful to you.

9 The people of Ephraim, armed with the bow, * turned back in the day of battle;

10 They did not keep your covenant * and refused to walk in your law;

11 They forgot what you had done, * and the wonders you had shown them.

12 You worked marvels in the sight of their forebears, * in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan.

13 You split open the sea and let them pass through; * you made the waters stand up like walls.

14 You led them with a cloud by day, * and all the night through with a glow of fire.

15 You split the hard rocks in the wilderness * and gave them drink as from the great deep.

16 You brought streams out of the cliff, * and the waters gushed out like rivers.

17 But they went on sinning against you, * rebelling in the desert against the Most High.

18 They tested you in their hearts, * demanding food for their craving.

19 They railed against you and said, * "Can God set a table in the wilderness?"

20 True, God struck the rock, the waters gushed out, and the gullies overflowed; * but is God able to give bread or to provide meat for the people?"

21 When you heard this, you were full of wrath; * a fire was kindled against Jacob, and your anger mounted against Israel;

22 For they had no faith in you, * nor did they put their trust in your saving power.

23 So you commanded the clouds above * and opened the doors of heaven.

24 You rained down manna upon them to eat * and gave them grain from heaven.

25 So mortals ate the bread of angels; * you provided for them food enough.

26 You caused the east wind to blow in the heavens * and led out the south wind by your might.

27 You rained down flesh upon them like dust * and winged birds like the sand of the sea.

28 You let it fall in the midst of their camp * and round about their dwellings.

29 So they ate and were well filled, * for you gave them what they craved.

30 But they did not stop their craving, * though the food was still in their mouths.

31 So your anger mounted against them; * you slew the strongest among them and laid low the youth of Israel.

- 32 In spite of all this, they went on sinning * and had no faith in your wonderful works.
- 33 So you brought their days to an end like a breath * and their years in sudden terror.
- 34 Whenever you slew them, they would seek you, * and repent, and diligently search for you.
- 35 They would remember that you were their rock, * that you, the Most High, were their redeemer.
- 36 But they flattered you with their mouths * and lied to you with their tongues.
- 37 Their heart was not steadfast toward you, * and they were not faithful to your covenant.
- 38 But you were so merciful that you forgave their sins and did not destroy them; * many times you held back your anger and did not permit your wrath to be roused.
- 39 For you remembered that they were but flesh, * a breath that goes forth and does not return.

Psalm 78:40-72

- 40 How often the people disobeyed you in the wilderness * and offended you in the desert!
- 41 Again and again they tempted you * and provoked you, the Holy One of Israel.
- 42 They did not remember your power * in the day when you ransomed them from the enemy;
- 43 How you wrought your signs in Egypt * and your omens in the field of Zoan.
- 44 You turned their rivers into blood, * so that they could not drink of their streams.
- 45 You sent swarms of flies among them, which ate them up, * and frogs, which destroyed them.
- 46 You gave their crops to the caterpillar, * the fruit of their toil to the locust.
- 47 You killed their vines with hail * and their sycamores with frost.
- 48 You delivered their cattle to hailstones * and their livestock to hot thunderbolts.
- 49 You poured out upon them your blazing anger: * fury, indignation, and distress, a troop of destroying angels.
- 50 You gave full rein to your anger; you did not spare their souls from death, * but delivered their lives to the plague.
- 51 You struck down all the firstborn of Egypt, * the first-fruits of their strength in the dwellings of Ham.
- 52 You led out your people like sheep * and guided them in the wilderness like a flock.
- 53 You led them to safety, and they were not afraid; * but the sea overwhelmed their enemies.
- 54 You brought them to your holy land, * the mountain your right hand had won.
- 55 You drove out the Canaanites before them

and apportioned an inheritance to them by lot; * you made the tribes of Israel to dwell in their tents.

- 56 But they tested you, O Most High, and defied you, * and did not keep your commandments.
- 57 They turned away and were disloyal like their forebears; * they were undependable like a warped bow.
- 58 They grieved you with their hill-altars * and provoked your displeasure with their idols.
- 59 When you heard this, you were angry * and utterly rejected Israel.
- 60 You forsook the shrine at Shiloh, * the tabernacle where you had lived among your people.
- 61 You delivered the ark into captivity, * your glory into the adversary's hand.
- 62 You gave your people to the sword * and were angered against your inheritance.
- 63 The fire consumed their young men; * there were no wedding songs for their maidens.
- 64 Their priests fell by the sword, * and their widows made no lamentation.
- 65 Then you awoke, O God, as though from sleep, * like a warrior refreshed with wine.
- 66 You struck your enemies on the backside * and put them to perpetual shame.
- 67 You rejected the tent of Joseph * and did not choose the tribe of Ephraim;
- 68 You chose instead the tribe of Judah * and Mount Zion, which you loved.
- 69 You built your sanctuary like the heights of heaven, * like the earth which you founded for ever.
- 70 You chose David your servant, * and took him away from the sheepfolds.
- 71 You brought him from following the ewes, * to be a shepherd over Jacob your people and over Israel your inheritance.
- 72 So he shepherded them with a faithful and true heart * and guided them with the skillfulness of his hands.

Sixteenth Day: Morning Prayer

- O God, the nations have come into your inheritance; they have profaned your holy temple; * they have made Jerusalem a heap of rubble.
- 2 They have given the bodies of your servants as food for the birds of the air, * and the flesh of your faithful ones to the beasts of the field.
- 3 They have shed their blood like water on every side of Jerusalem, * and there was no one to bury them.
- 4 We have become a reproach to our neighbors, * an object of scorn and derision to those around us.
- 5 How long will you be angry, O God; * will your fury blaze like fire for ever?
- 6 Pour out your wrath upon the nations who have not known you * and upon the realms that have not called upon your Name.

- 7 For they have devoured Jacob * and made his dwelling a ruin.
- 8 Remember not our past sins; let your compassion be swift to meet us; * for we have been brought very low.
- 9 Help us, O God our Savior, for the glory of your Name; * deliver us and forgive us our sins, for your Name's sake.
- 10 Why should the nations say, "Where is their God?" * Let it be known among the nations and in our sight that you avenge the shedding of your servant's blood.
- 11 Let the sorrowful sighing of the prisoners come before you, * and by your great might spare those who are condemned to die.
- 12 May the revilings with which they reviled you, O God, * return seven-fold into their bosoms.
- 13 For we are your people and the sheep of your pasture; * we will give you thanks for ever and show forth your praise from age to age.

- 1 Hear, O Shepherd of Israel, leading Joseph like a flock; * shine forth, you that are enthroned upon the cherubim.
- 2 In the presence of Ephraim, Benjamin, and Manasseh, * stir up your strength and come to help us.
- 3 Restore us, O God of hosts; * show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.
- 4 O God of hosts, * how long will you be angered despite the prayers of your people?
- 5 You have fed them with the bread of tears; * you have given them bowls of tears to drink.
- 6 You have made us the derision of our neighbors, * and our enemies laugh us to scorn.
- 7 Restore us, O God of hosts; * show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.
- 8 You have brought a vine out of Egypt; * you cast out the nations and planted it.
- 9 You prepared the ground for it; * it took root and filled the land.
- 10 The mountains were covered by its shadow * and the towering cedar trees by its boughs.
- 11 You stretched out its tendrils to the Sea * and its branches to the River.
- 12 Why have you broken down its wall, * so that all who pass by pluck off its grapes?
- 13 The wild boar of the forest has ravaged it, * and the beasts of the field have grazed upon it.
- 14 Turn now, O God of hosts, look down from heaven; behold and tend this vine; * preserve what your right hand has planted.
- 15 They burn it with fire like rubbish; * at the rebuke of your countenance let them perish.
- 16 Let your hand be upon the one at your right hand, * the one you have made so strong for yourself.

- 17 And so will we never turn away from you, * give us life, that we may call upon your Name.
- 18 Restore us, O God of hosts; * show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

- Sing with joy to God our strength, *

 and raise a loud shout to the God of Jacob.
- 2 Raise a song and sound the timbrel, * the merry harp, and the lyre.
- 3 Blow the ram's-horn at the new moon * and at the full moon, the day of our feast.
- 4 For this is a statute for Israel, * a law of the God of Jacob.
- 5 God laid it as a solemn charge upon Joseph, * when he came out of the land of Egypt.
- 6 I heard an unfamiliar voice saying: *
 "I eased Israel's shoulder from the burden; their hands were set free from bearing the load."
- 7 You called on me in trouble, and I saved you; * I answered you from the secret place of thunder and tested you at the waters of Meribah.
- 8 Hear, O my people, and I will admonish you: * O Israel, if you would but listen to me!
- 9 There shall be no strange god among you; * you shall not worship a foreign god.
- 10 I am your God,
 who brought you out of the land of Egypt and said, *
 "Open your mouth wide, and I will fill it."
- 11 And yet my people did not hear my voice, * and Israel would not obey me.
- 12 So I gave them over to the stubbornness of their hearts, * to follow their own devices.
- 13 Oh, that my people would listen to me, * that Israel would walk in my ways!
- 14 I should soon subdue their enemies * and turn my hand against their foes.
- 15 Those who hate me would cringe before me, * and their punishment would last for ever.
- 16 But Israel would I feed with the finest wheat * and satisfy them with honey from the rock.

Sixteenth Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 God stands in the council of heaven * and gives judgment in the midst of the gods:
- 2 "How long will you judge unjustly, * and show favor to the wicked?
- 3 Save the weak and the orphan; * defend the humble and needy;
- 4 Rescue the weak and the poor; * deliver them from the power of the wicked.
- 5 They do not know, neither do they understand;

they go about in darkness; *

all the foundations of the earth are shaken.

- 6 Now I say to you, 'You are gods, * and all of you children of the Most High;
- 7 Nevertheless, you shall die like mortals, * and fall like any ruler.' "
- 8 Arise, O God, and rule the earth, * for you shall take all nations for your own.

Psalm 83

- 1 O God, do not be silent; * do not keep still nor hold your peace, O God;
- 2 For your enemies are in tumult, * and those who hate you have lifted up their heads.
- 3 They take secret counsel against your people * and plot against those whom you protect.
- 4 They have said, "Come, let us wipe them out from among the nations; * let the name of Israel be remembered no more."
- 5 They have conspired together; * they have made an alliance against you:
- 6 The tents of Edom and the Ishmaelites; * the Moabites and the Hagarenes;
- 7 Gebal, and Ammon, and Amalek; * the Philistines and those who dwell in Tyre.
- 8 The Assyrians also have joined them * and have come to help the people of Lot.
- 9 Do to them as you did to Midian, * to Sisera, and to Jabin at the river of Kishon:
- 10 They were destroyed at Endor; * they became like dung upon the ground.
- 11 Make their leaders like Oreb and Zeëb, * and all their commanders like Zebah and Zalmunna,
- 12 Who said, "Let us take for ourselves * the fields of God as our possession."
- 13 O my God, make them like whirling dust * and like chaff before the wind,
- 14 Like fire that burns down a forest, * like the flame that sets mountains ablaze.
- 15 Drive them with your tempest * and terrify them with your storm;
- 16 Cover their faces with shame, O God, * that they may seek your Name.
- 17 Let them be disgraced and terrified for ever; * let them be put to confusion and perish.
- 18 Let them know that you, whose Name is Holy, * you alone are the Most High over all the earth.

- 1 How dear to me is your dwelling, O God of hosts! * My soul has a desire and longing for your courts; my heart and my flesh rejoice in the living God.
- 2 The sparrow has found her a house

and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young, * by the side of your altars, O God of hosts, my Ruler and my God.

3 Happy are they who dwell in your house; * they will always be praising you.

4 Happy are the people whose strength is in you; * whose hearts are set on the pilgrims' way.

- 5 Those who go through the desolate valley will find it a place of springs, * for the early rains have covered it with pools of water.
- 6 They will climb from height to height; * the God of gods will be revealed in Zion.
- 7 O God of hosts, hear my prayer; * hearken, O God of Jacob.
- 8 Behold our defender, O God, * and look upon the face of your Anointed,
- 9 For one day in your courts is better than a thousand in my own room, * and to stand at the threshold of the house of my God than to dwell in the tents of the wicked;
- 10 For God is both sun and shield * and will give grace and glory.
- 11 No good thing will God withhold * from those who walk with integrity.
- 12 O God of hosts, * happy are they who put their trust in you!

- 1 You have been gracious to your land, O God; * you have restored the good fortune of Jacob.
- 2 You have forgiven the iniquity of your people * and blotted out all their sins.
- 3 You have withdrawn all your fury * and turned yourself from your wrathful indignation.
- 4 Restore us then, O God our Savior; * let your anger depart from us.
- 5 Will you be displeased with us for ever; * will you prolong your anger from age to age?
- 6 Will you not give us life again, * that your people may rejoice in you?
- 7 Show us your mercy, O God, * and grant us your salvation.
- 8 I will listen to what you are saying, * for you are speaking peace to your faithful people and to those who turn their hearts to you.
- 9 Truly, your salvation is very near to those who fear you, * that your glory may dwell in our land.
- 10 Mercy and truth have met together; * righteousness and peace have kissed each other.
- 11 Truth shall spring up from the earth, * and righteousness shall look down from heaven.
- 12 You, O God, will indeed grant prosperity, * and our land will yield its increase.
- 13 Righteousness shall go before you, * and peace shall be a pathway for your feet.

Seventeenth Day: Morning Prayer **Psalm 86**

- 1 Bow down your ear, O God, and answer me, * for I am poor and in misery.
- 2 Keep watch over my life, for I am faithful; * save your servant, for I put my trust in you.
- 3 Be merciful to me, O God, for you are my God; * I call upon you all the day long.
- 4 Gladden the soul of your servant, * for to you, O God, I lift up my soul.
- 5 For you, O God, are good and forgiving, * and great is your love toward all who call upon you.
- 6 Give ear, O God, to my prayer, * and attend to the voice of my supplications.
- 7 In the time of my trouble I will call upon you, * for you will answer me.
- 8 Among the gods there is none like you, O God, * nor anything like your works.
- 9 All nations you have made will come and worship you, O God, * and glorify your Name.
- 10 For you are great; you do wondrous things; * and you alone are God.
- 11 Teach me your way, O God, and I will walk in your truth; * knit my heart to you that I may fear your Name.
- 12 I will thank you, my God, with all my heart, * and glorify your Name for evermore.
- 13 For great is your love toward me; * you have delivered me from the nethermost Pit.
- 14 The arrogant rise up against me, O God, and a band of the violent seeks my life; * they have not set you before their eyes.
- 15 But you, O God, are gracious and full of compassion, * slow to anger, and full of kindness and truth.
- 16 Turn to me and have mercy upon me; * give your strength to your servant and save the child of your handmaid.
- 17 Show me a sign of your favor, so that those who hate me may see it and be ashamed, * because you, O God, have helped me and comforted me.

- On the holy mountain stands the city God has founded; * God loves the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob.
- 2 Glorious things are spoken of you, * O city of our God.
- 3 I count Egypt and Babylon among those who know me; * behold Philistia, Tyre, and Ethiopia: in Zion were they born.
- 4 Of Zion it shall be said, "Everyone was born there, * and the Most High God shall sustain it."

- 5 God will record in the roll of the peoples, * "These also were born there."
- 6 The singers and the dancers will say, * "All my fresh springs are in you."

- 1 O my God, my Savior, * by day and night I cry to you.
- 2 Let my prayer enter into your presence; * incline your ear to my lamentation.
- 3 For I am full of trouble; * my life is at the brink of the grave.
- 4 I am counted among those who go down to the Pit; * I have become like one who has no strength;
- 5 Lost among the dead, * like the slain who lie in the grave,
- 6 Whom you remember no more, * for they are cut off from your hand.
- 7 You have laid me in the depths of the Pit, * in dark places, and in the abyss.
- 8 Your anger weighs upon me heavily, * and all your great waves overwhelm me.
- 9 You have put my friends far from me;
 you have made me to be abhorred by them; *
 I am in prison and cannot get free.
- 10 My sight has failed me because of trouble; *
 O God, I have called upon you daily;
 I have stretched out my hands to you.
- 11 Do you work wonders for the dead; * will those who have died stand up and give you thanks?
- 12 Will your loving-kindness be declared in the grave * or your faithfulness in the land of destruction?
- 13 Will your wonders be known in the dark * or your righteousness in the country where all is forgotten?
- 14 But as for me, O God, I cry to you for help; * in the morning my prayer comes before you.
- 15 O God, why have you rejected me; * why have you hidden your face from me?
- 16 Ever since my youth, I have been wretched and at the point of death; * I have borne your terrors with a troubled mind.
- 17 Your blazing anger has swept over me; * your terrors have destroyed me;
- 18 They surround me all day long like a flood; * they encompass me on every side.
- 19 My friend and my neighbor you have put away from me, * and darkness is my only companion.

Seventeenth Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 Your love, O God, for ever will I sing; * from age to age my mouth will proclaim your faithfulness.
- 2 For I am persuaded that your love is established for ever; * you have set your faithfulness firmly in the heavens.

29 I will establish his line for ever * and his throne as the days of heaven."

30 "If his children forsake my law * and do not walk according to my judgments;

31 If they break my statutes * and do not keep my commandments;

32 I will punish their transgressions with a rod * and their iniquities with the lash;

33 But I will not take my love from him, * nor let my faithfulness prove false.

34 I will not break my covenant, * nor change what has gone out of my lips.

35 Once for all I have sworn by my holiness: * 'I will not lie to David.

36 His line shall endure for ever * and his throne as the sun before me;

37 It shall stand fast for evermore like the moon, * the abiding witness in the sky.' "

38 But you have cast off and rejected your anointed; * you have become enraged at him.

39 You have broken your covenant with your servant, * defiled his crown, and hurled it to the ground.

40 You have breached all his walls * and laid his strongholds in ruins.

41 All who pass by despoil him; * he has become the scorn of his neighbors.

42 You have exalted the right hand of his foes * and made all his enemies rejoice.

43 You have turned back the edge of his sword * and have not sustained him in battle.

44 You have put an end to his splendor * and cast his throne to the ground.

45 You have cut short the days of his youth * and have covered him with shame.

46 How long will you hide yourself, O God, will you hide yourself for ever; * how long will your anger burn like fire?

47 Remember, O God, how short life is, * how frail you have made all flesh.

48 Who can live and not see death; * who can be saved from the power of the grave?

49 Where, O God, are your loving-kindnesses of old, * which you promised David in your faithfulness?

50 Remember how your servant is mocked, *
how I carry in my bosom the taunts of many peoples,
51 The taunts your enemies have hurled, O God, *

which they hurled at the heels of your anointed.
52 Blessed be God for evermore! *

Amen, I say, Amen.

Eighteenth Day: Morning Prayer Psalm 90

- 1 O God, you have been our refuge * from one generation to another.
- 2 Before the mountains were brought forth, or the land and the earth were born, * from age to age you are God.
- 3 You turn us back to the dust and say, * "Go back, O child of earth."
- 4 For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past * and like a watch in the night.
- 5 You sweep us away like a dream; * we fade away suddenly like the grass.
- 6 In the morning it is green and flourishes; * in the evening it is dried up and withered.
- 7 For we consume away in your displeasure; * we are afraid because of your wrathful indignation.
- 8 Our iniquities you have set before you * and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.
- 9 When you are angry, all our days are gone; * we bring our years to an end like a sigh.
- 10 The span of our life is seventy years, perhaps in strength even eighty; * yet the sum of them is but labor and sorrow, for they pass away quickly and we are gone.
- 11 Who regards the power of your wrath; * who rightly fears your indignation?
- 12 So teach us to number our days * that we may apply our hearts to wisdom.
- 13 Return, O God; how long will you tarry? * Be gracious to your servants.
- 14 Satisfy us by your loving-kindness in the morning; * so shall we rejoice and be glad all the days of our life.
- 15 Make us glad by the measure of the days that you afflicted us * and the years in which we suffered adversity.
- 16 Show your servants your works * and your splendor to their children.
- 17 May the graciousness of our God be upon us; * prosper the work of our hands; prosper our handiwork.

- 1 They who dwell in the shelter of the Most High * abide under the shadow of the Almighty.
- 2 They shall say to God, "You are my refuge and my stronghold, * my God in whom I put my trust."
- 3 For God shall deliver you from the snare of the hunter * and from the deadly pestilence.
- God's pinions shall cover you, and under God's wings you shall find refuge; * God's faithfulness shall be a shield and buckler.
- 5 You shall not be afraid of any terror by night, * nor of the arrow that flies by day;
- 6 Of the plague that stalks in the darkness, * nor of the sickness that lays waste at mid-day.

- 7 A thousand shall fall at your side and ten thousand at your right hand, * but it shall not come near you.
- 8 Your eyes have only to behold * to see the reward of the wicked.
- 9 Because you have made God your refuge * and the Most High your habitation,
- 10 There shall no evil happen to you, * neither shall any plague come near your dwelling.
- 11 For God shall give the angels charge over you, * to keep you in all your ways.
- 12 They shall bear you in their hands, * lest you dash your foot against a stone.
- 13 You shall tread upon the lion and adder; * you shall trample the young lion and the serpent under your feet.
- 14 Because you are bound to me in love, therefore will I deliver you; * I will protect you, because you know my Name.
- 15 You shall call upon me, and I will answer you; * I am with you in trouble; I will rescue you and bring you honor.
- 16 With long life will I satisfy you * and show you my salvation.

- It is a good thing to give thanks to God, * and to sing praises to your Name, O Most High;
- 2 To tell of your loving-kindness early in the morning * and of your faithfulness in the night season;
- 3 On the psaltery, and on the lyre, * and to the melody of the harp,
- 4 For you have made me glad by your acts, O God, * and I shout for joy because of the works of your hands.
- 5 O God, how great are your works; * your thoughts are very deep.
- 6 The dullard does not know, nor does the fool understand, * that though the wicked grow like weeds and all the workers of iniquity flourish,
- 7 They flourish only to be destroyed for ever, * but you, O God, are exalted for evermore.
- 8 For lo, your enemies, O God,
 lo, your enemies shall perish, *
 and all the workers of iniquity shall be scattered.
- 9 But my horn you have exalted like the horns of wild bulls; * I am anointed with fresh oil.
- 10 My eyes also gloat over my enemies, * and my ears rejoice to hear the doom of the wicked who rise up against me.
- 11 The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree * and shall spread abroad like a cedar of Lebanon.
- 12 Those who are planted in the house of God * shall flourish in the heavenly courts.
- 13 They shall still bear fruit in old age; * they shall be green and succulent,

14 That they may show how upright God is, * my Rock, in whom there is no fault.

Eighteenth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 93

- God is Sovereign, clothed in splendid apparel; * God is robed in majesty and is girded with strength.
- 2 God has made the whole world so sure * that it cannot be moved;
- 3 Ever since the world began, your throne has been established; * you are from everlasting.
- 4 The waters have lifted up, O God, the waters have lifted up their voice; * the waters have lifted up their pounding waves.
- 5 Mightier than the sound of many waters, mightier than the breakers of the sea, * mightier is the Holy One who dwells on high.
- 6 Your testimonies are very sure, * and holiness adorns your house, O God, for ever and for evermore.

- 1 O mighty God of vengeance, * O God of vengeance, show yourself.
- 2 Rise up, O Judge of the world; * give the arrogant their just deserts.
- 3 How long shall the wicked, O God, * how long shall the wicked triumph?
- 4 They bluster in their insolence; * all evildoers are full of boasting.
- 5 They crush your people, O God, * and afflict your chosen nation.
- 6 They murder the widow and the stranger * and put the orphans to death.
- 7 Yet they say, "God does not see, * the God of Jacob takes no notice."
- 8 Consider well, you dullards among the people; * when will you fools understand?
- 9 Does the one who planted the ear not hear; * does the one who formed the eye not see?
- 10 Will the one who admonishes the nations not punish; * does the one who teaches all the world have no knowledge?
- 11 God knows our human thoughts, * how like a puff of wind they are.
- 12 Happy are they whom you instruct, O God, * whom you teach out of your law;
- 13 To give them rest in evil days, * until a pit is dug for the wicked.
- 14 For you will not abandon your people, * nor will you forsake your own.

- 15 For judgment will again be just, * and all the true of heart will follow it.
- 16 Who rose up for me against the wicked; * who took my part against the evildoers?
- 17 If you had not come to my help, *I should soon have dwelt in the land of silence.
- 18 As often as I said, "My foot has slipped," * your love, O God, upheld me.
- 19 When many cares fill my mind, * your consolations cheer my soul.
- 20 Can a corrupt tribunal have any part with you, * one which frames evil into law?
- 21 They conspire against the life of the just * and condemn the innocent to death.
- 22 But you have become my stronghold, * you are the rock of my trust.
- 23 You will turn their wickedness back upon them and destroy them in their own malice; * you, O Most High, will destroy them.

Nineteenth Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 95

- Come, let us sing to the Holy One; *
 let us shout for joy to the Rock of our salvation.
- 2 Let us come before God's presence with thanksgiving, * and raise a loud shout with psalms.
- 3 For you, O God, are a great God; * you are great above all gods.
- 4 In your hand are the caverns of the earth, * and the heights of the hills are yours also.
- 5 The sea is yours, for you made it, * and your hands have molded the dry land.
- 6 Come, let us bow down and bend the knee, * and kneel before God, our Maker,
- 7 For you are our God, and we are the people of your pasture and the sheep of your hand. * Oh, that today we would hearken to your voice!
- 8 Harden not your hearts, as your forebears did in the wilderness, *
- 9 at Meribah, and on that day at Massah, when they tempted me;
- 10 They put me to the test, * though they had seen my works.
- 11 Forty years long I detested that generation and said, *
 "This people are wayward in their hearts; they do not know my ways."
- 12 So I swore in my wrath, * "They shall not enter into my rest."

Psalm 96

1 Sing to God a new song; * sing to God all the whole earth.

- 2 Sing and bless God's holy Name; * proclaim the good news of salvation from day to day.
- 3 Declare God's glory among the nations, * God's wonders among all peoples.
- 4 For God is great and greatly to be praised, * more to be feared than all gods.
- 5 As for all the gods of the nations, they are but idols, * but it is God who made the heavens.
- 6 Oh, the majesty and magnificence of God's presence! * Oh, the power and the splendor of God's sanctuary!
- 7 Ascribe to God, you families of the peoples, * ascribe to God honor and power.
- 8 Ascribe due honor to God's holy Name; * bring offerings and come into God's courts.
- 9 Worship the Most High in the beauty of holiness; * let the whole earth tremble before God.
- 10 Tell it out among the nations that God reigns! * God has made the world so firm that it cannot be moved and will judge the peoples with equity.
- 11 Let the heavens rejoice, and let the earth be glad; let the sea thunder and all that is in it; * let the field be joyful and all that is therein.
- 12 Then shall all the trees of the wood shout for joy before God, who will come, * who will come to judge the earth.
- 13 God will judge the world with righteousness * and the peoples with truth.

- 1 You reign, O God; let the earth rejoice; * let the multitude of the isles be glad.
- 2 Clouds and darkness are round about you; * righteousness and justice are the foundations of your throne.
- 3 A fire goes before you * and burns up your enemies on every side.
- 4 Your lightnings light up the world; * the earth sees it and is afraid.
- 5 The mountains melt like wax at your presence, O God, * at your presence, O God of the whole earth.
- 6 The heavens declare your righteousness, * and all the peoples see your glory.
- 7 Confounded be all who worship carved images and delight in false gods! * Let all gods bow down before you.
- 8 Zion hears and is glad, and the cities of Judah rejoice, * because of your judgments, O God.
- 9 For you are God, most high over all the earth; * you are exalted far above all gods.
- 10 You love those who hate evil; * you preserve the lives of your saints and deliver them from the hand of the wicked.
- 11 Light has sprung up for the righteous * and joyful gladness for those who are truehearted.

12 Rejoice in God, you righteous * and give thanks to God's holy Name.

Nineteenth Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 98

- Sing a new song to God, * who has done marvelous things.
- 2 With your right hand, O God, and your holy arm, * you have won for yourself the victory.
- 3 You have made known your victory; * your righteousness have you openly shown in the sight of the nations.
- 4 You remember your mercy and faithfulness to the house of Israel, * and all the ends of the earth have seen the victory of our God.
- 5 Shout with joy to God, all you lands; * lift up your voice, rejoice, and sing.
- 6 Sing to God with the harp, * with the harp and the voice of song.
- 7 With trumpets and the sound of the horn, * shout with joy before our God who reigns in majesty.
- 8 Let the sea make a noise and all that is in it, * the lands and those who dwell therein.
- 9 Let the rivers clap their hands, * and let the hills ring out with joy before God, who will come to judge the earth;
- 10 God shall judge the world in righteousness * and the peoples with equity.

- 1 God reigns; let the people tremble; * God is enthroned upon the cherubim; let the earth shake.
- 2 God is great in Zion * and is high above all peoples.
- 3 Let them confess God's Name, which is great and awesome; * God is the Holy One.
- 4 "O mighty Ruler, lover of justice, you have established equity; * you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob."
- 5 We proclaim your greatness, O God, and fall down before your footstool; * you are the Holy One.
- 6 Moses and Aaron among your priests, and Samuel among those who call upon your Name, * they called upon you, and you answered them.
- 7 You spoke to them out of the pillar of cloud; * they kept your testimonies and the decree that you gave them.
- 8 "O Holy God, you answered them indeed; * you were a God who forgave them, yet punished them for their evil deeds."
- 9 Proclaim the greatness of our God and worship on God's holy hill, * for our God is the Holy One.

- May all lands be joyful before you, O God, * serve with gladness and come before your presence with a song.
- 2 For we know that you are God; * you yourself have made us, and we are yours; we are your people and the sheep of your pasture.
- 3 We shall enter your gates with thanksgiving, go into your courts with praise, * give thanks to you and call upon your Name.
- For you are good;
 your mercy is everlasting; *
 and your faithfulness endures from age to age.

Psalm 101

- 1 I will sing of mercy and justice; * to you, O God, will I sing praises.
- I will strive to follow a blameless course;
 oh, when will you come to me? *
 I will walk with sincerity of heart within my house.
- I will set no worthless thing before my eyes; *
 I hate the doers of evil deeds;
 they shall not remain with me.
- 4 A crooked heart shall be far from me; * I will not know evil.
- 5 Those who in secret slander their neighbors I will destroy; * those who have a haughty look and a proud heart I cannot abide.
- 6 My eyes are upon the faithful in the land, that they may dwell with me, * and only those who lead a blameless life shall be my servants.
- 7 Those who act deceitfully shall not dwell in my house, * and those who tell lies shall not continue in my sight.
- 8 I will soon destroy all the wicked in the land, * that I may root out all evildoers from the city of God.

Twentieth Day: Morning Prayer

- 1 O God, hear my prayer, and let my cry come before you; * hide not your face from me in the day of my trouble.
- 2 Incline your ear to me; * when I call, make haste to answer me,
- 3 For my days drift away like smoke, * and my bones are hot as burning coals.
- 4 My heart is smitten like grass and withered, * so that I forget to eat my bread.
- 5 Because of the voice of my groaning, * I am but skin and bones.
- 6 I have become like a vulture in the wilderness, * like an owl among the ruins.
- 7 I lie awake and groan; * I am like a sparrow, lonely on a house-top.
- 8 My enemies revile me all day long, * and those who scoff at me have taken an oath against me.

For I have eaten ashes for bread * 9 and mingled my drink with weeping. 10 Because of your indignation and wrath, * you have lifted me up and thrown me away. 11 My days pass away like a shadow, * and I wither like the grass. 12 But you, O God, endure for ever, * and your Name from age to age. 13 You will arise and have compassion on Zion, for it is time to have mercy; * indeed, the appointed time has come. 14 For your servants love its very rubble * and are moved to pity even for its dust. 15 The nations shall fear your Name, O God, * and all the rulers of the earth your glory. 16 You, O God, will build up Zion, * and your glory will appear. 17 You will look with favor on the prayer of the homeless * and will not despise their plea. 18 Let this be written for a future generation, * so that a people yet unborn may praise you, O God. 19 For you looked down from your holy place on high; * from the heavens you beheld the earth, 20 That you might hear the groan of the captive * and set free those condemned to die, 21 That they may declare in Zion your Name, O God, * and your praise in Jerusalem, 22 When the peoples are gathered together * and the nations also, to serve you. 23 You have brought down my strength before my time; * you have shortened the number of my days. 24 And I said, "O my God, do not take me away in the midst of my days; * your years endure throughout all generations. 25 In the beginning, O God, you laid the foundations of the earth, * and the heavens are the work of your hands. 26 They shall perish, but you will endure; they all shall wear out like a garment; * as clothing you will change them, and they shall be changed, 27 But you are always the same, * and your years will never end. 28 The children of your servants shall continue, * and their offspring shall stand fast in your sight." Psalm 103 Bless the Holy One, O my soul, *

and all that is within me, bless God's holy Name.

- 2 Bless the Holy One, O my soul, * and forget not all the gifts of God.
- 3 O God, you forgive all our sins * and you heal all our infirmities;

- 4 You redeem our life from the grave * and crown us with mercy and loving-kindness;
- 5 You satisfy us with good things, * and our youth is renewed like an eagle's.
- 6 O God, you execute righteousness * and judgment for all who are oppressed.
- 7 You made your ways known to Moses * and your works to the children of Israel.
- 8 You are full of compassion and mercy, * slow to anger and of great kindness.
- 9 You will not always accuse us, * nor will you keep your anger for ever.
- 10 You have not dealt with us according to our sins, * nor rewarded us according to our wickedness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, * so is your mercy great upon those who fear you.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west, * so far have you removed our sins from us.
- 13 As a parent cares for a child, * so do you care for those who fear you.
- 14 For you yourself know whereof we are made; * you remember that we are but dust.
- 15 Our days are like the grass; * we flourish like a flower of the field;
- 16 When the wind goes over it, it is gone, * and its place shall know it no more.
- 17 But your merciful goodness endures for ever on those who fear you, * and your righteousness on children's children;
- 18 On those who keep your covenant * and remember your commandments and do them.
- 19 You have set your throne in heaven, * and you have dominion over all.
- 20 Bless God, all you angels, you mighty ones who do God's bidding, * and hearken to the voice of God's word.
- 21 Sing praise, all you heavenly hosts, * you ministers who do God's will.
- 22 Bless God, all creation, in all places of God's dominion; * bless the Holy One, O my soul.

Twentieth Day: Evening Prayer

- Bless the Holy One, O my soul; *
 O God, how excellent is your greatness; you are clothed with majesty and splendor.
- 2 You wrap yourself with light as with a cloak; * you spread out the heavens like a curtain.
- 3 You lay the beams of your chambers in the waters above; * you make the clouds your chariot; you ride on the wings of the wind.
- 4 You make the winds your messengers * and flames of fire your servants.

- 5 You have set the earth upon its foundations, * so that it never shall move at any time.
- 6 You covered it with the Deep as with a mantle; * the waters stood higher than the mountains.
- 7 At your rebuke they fled; * at the voice of your thunder they hastened away.

8 They went up into the hills and down to the valleys beneath, * to the places you had appointed for them.

9 You set the limits that they should not pass; * they shall not again cover the earth.

10 You send the springs into the valleys; * they flow between the mountains.

11 All the beasts of the field drink their fill from them, * and the wild asses quench their thirst.

12 Beside them the birds of the air make their nests * and sing among the branches.

13 You water the mountains from your dwelling on high; * the earth is fully satisfied by the fruit of your works.

14 You make grass grow for flocks and herds * and plants to serve all people;

15 That they may bring forth food from the earth, * and wine to gladden our hearts,

16 Oil to make a cheerful countenance, * and bread to strengthen the heart.

17 The trees of the Holy One are full of sap, * the cedars of Lebanon which God planted,

18 In which the birds build their nests, * and in whose tops the storks make their dwellings.

19 The high hills are a refuge for the mountain goats, * and the stony cliffs for the rock badgers.

20 You appointed the moon to mark the seasons, * and the sun knows the time of its setting.

21 You make darkness that it may be night, * in which all the beasts of the forest prowl.

22 The lions roar after their prey * and seek their food from God.

23 The sun rises, and they slip away * and lay themselves down in their dens.

24 We go forth to our work, * and to our labor until the evening.

25 O Holy One, how manifold are your works; * in wisdom you have made them all; the earth is full of your creatures.

26 Yonder is the great and wide sea with its living things too many to number, * creatures both small and great.

27 There move the ships, and there is that Leviathan, * which you have made for the sport of it.

28 All of them look to you * to give them their food in due season.

29 You give it to them; they gather it; * you open your hand, and they are filled with good things. 30 You hide your face, and they are terrified; * you take away their breath, and they die and return to their dust.

31 You send forth your Spirit, and they are created; * and so you renew the face of the earth.

32 May the glory of God endure for ever; * may the Holy One rejoice in all creation.

33 God looks at the earth and it trembles; * God touches the mountains and they smoke.

34 I will sing to God as long as I live; * I will praise my God while I have my being.

35 May these words of mine find favor; * I will rejoice in the Holy One.

36 Let sinners be consumed out of the earth, * and the wicked be no more.

37 Bless the Holy One, O my soul. * Alleluia!

Twenty-first Day: Morning Prayer Psalm 105

- 1 We give you thanks, O God, and call upon your Name, * we make known your deeds among the peoples,
- 2 We sing to you; we sing your praise * and speak of all your marvelous works,

3 We glory in your holy Name; * let the hearts of those who seek you rejoice;

4 We search for you and your strength; * we continue to seek your face;

5 We remember the marvels you have done, * the wonders and the judgments of your mouth:

- 6 We, the offspring of Abraham, your servant, * we, the children of Jacob, the chosen ones.
- 7 You are our God indeed; * your judgments prevail in all the world.

8 You have always been mindful of your covenant, * the promise you made for a thousand generations:

9 The covenant you made with Abraham, * the oath that you swore to Isaac,

10 Which you established as a statute for Jacob, * an everlasting covenant for Israel,

11 Saying, "To them will I give the land of Canaan * to be their allotted inheritance."

- 12 When they were few in number, * of little account, and sojourners in the land,
- 13 Wandering from nation to nation * and from one realm to another,

14 You let no one oppress them * and rebuked monarchs for their sake,

15 Saying, "Do not touch my anointed * and do my prophets no harm."

16 Then you called for a famine in the land * and destroyed the supply of bread.

17 You sent a man before them, * Joseph, who was sold as a slave. 18 They bruised his feet in fetters; * his neck they put in an iron collar. 19 Until his prediction came to pass, * your word, O Most High, tested him. 20 The king sent and released him; * the ruler of the peoples set him free. 21 He set him as a master over his household, * as a ruler over all his possessions, 22 To instruct his princes according to his will * and to teach his elders wisdom. 23 Israel came into Egypt, * and Jacob became a sojourner in the land of Ham. 24 You made your people exceedingly fruitful; * you made them stronger than their enemies; 25 Whose heart you turned, so that they hated your people, * and dealt unjustly with your servants. 26 You sent Moses your servant, * and Aaron whom you had chosen. 27 They worked your signs among them, * and portents in the land of Ham. 28 You sent darkness, and it grew dark; * but the Egyptians rebelled against your words. 29 You turned their waters into blood * and caused their fish to die. 30 Their land was overrun by frogs, * in the very chambers of their rulers. 31 You spoke, and there came swarms of insects * and gnats within all their borders. 32 You gave them hailstones instead of rain, * and flames of fire throughout their land. 33 You blasted their vines and their fig trees * and shattered every tree in their country. 34 You spoke, and the locust came, * and young locusts without number, 35 Which ate up all the green plants in their land * and devoured the fruit of their soil. 36 You struck down the firstborn of their land, * the firstfruits of all their strength. 37 You led out your people with silver and gold; * in all their tribes there was not one that stumbled. 38 Egypt was glad of their going, * because they were afraid of them. 39 You spread out a cloud for a covering * and a fire to give light in the night season. 40 They asked, and quails appeared, * and you satisfied them with bread from heaven. 41 You opened the rock, and water flowed, * so the river ran in the dry places. 42 For you remembered your holy word * and Abraham your servant.

- 43 So you led forth your people with gladness, * your chosen with shouts of joy.
- 44 You gave your people the lands of the nations, * and they took the fruit of others' toil,
- 45 That they might keep your statutes * and observe your laws. Alleluia!

Twenty-first Day: Evening Prayer Psalm 106

- Alleluia! Give thanks, for the Holy One is good; * God's mercy endures for ever.
- 2 Who can declare the mighty acts of God * or show forth rightful praise?
- 3 Happy are they who act with justice * and always do what is right!
- 4 Remember me, O God, with the favor you have for your people, * and visit me with your saving help;
- 5 That I may see the prosperity of your elect and be glad with the gladness of your people, * that I may glory with your inheritance.
- 6 We have sinned as our forebears did; * we have done wrong and dealt wickedly.
- 7 In Egypt they did not consider your marvelous works, nor remember the abundance of your love; * they defied you, O Most High, at the Red Sea.
- 8 But you saved them for your Name's sake, * to make your power known.
- 9 You rebuked the Red Sea, and it dried up, * and you led them through the deep as through a desert.
- 10 You saved them from the hand of those who hated them * and redeemed them from the hand of the enemy.
- 11 The waters covered their oppressors; * not one of them was left.
- 12 Then they believed your words * and sang you songs of praise.
- 13 But they soon forgot your deeds * and did not wait for your counsel.
- 14 A craving seized them in the wilderness, * and they put you to the test in the desert.
- 15 You gave them what they asked, * but sent leanness into their soul.
- 16 They envied Moses in the camp, * and Aaron, the holy one of God.
- 17 The earth opened and swallowed Dathan * and covered the company of Abiram.
- 18 Fire blazed up against their company, * and flames devoured the wicked.
- 19 Israel made a bull-calf at Horeb * and worshiped a molten image;
- 20 And so they exchanged their Glory * for the image of an ox that feeds on grass.
- 21 They forgot you, their Savior, * who had done great things in Egypt,

22 Wonderful deeds in the land of Ham, * and fearful things at the Red Sea.

23 So you would have destroyed them, had not Moses your chosen stood before you in the breach, * to turn away your wrath from consuming them.

24 They refused the pleasant land * and would not believe your promise.

25 They grumbled in their tents * and would not listen to your voice, O God.

- 26 So you lifted your hand against them, * to overthrow them in the wilderness,
- 27 To cast out their seed among the nations, * and to scatter them throughout the lands.
- 28 They joined themselves to Baal-Peor * and ate sacrifices offered to the dead.

29 They provoked you to anger with their actions, * and a plague broke out among them.

- 30 Then Phinehas stood up and interceded, * and the plague came to an end.
- 31 This was reckoned to him as righteousness * throughout all generations for ever.

32 Again they provoked your anger at the waters of Meribah, * so that you punished Moses because of them;

33 For they so embittered his spirit * that he spoke rash words with his lips.

34 They did not destroy the peoples * as you had commanded them.

35 They intermingled with the nations * and learned their foreign ways,

- 36 So that they worshiped their idols, * which became a snare to them.
- 37 They sacrificed their sons * and their daughters to evil spirits.

38 They shed innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daughters, * which they offered to the idols of Canaan, and the land was defiled with blood.

39 Thus they were polluted by their actions * and went whoring in their evil deeds.

40 Therefore your wrath was kindled against your people * and you abhorred your inheritance.

41 You gave them over to the hand of the nations, * and those who hated them ruled over them.

- 42 Their enemies oppressed them, * and they were humbled under their hand.
- 43 Many a time did you deliver them, but they rebelled through their own devices, * and were brought down in their iniquity.

44 Nevertheless, you saw their distress, * when you heard their lamentation.

45 You remembered your covenant with them * and relented in accordance with your great mercy.

- 46 You caused them to be pitied * by those who held them captive.
- 47 Save us, O God, and gather us from among the nations, * that we may give thanks to your holy Name and glory in your praise.
- 48 Blest be the God of Israel,from everlasting and to everlasting, *and let all the people say, "Amen!" Alleluia!

Twenty-second Day: Morning Prayer **Psalm 107**

- 1 We give you thanks, O God, for you are good; * your mercy endures for ever.
- 2 Let all those whom you have redeemed proclaim * that you redeemed them from the hand of the foe.
- 3 You gathered them out of the lands; * from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.
- 4 Some wandered in desert wastes; * they found no way to a city where they might dwell.
- 5 They were hungry and thirsty; * their spirits languished within them.
- 6 Then they cried to you in their trouble, * and you delivered them from their distress.
- 7 You put their feet on a straight path * to go to a city where they might dwell.
- 8 Let them give thanks to you for your mercy * and the wonders you do for your children.
- 9 For you satisfy the thirsty * and fill the hungry with good things.

10 Some sat in darkness and deep gloom, * bound fast in misery and iron;

11 Because they rebelled against your words, O God, * and despised your counsel, O Most High.

12 So you humbled their spirits with hard labor; * they stumbled, and there was none to help.

- 13 Then they cried to you in their trouble, * and you delivered them from their distress.
- 14 You led them out of darkness and deep gloom * and broke their bonds asunder.
- 15 Let them give thanks to you for your mercy * and the wonders you do for your children.
- 16 For you shatter the doors of bronze * and break in two the iron bars.

17 Some were fools and took to rebellious ways; * they were afflicted because of their sins.

- 18 They abhorred all manner of food * and drew near to death's door.
- 19 Then they cried to you in their trouble, * and you delivered them from their distress.
- 20 You sent forth your word and healed them * and saved them from the grave.

- 21 Let them give thanks to you for your mercy * and the wonders you do for your children.
- 22 Let them offer a sacrifice of thanksgiving * and tell of your acts with shouts of joy.
- 23 Some went down to the sea in ships * and plied their trade in deep waters;
- 24 They beheld your works, O God, * and your wonders in the deep.
- 25 Then you spoke, and a stormy wind arose, * which tossed high the waves of the sea.
- 26 They mounted up to the heavens and fell back to the depths; * their hearts melted because of their peril.
- 27 They reeled and staggered like drunkards * and were at their wits' end.
- 28 Then they cried to you in their trouble, * and you delivered them from their distress.
- 29 You stilled the storm to a whisper * and quieted the waves of the sea.
- 30 Then were they glad because of the calm, * and you brought them to the harbor they were bound for.
- 31 Let them give thanks to you for your mercy * and the wonders you do for your children.
- 32 Let them exalt you in the congregation of the people * and praise you in the council of the elders.
- 33 You changed rivers into deserts, * and water-springs into thirsty ground,
- 34 A fruitful land into salt flats, * because of the wickedness of those who dwell there.
- 35 You changed deserts into pools of water * and dry land into water-springs.
- 36 You settled the hungry there, * and they founded a city to dwell in.
- 37 They sowed fields, and planted vineyards, * and brought in a fruitful harvest.
- 38 You blessed them, so that they increased greatly; * you did not let their herds decrease.
- 39 Yet when they were diminished and brought low, * through stress of adversity and sorrow,
- 40 (You pour contempt on rulers * and make them wander in trackless wastes)
- 41 You lifted up the poor out of misery * and multiplied their families like flocks of sheep.
- 42 The upright will see this and rejoice, * but all wickedness will shut its mouth.
- 43 Whoever is wise will ponder these things, * and consider well your mercies, O God.

Twenty-second Day: Evening Prayer **Psalm 108**

- 1 My heart is firmly fixed, O God, my heart is fixed; * I will sing and make melody.
- 2 Wake up, my spirit;

awake, lute and harp; *

I myself will waken the dawn.

- 3 I will confess you among the peoples, O God; * I will sing praises to you among the nations.
- 4 For your loving-kindness is greater than the heavens, * and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
- 5 Exalt yourself above the heavens, O God, * and your glory over all the earth.
- 6 So that those who are dear to you may be delivered, * save with your right hand and answer me.
- God spoke from the holy place and said: *
 "I will exult and parcel out Shechem; I will divide the valley of Succoth.
- 8 Gilead is mine and Manasseh is mine; * Ephraim is my helmet and Judah my scepter.
- 9 Moab is my wash-basin; on Edom I throw down my sandal to claim it, * and over Philistia will I shout in triumph."
- 10 Who will lead me into the strong city; * who will bring me into Edom?
- 11 Have you not cast us off, O God? * You no longer go out, O God, with our armies.
- 12 Grant us your help against the enemy, * for all human help is in vain.
- 13 With you, O God, we will do valiant deeds, * and you will tread our enemies under foot.

- Hold not your tongue, O God of my praise, * for the mouth of the wicked, the mouth of the deceitful, is opened against me.
- 2 They speak to me with a lying tongue; * they encompass me with hateful words and fight against me without a cause.
- 3 Despite my love, they accuse me, * but as for me, I pray for them.
- 4 They repay evil for good * and hatred for my love.
- 5 Set wicked ones against them, * and let accusers stand at their right hand.
- 6 When they are judged, let them be found guilty, * and let their appeals be in vain.
- 7 Let their days be few, * and let others take their office.
- 8 Let their children be fatherless, * and their wives become widows.
- 9 Let their children be waifs and beggars; * let them be driven from the ruins of their homes.
- 10 Let the creditor seize everything they have; * let strangers plunder their gains.
- 11 Let there be no one to show them kindness, * and none to pity their fatherless children.

12 Let their descendants be destroyed, * and their names be blotted out in the next generation. 13 Let the wickedness of their parents be remembered before God, * and their forebears' sin not be blotted out; 14 Let their sin be always before God, * but let God root out their names from the earth; 15 Because they did not remember to show mercy, * but persecuted the poor and needy and sought to kill the brokenhearted. 16 They loved cursing, let it come upon them; * they took no delight in blessing, let it depart from them. 17 They put on cursing like a garment; * let it soak into their bodies like water and into their bones like oil; 18 Let it be to them like the cloak which they wrap around themselves * and like the belt that they wear continually. 19 Let this be the recompense from God to my accusers * and to those who speak evil against me. 20 But you, O God, my God, oh, deal with me according to your Name; * for your tender mercy's sake, deliver me. 21 For I am poor and needy, * and my heart is wounded within me. 22 I have faded away like a shadow when it lengthens; * I am shaken off like a locust. 23 My knees are weak through fasting, * and my flesh is wasted and gaunt. 24 I have become a reproach to them; * they see and shake their heads. 25 Help me, O God, my God; * save me for your mercy's sake. 26 Let them know that this is your hand, * that you, O God, have done it. 27 They may curse, but you will bless; * let those who rise up against me be put to shame, and your servant will rejoice. 28 Let my accusers be clothed with disgrace * and wrap themselves in their shame as in a cloak. 29 I will give great thanks to you with my mouth; * in the midst of the multitude will I praise you, 30 Because you stand at the right hand of the needy, * to save their lives from those who would condemn them. Twenty-third Day: Morning Prayer Psalm 110

- 1 The Holy One said to my Ruler, "Sit at my right hand, * until I make your enemies your footstool."
- 2 The Holy One will send the scepter of your power out of Zion, * saying, "Rule over your enemies round about you.

- 6 Will heap high the corpses * and will smash heads over the wide earth.
- 7 The Ruler will drink from the brook beside the road * and therefore will stand victorious.

- 1 Alleluia! I will give thanks to you, O God, with my whole heart, * in the assembly of the upright, in the congregation.
- 2 Great are your deeds, O God; * they are studied by all who delight in them.
- 3 Your work is full of majesty and splendor, * and your righteousness endures for ever.
- 4 You make your marvelous works to be remembered; * you are gracious and full of compassion.
- 5 You give food to those who fear you; * you are ever mindful of your covenant.
- 6 You have shown your people the power of your works * in giving them the lands of the nations.
- 7 The works of your hands are faithfulness and justice; * all your commandments are sure.
- 8 They stand fast for ever and ever, * because they are done in truth and equity.
- 9 You sent redemption to your people; you commanded your covenant for ever; * holy and awesome is your Name.
- 10 The fear of God is the beginning of wisdom; * those who act accordingly have a good understanding; God's praise endures for ever.

- Alleluia! Happy are they who fear God, *

 and have great delight in the commandments!
- 2 Their descendants will be mighty in the land; * the generation of the upright will be blest.
- 3 Wealth and riches will be in their house, * and their righteousness will last for ever.
- 4 Light shines in the darkness for the upright; * the righteous are merciful and full of compassion.
- 5 It is good for them to be generous in lending * and to manage their affairs with justice.
- 6 For they will never be shaken; * the righteous will be kept in everlasting remembrance.
- 7 They will not be afraid of any evil rumors; * their heart is right; they put their trust in God.

- 8 Their heart is established and will not shrink, * until they see their desire upon their enemies.
- 9 They have given freely to the poor, * and their righteousness stands fast for ever; they will hold up their head with honor.
- 10 The wicked will see it and be angry; they will gnash their teeth and pine away; * the desires of the wicked will perish.

- 1 Alleluia! Give praise, you servants of God; * praise the Name of the Most High.
- 2 Let God's Name be blest, * from this time forth for evermore.
- 3 From the rising of the sun to its going down, * let God's holy Name be praised.
- 4 God is high above all nations, * and God's glory above the heavens.
- 5 Who is like our God, who sits enthroned on high, * but stoops to behold the heavens and the earth?
- 6 God takes up the weak out of the dust * and lifts up the poor from the ashes,
- 7 To set them up on high, * with the rulers of the people.
- 8 God makes the woman of a childless house * to be a joyful mother of children.

Twenty-third Day: Evening Prayer

Psalm 114

- 1 Alleluia! When Israel came out of Egypt, * the house of Jacob from a people of strange speech,
- 2 Judah became God's sanctuary * and Israel God's dominion.
- 3 The sea beheld it and fled; * Jordan turned and went back.
- 4 The mountains skipped like rams, * and the little hills like young sheep.

9 O Israel, trust in God, * who is their help and their shield.

10 O house of Aaron, trust in God, * who is their help and their shield.

11 You who fear God, trust in God, * who is their help and their shield.

12 God has been mindful of us and will bless us; * God will bless the house of Israel and will bless the house of Aaron;

13 God will bless those who stand in awe, * both small and great together.

14 May God increase you more and more, * you and your children after you.

- 2 Let my prayer be set forth in your sight as incense, * the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.
- 3 Set a watch before my mouth, O God, and guard the door of my lips; * let not my heart incline to any evil thing.
- 4 Let me not be occupied in wickedness with evildoers, * nor eat of their choice foods.
- Let the righteous smite me in friendly rebuke;
 let not the oil of the unrighteous anoint my head, *
 for my prayer is continually against their wicked deeds.

- 6 Let their rulers be overthrown in stony places, * that they may know my words are true.
- 7 As when a ploughshare turns over the earth in furrows, * let their bones be scattered at the mouth of the grave.
- 8 But my eyes are turned to you, O God; * in you I take refuge; do not strip me of my life.
- 9 Protect me from the snare which they have laid for me * and from the traps of the evildoers.
- 10 Let the wicked fall into their own nets, * while I myself escape.

- 1 I cry to you, O God, with my voice; * to you I make loud supplication.
- 2 I pour out my complaint before you * and tell you all my trouble.
- 3 When my spirit languishes within me, you know my path; * in the way wherein I walk they have hidden a trap for me.
- 4 I look to my right hand and find no one who knows me; * I have no place to flee to, and no one cares for me.
- 5 I cry out to you, O God; *I say, "You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living."
- 6 Listen to my cry for help, for I have been brought very low; * save me from those who pursue me, for they are too strong for me.
- 7 Bring me out of prison, that I may give thanks to your Name; * when you have dealt bountifully with me, the righteous will gather around me.

- 1 O God, hear my prayer, and in your faithfulness heed my supplications; * answer me in your righteousness.
- 2 Enter not into judgment with your servant, * for in your sight shall no one living be justified.
- 3 For my enemy has sought my life, has crushed me to the ground, * and has made me live in dark places like those who are long dead.
- 4 My spirit faints within me; * my heart within me is desolate.
- 5 I remember the time past;I muse upon all your deeds; *I consider the works of your hands.
- 6 I spread out my hands to you; * my soul gasps to you like a thirsty land.
- 7 O God, make haste to answer me; my spirit fails me; * do not hide your face from me or I shall be like those who go down to the Pit.
- 8 Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning,

for I put my trust in you; * show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you.

- 9 Deliver me from my enemies, O God, * for I flee to you for refuge.
- 10 Teach me to do what pleases you, for you are my God; * let your good Spirit lead me on level ground.
- 11 Revive me, O God, for your Name's sake; * for your righteousness' sake, bring me out of trouble.
- 12 Of your goodness, destroy my enemies and bring all my foes to naught, * for truly I am your servant.

Thirtieth Day: Morning Prayer

Psalm 144

- Blessed be my God, my rock, *

 who trains my hands to fight and my fingers to battle;

 My help and my fortress, my stronghold and my deliverer, *
 my shield in whom I trust,
 - who subdues the peoples under me.
- 3 O God, what are we that you should care for us, * mere mortals that you should think of us?
- 4 We are like a puff of wind; * our days are like a passing shadow.
- 5 Bow your heavens, O God, and come down; * touch the mountains, and they shall smoke.
- 6 Hurl the lightning and scatter them; * shoot out your arrows and rout them.
- 7 Stretch out your hand from on high; * rescue me and deliver me from the great waters, from the hand of foreign peoples,
- 8 Whose mouths speak deceitfully * and whose right hand is raised in falsehood.
- 9 O God, I will sing to you a new song; * I will play to you on a ten-stringed lyre.
- 10 You give victory to rulers * and have rescued David your servant.
- 11 Rescue me from the hurtful sword * and deliver me from the hand of foreign peoples,
- 12 Whose mouths speak deceitfully * and whose right hand is raised in falsehood.
- 13 May our sons be like plants well nurtured from their youth, * and our daughters like sculptured corners of a palace.
- 14 May our barns be filled to overflowing with all manner of crops; * may the flocks in our pastures increase by thousands and tens of thousands; may our cattle be fat and sleek.
- 15 May there be no breaching of the walls, no going into exile, * no wailing in the public squares.
- 16 Happy are the people of whom this is so; * happy are the people who worship God!

- 1 I will exalt you, O holy God, * and bless your Name for ever and ever.
- 2 Every day will I bless you * and praise your Name for ever and ever.
- 3 Great are you, O God, and greatly to be praised; * there is no end to your greatness.
- 4 One generation shall praise your works to another * and shall declare your power.
- 5 I will ponder the glorious splendor of your majesty * and all your marvelous works.
- 6 They shall speak of the might of your wondrous acts, * and I will tell of your greatness.
- 7 They shall publish the remembrance of your great goodness; * they shall sing of your righteous deeds.
- 8 You are gracious and full of compassion, * slow to anger and of great kindness.
- 9 You are loving to everyone, * and your compassion is over all your works.
- 10 All your works praise you, O God, * and your faithful servants bless you.
- 11 They make known the glory of your realm * and speak of your power,
- 12 That the peoples may know of your power * and the glorious splendor of your dominion.
- 13 Yours, O God, is an everlasting reign; * your dominion endures throughout all ages.
- 14 You are faithful in all your words * and merciful in all your deeds.
- 15 You uphold all those who fall; * you lift up those who are bowed down.
- 16 The eyes of all wait upon you, O God, * and you give them their food in due season.
- 17 You open wide your hand * and satisfy the needs of every living creature.
- 18 You are righteous in all your ways * and loving in all your works.
- 19 You are near to those who call upon you, * to all who call upon you faithfully.
- 20 You fulfill the desire of those who fear you; * you hear their cry and help them.
- 21 You preserve all those who love you, * but you destroy all the wicked.
- 22 My mouth shall speak your praise, O God; * let all flesh bless your holy Name for ever and ever.

- Alleluia! Praise God, O my soul! *
 I will praise God as long as I live;
 I will sing praises to my God while I have my being.
- 2 Put not your trust in rulers, nor in any child of earth, * for there is no help in them.
- 3 When they breathe their last, they return to earth, * and in that day their thoughts perish.

- 4 Happy are they who have the God of Jacob for their help, * whose hope is in their God;
- 5 Who made heaven and earth, the seas, and all that is in them; * whose promise abides for ever;
- 6 Who gives justice to those who are oppressed * and food to those who hunger.
- 7 God sets the prisoners free and opens the eyes of the blind; * God lifts up those who are bowed down;
- 8 God loves the righteous and cares for the stranger; * God sustains the orphan and widow, but frustrates the way of the wicked.
- 9 God shall reign for ever, * your God, O Zion, throughout all generations. Alleluia!

Thirtieth Day: Evening Prayer

- 1 Alleluia! How good it is to sing praises to you, O God; * how pleasant it is to honor you with praise!
- 2 For you rebuild Jerusalem * and gather the exiles of Israel.
- 3 You heal the brokenhearted * and bind up their wounds.
- 4 You count the number of the stars * and call them all by their names.
- 5 Great are you and mighty in power; * there is no limit to your wisdom.
- 6 You lift up the lowly, * but cast the wicked to the ground.
- 7 We sing to you, Most High, with thanksgiving; * we make music to you upon the harp,
- 8 For you cover the heavens with clouds * and prepare rain for the earth;
- 9 You make grass to grow upon the mountains * and green plants to serve humankind.
- 10 You provide food for flocks and herds * and for the young ravens when they cry.
- 11 You are not impressed by the might of a horse; * you have no pleasure in human strength;
- 12 But you have pleasure in those who fear you, * in those who await your gracious favor.
- 13 Worship God, O Jerusalem; * praise your Sovereign, O Zion;
- 14 For the Holy One has strengthened the bars of your gates * and has blessed your children within you.
- 15 Peace has been established on your borders; * you are satisfied with the finest wheat.
- 16 You send out your command to the earth, * and your word runs very swiftly.
- 17 You give snow like wool * and scatter hoarfrost like ashes.

- 18 You scatter your hail like bread crumbs; * who can stand against your cold?
- 19 You send forth your word and melt them; * you blow with your wind and the waters flow.
- 20 You declare your word to Jacob, * your statutes and your judgments to Israel.
- 21 You have not done so to any other nation; * to them you have not revealed your judgments. Alleluia!

- 1 Alleluia! Praise God from the heavens; * sing praise in the heights.
- 2 Praise God, all you angels; * sing praise, all the heavenly host.
- 3 Praise God, sun and moon; * sing praise, all you shining stars.
- 4 Praise God, heaven of heavens * and you waters above the heavens.
- 5 Let them praise the Name of God, * by whose command they were created.
- 6 God made them stand fast for ever and ever, * and gave them a law which shall not pass away.
- 7 Praise God from the earth, * you sea-monsters and all deeps;
- 8 Fire and hail, snow and fog, * tempestuous wind, doing God's will;
- 9 Mountains and all hills, * fruit trees and all cedars;
- 10 Wild beasts and all cattle, * creeping things and winged birds;
- 11 Sovereigns of the earth and all peoples, * leaders and all rulers of the world;
- 12 Young men and maidens, * old and young together.
- 13 Let them praise your Name, O God, * for your Name only is exalted; your splendor is over earth and heaven.
- 14 You have raised up strength for your people and praise for all your loyal servants, * the children of Israel, a people who are near you. Alleluia!

- 1 Alleluia! Sing to God a new song; * sing praise in the congregation of the faithful.
- 2 Let the people of Israel rejoice in their Maker; * let the children of Zion be joyful in their Monarch.
- 3 Let them praise God's Name in the dance; * let them sing praise with timbrel and harp.
- 4 For God takes pleasure in the people * and adorns the poor with victory.
- 5 Let the faithful rejoice in triumph; * let them be joyful on their beds.

- 6 Let the praises of God be in their throat * and a two-edged sword in their hand,
- 7 To wreak vengeance on the nations * and punishment on the peoples;
- 8 To bind their rulers in chains * and their nobles with links of iron;
- 9 To inflict on them the judgment decreed; * this is glory for all God's faithful people. Alleluia!

- 1 Alleluia! Praise God in the holy temple; * praise God in the firmament of power.
- 2 Praise God for every mighty act; * praise God's excellent greatness.
- 3 Praise God with the blast of the ram's-horn; * praise God with lyre and harp.
- 4 Praise God with timbrel and dance; * praise God with strings and pipe.
- 5 Praise God with resounding cymbals; * praise God with loud-clanging cymbals.
- 6 Let everything that has breath * praise God. Alleluia!
