FOREWORD

The Anglican Church of Canada will be grateful to the Archbishop of British Columbia for producing this Canadian Book of Occasional Offices. It bears the mark of his careful work, his liturgical skill, and his feeling for the English language.

Books like this have appeared in sister Churches of our Anglican Communion, and in individual dioceses in England and elsewhere. Excellent as some of these books are, they have had no Canadian authorization, and do not always meet Canadian needs.

For that reason, the Canadian House of Bishops welcomed the suggestion that the Archbishop of British Columbia should undertake this task.

May I, on behalf of the House of Bishops, commend this book to our Church. My hope is that in every diocese the Ordinary will authorize its use.

PREFACE

Although the Revised Prayer Book of the Anglican Church of Canada has made more generous provision for occasional services than any other Prayer Book in the Anglican Communion, the need of a Manual of Occasional Offices has been keenly felt for some time, and, at the request of the House of Bishops, I have had the privilege of compiling it. I have included a number of prayers for special occasions, and have also added a Collect, Epistle, and Gospel for each of the Black Letter days.

It will be noted that prayers from other books, and service leaflets, have been borrowed or adapted, and I wish to express my indebtedness to the Bishop of Chelmsford for permission "to draw on the Chelmsford book as much as you wish." Indeed, the Occasional Services Book of that diocese has been the background against which many of the services in this book have been compiled.

I also express my thanks and indebtedness to the Church Pension Fund of the Episcopal Church in the United States for permission to make use of the Book of Offices, which was compiled by the Standing Liturgical Commission, and is copyrighted by the Church Pension Fund.

I am also most grateful to the late Dr. Oscar Hardman for his kind permission to make full use of his well-known work, "A Prayer Book for 1949".

Two of the services included in this book have recently been approved by the House of Bishops, viz. The Making or Admission of Deaconesses, and the Reception of members from other Churches.

Whilst the language of this book falls far short of that in

our incomparable Book of Common Prayer, it has been my aim to keep as closely as possible to it. However, in contrast with the Prayer Book, there has been an overmuch use of capital letters, which I trust will not be regarded as a serious defect. It seems to be a frequent characteristic of books of this kind.

If I have inadvertently infringed any copyright, I express my regret and tender my apologies to the author concerned.

That this Manual may be a real help to the Bishops and Clergy of our Canadian Church is the earnest prayer of the Compiler.

THE DEDICATION OF A CHURCH OR CHAPEL

The Bishop, attended by his Chaplains, shall be received outside the principal entrance to the Church by the Incumbent, accompanied by the Churchwardens. The Incumbent will say:

REVEREND Father in God, we pray you to dedicate this Church.

The Bishop

I am ready to proceed to the Dedication.

The principal door being opened, the Bishop shall enter and say:

Peace be to this house from God our heavenly Father.

Peace be to this house from his Son Who is our Peace.

Peace be to this house from the Holy Spirit the Comforter.

Enter, O Lord, this house, we beseech Thee, and within the hearts of Thy faithful people establish for Thyself an everlasting habitation: that this Church which is built to Thy Glory may be glorified also by Thine abiding Presence; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O GOD, Who hallowest the places that Thou hast chosen to set Thy Name there, pour down Thy grace upon this House of Prayer, that all who here shall call upon Thy Name may have full assurance of Thy merciful aid; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

After which the Bishop, accompanied by the Clergy, shall go to the Chancel, while the congregation sings Psalm 122, or an appropriate hymn.

The Bishop shall then address the congregation as follows:

DEARLY beloved in the Lord, forasmuch as devout and holy men, as well under the Law as under the Gospel, moved either by the secret inspiration of the Holy Spirit or by express command of God, have erected houses for the public worship of God, in order to fill men's minds with greater reverence for His glorious majesty, and to affect their hearts with more devotion and humility in His service; which pious works have been approved and graciously accepted by our heavenly Father: let us not doubt that He will also graciously approve our godly purpose of setting apart this place to the performance of the several offices of religious worship: and let us faithfully and devoutly beg His blessing on this our undertaking, keeping silence for a space.

The Congregation kneeling, then shall be sung Veni Creator (Hymn 480) or Hymn 479.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Christ, have mercy upon us.

OUR FATHER Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

- R Who hath made heaven and earth.

Let this house stand firm, and make it a shrine of Thine indwelling glory, so that the prayers of Thy faithful people here offered unto Thee may be joined to the service and worship of Heaven, through Thine unspeakable goodness: for Thou, Lord, art holy, and dwellest in the holy place, and to Thee we offer up our praises and thanksgivings.

Father, Son and Holy Ghost For ever and ever. Amen.

BLESSED by Thy name, O Lord God, that it hath pleased Thee, by Thy good Spirit, to put into the hearts of Thy servants the desire to erect this house to Thy honour and worship. Bless, O Lord, them, their families and substance, and accept the work of their hands; and grant, we beseech Thee, that all who shall enjoy the benefit of this pious work may shew forth their thankfulness by making a right use thereof, to the glory of Thy blessed name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then shall follow the Prayer of Dedication of the Building, the Bishop first turning to the people and saying:

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up unto the Lord. Answer: The Bishop: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

It is meet and right so to do. Answer:

The Bishop:

It is very meet, right and our bounden duty, that we should at all times and in all places, give thanks unto Thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God.

For that Thou, according to Thy most true promise by Jesus our Lord, art present in our prayers and Holy Rites and in all services of these Thy servants.

Let Thy Holy Spirit descend with the fulness of sevenfold grace in the Dedication which we, Thy unworthy servants now make.

To the Glory of Thy Holy Name.

In honour of————

And in special remembrance of the most glorious Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has vouchsafed to redeem us upon the Holy Cross.

That, whensoever Thy Holy Name is invoked within these walls; the prayers of those who call upon Thee may be heard by Thee, O Lord, merciful and gracious.

- O Blessed Majesty of God, filling, containing and ordering the whole world;
- O Holy King of saints, Builder, Upholder and Defender of the Universal Church;
- O Blessed and Holy Trinity, Who dost give purity, strength and beauty to that which Thou hast created; we humbly beseech Thee of Thy mercy that Thou wouldest

their trials, and a refuge in their distress; and here let Thy holy name be for ever worshipped and adored; through Thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

NOW unto the King Eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be all glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Then shall follow a hymn or anthem.

THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS

Then shall be sung a hymn, during which the offerings of the congregation may be received. Before the Blessing the Bishop shall say:

Let us pray

O LORD Jesus Christ, in Whose most blessed name this house of prayer is built and sanctified; grant, we beseech Thee, that, as we have prepared this place for the manifestation of Thy love, so we may also be built up a spiritual house for the offering of service acceptable unto Thee, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY GOD, Who hast built Thy Church upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ Himself being the head cornerstone: Grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their doctrine, that we may be made an holy temple acceptable unto Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE REOPENING OF A CHURCH AFTER RESTORATION

The principal door being opened, the Bishop, standing within the entrance shall say:

Peace be to this House from God, our heavenly Father.

Peace be to this House from his Son, Who is our Peace.

Peace be to this House from the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.

Then the Bishop shall enter the Church and say (the people still standing):

Let us pray.

WE ARE NOT worthy, O Lord, to enter into Thy presence, for Thou art of purer eyes than to behold evil. But Thou, Lord, art merciful and full of compassion. Grant that Thine eyes may be upon us continually as we enter into this Thy house, and that all our thoughts and words may be hallowed by Thy presence. Let Thy holy angels be with us and about us, and Thy Holy Spirit within us, that in all our ways we may glorify Thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Here shall a hymn or psalm be sung, whilst the Bishop and Clergy proceed to the Chancel.

Then shall the Bishop, standing at the Holy Table, turn to the people and say:

DEARLY DELOVED in the Lord, let us render humble and hearty thanks to Almighty God for His goodness in prospering the work of the restoration of this Church, and implore the continuance of His favour and blessing upon it.

- V I will magnify Thee, O God my King: I will praise Thy Name for ever and ever.
- R I will magnify Thee, O God my King: I will praise Thy Name for ever and ever.
- V Every day will I give thanks unto Thee: and praise Thy Name for ever and ever.
- R I will praise Thy Name for ever and ever.
- V Glory be to the Father, and to the Son: and to the Holy Ghost.
- R I will magnify Thee, O God my King: I will praise Thy Name for ever and ever.

Then shall the General Thanksgiving be said by all.

ALMIGHTY GOD, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness and loving-kindness to us and to all men. We bless Thee for our creation, preservation, and all the blessings of this life; but above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by our Lord Jesus Christ, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory. And

we beseech Thee, give us that due sense of all Thy mercies, that our hearts may be unfeignedly thankful, and that we shew forth Thy praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives; by giving up ourselves to Thy service, and by walking before Thee in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to Whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

After which shall be sung a hymn: (478 or 479 are suggested)

Then the Bishop, standing before the Holy Table, shall say (all kneeling):

Let us pray.

O LORD Jesus Christ, Who in the days of Thy flesh didst honour the feast of the dedication by Thy presence: Be present with us now, and, because holiness becometh Thine house for ever, sanctify us, we beseech Thee, that we may be living temples, holy and acceptable unto Thee, and grant that we may be devoutly given to serve Thee in all good works; who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

O GOD, the Sanctifier of all things, Whose loving kindness never faileth, Who rulest both in Heaven and in earth, keeping mercy for Thy people who walk before the Presence of Thy Glory: graciously vouchsafe, we beseech Thee, to hallow this building set apart for Thy Holy Mysteries; mercifully illumine and brighten it with Thine own Glory and pour down Thy Blessing upon it, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

BLESSED be Thy Name, O Lord, that it hath pleased Thee to put into the hearts of Thy servants the desire to restore and adorn this House for Thy honour and glory, and for the ministry of Thy Word and Sacraments. Remember them, O Lord, for good, and grant that all who shall enjoy the benefit of this pious work may show forth their thankfulness to Thee by making a right use of the same; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

In the case of a Memorial the following Collect may be used:

O GOD of the spirits of all flesh, we praise and magnify Thy holy Name for all Thy servants who have finished their course in Thy faith and fear (especially for Thy servant ————); and we beseech Thee that, encouraged by their examples and strengthened by their fellowship, we also may be found meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light; through the merits of Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, Who dost govern all things in heaven and earth; Mercifully hear the supplications of us Thy servants, and grant all

things that are needful for the welfare of this parish. Strengthen and confirm the faithful; protect and guide the children; visit and relieve the sick; turn and soften the wicked; rouse the careless; recover the fallen; restore the penitent; remove all hindrances to the advancement of Thy truth; and bring all to be of one heart and mind within the fold of Thy holy Church, to the honour and glory of Thy blessed Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, by Whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: Receive our supplications and prayers, which we offer before Thee for all estates of men in Thy holy Church, that every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve Thee; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Only in the most exceptional circumstances shall a Church be deconsecrated.

Upon the appointed day, the Bishop, the Clergy, Churchwardens and other parishioners, being assembled within the Building, a statement shall be made by the Bishop (or his deputy) giving the reasons for which the Church Building shall be no longer continued as a consecrated place of worship.

The Altar (or Holy Table) having been carefully removed, and protected from desecration, the Deed of Deconsecration shall be read by the Bishop (or his deputy), as follows:

IN THE NAME of God. Amen.

Let us pray.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Christ, have mercy upon us.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

OUR FATHER Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name, Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

O LORD God, who in Thy great goodness didst accept as a dwelling place for Thine honour this building now to be ——: Receive, we pray Thee,

our praises and thanksgivings for the blessings, help, and comfort which Thou hast bestowed upon Thy people through the ministrations in this place. Grant that they may never pass from the hearts and lives of those who have received them. Continue in greater measure, we beseech Thee, Thy manifold mercies in the Church to be erected in Thy name and to Thy glory, that we may be ever conscious of Thy unchanging love. Hear this our prayer, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

ASSIST US mercifully, O Lord, in these our supplications and prayers, and dispose the way of Thy servants towards the attainment of everlasting salvation; that, among all the changes and chances of this mortal life, they may ever be defended by Thy most gracious and ready help; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. Amen.

THE LAYING OF THE FOUNDATION STONE OF A PARISH HALL

When all are in their appointed place, the Officiant shall say:

IN THE NAME of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Let us pray.

Lord, have mercy upon us. Christ, have mercy upon us. Lord, have mercy upon us.

OUR FATHER, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. Amen.

- V Prosper Thou the work of our hands, O Lord:
- R O prosper Thou our handy-work.
- V Our help is in the name of the Lord:
- R Who hath made heaven and earth.
- V O Lord, hear our prayer:
- R And let our cry come unto Thee.

GUIDE and prosper us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun,

continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Officiant, laying his hand on the Stone, shall say:

O LORD Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, Who art the brightness of the Father's glory, and the express image of His Person, the one foundation, and the chief corner-stone: Bless the laying of this Stone in Thy name, and be Thou, we beseech Thee, the beginning, the increase, and the consummation of this work, which is undertaken to Thy glory, who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Then, all things being made ready, the Stone shall be laid by the person appointed thereto, with these words:

IN THE FAITH of Jesus Christ we place this Stone. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Here a hymn may be sung.

After which the following prayers shall

be said:

Let us pray.

O FATHER of lights, from Whom all good things do come, and through Whose bounty we are able to offer to Thee of Thine own: Accept, we beseech Thee, the offering of this building, which we have begun in Thy name, and grant that whatsoever shall be done here may be for Thy glory, and the good of Thy people both in body and soul; through Jesus Christ, Thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

O GOD, who hast united us at this time in a common effort: Grant that we may so live and work together at all times in brotherly love, that we may promote Thy glory and the advancement of Thy kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY God, who hast built Thy Church upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the head corner-stone: Grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their doctrine, that we may be made an holy temple acceptable unto Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE BLESSING of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be upon you and upon this work begun in his name, now and for evermore. Amen.

THE DEDICATION OF A PARISH HALL

Priest:

REVEREND Father in God, we pray you to dedicate this building to the glory of God and for the extension of His Kingdom in this community.

Bishop:

I am ready to proceed to the Dedication. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

V Our help is in the name of the Lord.

R Who hath made heaven and earth.

Let us pray.

O LORD our God, giver of life and light, we bless Thee, that of Thy gracious goodness, Thou didst put into the hearts and minds of Thy servants, the desire and will to erect this Parish Hall. Use it, we beseech Thee, to open our eyes, still wider, to the needs of men for the Gospel of Christ, and to the opportunities that lie before us in this parish to extend His Kingdom. Stir up, O Lord, the wills of Thy people to continue to share in this work with gladness of heart and self-sacrificing spirit. Let not our purpose slacken, but let the kingdom of this world become the Kingdom of our God and of His Christ. Amen.

O FATHER of lights, from whom cometh down every good and perfect gift, and through Whom alone it is that we can offer to Thee of Thine own, accept the offering now humbly made of this building for good, pious and charitable uses, that whatsoever is done here may be for Thy glory and the good of Thy people, both in body and soul; through Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. Amen.

V Behold how good and joyful a thing it is:

R For brethren to dwell together in unity.

O LORD Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, Who art the head Corner-Stone of Thy Church; Bless this Building which is now completed in Thy Name, and grant that it may tend to promote Thy glory, and the welfare of Thy people in this place. Fill those who shall frequent it with the spirit of love towards Thee, and towards all men. Within these walls may harsh thoughts be subdued, and unkind words unspoken, and may those who here shall learn the way of Thy statutes, walk before Thee with perfect heart, and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life; Who with the Father and the Holy Ghost ever livest one God, world without end. Amen.

Then, if conditions so permit, the Bishop, Clergy and people shall walk round the portion of ground which is to be consecrated, saying or singing Psalms 23, 39, 90, 103, or any of them. Returning to the Church porch, or other convenient place the Bishop shall say:

The glorious majesty of the Lord our God be upon us: prosper Thou the work of our hands upon us, O prosper Thou our handiwork.

Then shall the Bishop, or some Clergyman appointed by him, read one of the Lessons following: St. John 5: 21-29, or 1 Thessalonians 4: 13 to end. The Sentence of Consecration according to the form below shall then be signed by the Bishop and read aloud by him or someone appointed by him, and the same shall be ordered to be recorded in the Registry of the Diocese.

THE Almighty Lord, who is a most strong tower to all them that put their trust in Him, to Whom all things, in heaven, in earth, and under the earth, do

bow and obey, be now and evermore your defence: and make you know and feel that there is none other name under heaven given to man, in whom, and through whom, you may receive health and salvation, but only the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

MAY the blessing of the most high God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, His holy protection, and His merciful loving kindness, be with you and all other Christian people, especially with the sick, the suffering, and the sorrowful, this day and in every time of need. Amen.

OPENING OF AN EXTENSION TO A HOSPITAL

BLESS, we beseech Thee, this Hospital, O Lord, and bestow Thy benediction on our doings this day. Direct us in this and in all our works with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help, that being ever-mindful of the needs of our fellow-men, we may be enabled by our deeds and gifts to alleviate and heal sickness and suffering, and to forward Thy purposes of love, for the sake of Him who gave Himself in the service of men, even Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

TO THE GLORY of God, and the service of others, we dedicate this building. May peace, lowliness, kindness, gentleness, and brotherly love ever abide herein, in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

OPENING OF A CITY HALL OR MUNICIPAL BUILDING

GUIDE and direct us, O Lord, as we press forward to the building of Thy Kingdom. Help us always to begin action with a pure intention, and to continue it with Thy blessing; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

GO BEFORE US, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy Name, and be enabled to unite in mutual service for the benefit of all our citizens; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O GOD, grant us a vision of our city, fair as it might be; a city of righteousness, where none shall wrong his neighbour; a city of plenty, where evil and poverty shall be done away; a city of brother-hood, where all success shall be founded on service, and honour shall be given to nobleness alone; a city of peace, where order shall not rest on force, but on the love of all for the common life and weal. Bless the efforts of the Church to make the vision a living reality through the teaching of Thy Son, Jesus Christ. Inspire and strengthen each one of us that we may give time, thought, and sacrifice to speed the day of its coming beauty

and righteousness, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

BESTOW Thy benediction we beseech Thee, O Lord, on our undertaking this day, as we dedicate this building for the better ordering of our civic life; bless all who will serve within its walls and grant that they may be ever-mindful of the needs of their fellow-men. The Peace of God and His blessing rest upon this place, which we now dedicate for the administration of our civic government, and for the public good. May God give us light to guide us, courage to support us, and love to unite us, now and always. Amen.

THE OPENING OF LAW COURTS

WE BESEECH Thee, O Lord God, to bestow Thy benediction upon the assembly gathered in this place for the opening of our Law Courts. Here let truth and sound learning ever abound, and the eternal justice of God be meted out, causing men to reverence law, and live in harmony and obedience. May God's blessing be upon all those who are appointed to minister the Queen's justice between man and man, to clear the innocent, and to convict and punish the wrong doer. May the judges and magistrates be given the spirit of wisdom and understanding as they seek to administer the law in the fear of Thee alone. May all the work done here have good and abiding success, to the glory of God, and for the well-being of the Community and Province, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

TO THE GLORY of God, the Fountain of Wisdom, Whose statutes are good and gracious, and Whose law is truth, we bless and dedicate these Law Courts for the administration of justice, the upholding of law and order, and the continuance of all good traditions in our social life, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

THE COMMISSIONING OF MISSIONERS

If Mattins or Evensong be said before the Commissioning, Psalm 121 may be used, and the following Lessons:

isaiah 55, verses 6-13. ephesians 4, verses 7-16

After the Third Collect a hymn may be sung. Then, the Missioners having taken their places before the Bishop, he shall address them thus:

DEARLY beloved, we bid you welcome in the name of the Lord, and commend to your loving care the souls of those who shall come to listen to your message. But, since no one is sufficient for these things in his own strength, let us pray that God, Who has given you the will to do this work, may by His Spirit direct your thoughts and give power to your words, that they may be to His glory and for the salvation of those to whom you are sent.

Then shall be sung Veni, Creator Spiritus, (Hymn 480), the Missioners kneeling, the Bishop and the congregation standing. After which (the congregation still standing) the Bishop, at the Altar, will say:

Let us pray.

O LORD Jesu Christ, Who at Thy first coming didst send Thy messenger to prepare Thy way before Thee: Grant that the ministers and stewards of Thy mysteries may likewise so prepare and make ready Thy way, by turning the hearts of the disobedient to the wisdom of the just, that at Thy second coming to judge the world we may be found an acceptable people in Thy sight, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

MOST merciful Father, we beseech Thee to send upon Thy servants, the Missioners, Thy heavenly blessing, that they may be clothed with righteousness, and that Thy word spoken by their mouths may have such success, that it may never be spoken in vain. Grant also that we may have grace to hear and receive, what they shall deliver out of Thy most Holy Word, or agreeable to the same, as the means of our salvation; that in all our words and deeds we may seek Thy glory, and the increase of Thy kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop bless the Missioners, saying:

GOD the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Ghost, bless, preserve and keep you. The love of the Father encompass you. The presence of the Son overshadow you. The power of the Holy Spirit rest upon you. Go forth as ambassadors of Christ

in the name of God; and may He bless your labours abundantly. Amen.

Then shall follow the Sermon or Address.

A HYMN

Then (all kneeling) shall be said:

O LORD, bless we humbly beseech Thee, the Mission in this place. Endow all who labour in it with the spirit of power and love, and of a sound mind. Convert the impenitent; raise up the fallen; strengthen the weak; give an increase of grace to the faithful, and may all things be done after Thy will, and to Thy glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

TEACH us, good Lord, to serve Thee as Thou deservest; to give and not to count the cost; to fight and not to heed the wounds; to toil and not to seek for rest; to labour and not to ask for any reward save that of knowing that we do Thy will, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE BLESSING

THE ADMISSION OF LAY READERS

The candidates for Admission shall be habited in cassock and surplice for the service. If Evening Prayer be said before the service of Admission, Psalm 67 shall be sung or said.

The following Lessons are suggested:

JOSHUA 1. 8-9. EPHESIANS 4. 11-16.

After the Third Collect a hymn may be sung. When the candidates for admission are standing before the Bishop (sitting in his chair), the Archdeacon or some person appointed by him shall present them to the Bishop saying:

REVEREND Father in God, I present unto you these persons to be admitted to the office of Lay Reader.

The Bishop:

HATH inquiry been made into their life and conduct, and into their knowledge of the Holy Scriptures, and of the doctrine and practice of the Church as set forth in the Book of Common Prayer?

The Archdeacon shall answer:

INQUIRY hath been made, and they have been

found meet for the duties that will be required of them.

Then shall the Bishop question them as follows:

WILL you in your ministrations observe the due order and discipline of the Church, and obey those who are set in authority over you?

Answer: I will.

WILL you endeavour to frame and fashion your lives so as to be wholesome examples to the people amongst whom you live?

Answer: I will so do, by the help of the Lord.

Then shall those that are to be admitted kneel before the Bishop, who shall say:

O LORD God Almighty, Who dost vouchsafe Thy heavenly blessing to all that love Thy Word, look with favour upon these Thy servants and pour upon them the abundance of Thy grace. Amen.

MAKE them diligent and humble in their ministrations, ready to obey those who are set over them in the Lord, and careful to fashion their lives according to Thy holy will and commandments. Amen.

GRANT them to grow in grace and in the knowledge of Thy Word, that they may minister to the salvation of souls, to the glory of Thy name, and to

the edification of Thy people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop deliver into the hands of each one of them (humbly kneeling before him) the New Testament and his licence, saying:

> Then the Bishop shall say: The Lord be with you.

Answer: And with thy spirit.

Let us pray.

Lord, have mercy upon us. Christ, have mercy upon us. Lord, have mercy upon us.

OUR FATHER, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil. Amen.

BLESSED Lord, who hast caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant that we may in such wise hear them, read, mark, learn, and

inwardly digest them, that by patience, and comfort of Thy holy Word, we may embrace, and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which Thou hast given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY God, Who hast built Thy Church upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the head corner-stone: Grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their doctrine, that we may be made an holy temple acceptable unto Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, by Whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified: Receive our supplications and prayers, which we offer before Thee for all estates of men in Thy holy Church, that every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve Thee; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop bless the newly admitted Lay Readers, saying:

MAY the Lord give you wisdom, courage, strength, and love to do His will.

And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, rest upon you and upon the work which you shall do in His name, now and for evermore. Amen.

When the day appointed by the Bishop is come, the Archdeacon or his Deputy shall present unto the Bishop such as are to be admitted Deaconesses, saying these words:

REVEREND Father in God, I present unto you these persons to be admitted Deaconesses.

The Bishop

TAKE heed that these persons, whom you present unto us be apt and meet, for their learning and godly conversation, to exercise their ministry duly, to the honour of God, and the edifying of his Church.

Answer

I HAVE inquired of them, and also examined them; and believe them so to be.

Then the Bishop standing up shall say:

DEARLY beloved, in the primitive Church there was a custom to admit, by the authority of the Bishop, women of godly life and conversation, to be Deaconesses or Servants of the Church, into which ancient office these persons now present come to be admitted. We have good confidence that they are apt and competent thereto, as hath been certified to us; nevertheless, if there be any of you who

knoweth any impediment or ground on which it is inexpedient that these persons, or any of them, should be so admitted, let him now declare it.

If no impediment be alleged, then shall be sung or said the Service of the Communion beginning with the Mutual Salutation, and this Collect, Epistle and Gospel.

THE COLLECT

GRANT, O Lord, that all who teach Thy faith and serve in Thy name, may be so endued with the healthful spirit of Thy grace, that they may be of honest mind and single heart, and set forth Thy truth both by their word and life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE EPISTLE. ROMANS 16.1.

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deaconess of the church at Cenchreae, that you may receive her in the Lord as befits the saints, and help her in whatever she may require from you, for she has been a helper of many and of myself as well. Greet Priscilla and Aquila, my fellow workers in Christ Jesus, who risked their necks for my life, to whom not only I but also all the churches of the Gentiles give thanks; greet also the church in their house. Greet my beloved Epaenetus, who was the first convert in Asia for Christ. Greet Mary, who has worked hard among you.

THE GOSPEL. ST. LUKE 10.38

NOW it came to pass, as they went on their journey, that Jesus entered into a certain village; and a certain woman named Martha received Him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who was sitting at Jesus' feet and listening to His word. But Martha was distracted with much serving; and she came up to Him and said, Lord, dost Thou not care that my sister hath left me alone to serve? Bid her therefore that she help me. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha; thou art anxious and troubled about a multitude of things; one thing is needful; and Mary hath chosen the good portion, which shall not be taken away from her.

After the Nicene Creed has been said or sung, there shall be a Sermon, after which the Bishop, sitting in his chair, shall address the candidates standing before him, in this wise:

DEARLY beloved in the Lord, a Deaconess is authorized by the Church, in the place where she is licensed, to teach the Christian Faith; to give pastoral care, especially to women and young people; to read the Services of Morning and Evening Prayer and the Litany; to instruct and preach as licensed thereto by the Bishop.

DO you trust that you are inwardly moved by the Holy Ghost to take upon you this office and minis-

tration, to serve God, for the promotion of His glory, and the edifying of His people?

Answer: I trust so.

The Bishop

WILL you endeavour faithfully to fulfil the duties of your Office, and cheerfully to obey them that are over you in the Lord?

Answer: I will, by the help of God.

The Bishop

WILL you be diligent in seeking the grace of God to enable you to persevere in this endeavour, and to bring your desire to good effect?

Answer: I will.

The Bishop

DO you believe that the holy Scriptures contain sufficiently all doctrine required of necessity for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

Answer: I do so believe.

Let us pray.

ALMIGHTY God, Who hast called these Thy servants to the office and ministry of Deaconesses in Thy Church: Mercifully grant unto them grace and power to perform the work which Thou givest them to do; through Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, now and ever. Amen.

Then the Bishop, laying his hands upon the head of each woman kneeling before him, shall say:

TAKE thou authority to execute the Office of a Deaconess in the Church of God committed unto thee; In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop deliver to her the Bible saying:

BE diligent to study the things which are written in this Book, that as much as in you lieth, you may teach the Gospel of the Grace of God and be an example of faith and of holy living.

GOD the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost sanctify and bless you, and so fill you with all spiritual benediction and grace, with all faith, wisdom and humility, that you may serve Christ in His Church to the benefit of His people, and in the end attain unto life everlasting. Amen.

Then shall the Bishop proceed in the Communion with the Offertory; and they who have been made Deaconesses shall receive the holy Communion the same day with the Bishop.

The Communion ended, immediately before the Benediction shall be said the Collect following:

O ALMIGHTY Lord, and everlasting God, vouchsafe, we beseech Thee, to direct, sanctify, and govern, both our hearts and bodies, in the ways of Thy laws, and in the works of Thy commandments; that through Thy most mighty protection, both here and ever, we may be preserved in body and soul; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

THE peace of God which passeth all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in the knowledge and love of God, and of His Son Jesus Christ our Lord: And the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, be amongst you and remain with you always. Amen.

THE LICENSING OF A LAY WOMAN WORKER

The Bishop, seated near the Holy Table, shall say:

DEARLY beloved, in the Name of God, we purpose now to give licence to serve as a Lay Worker to our well-beloved in Christ ———. And we beseech you to join together with us in hearty prayer to Almighty God, that He would vouchsafe to give unto her thus licensed grace to perform aright the duties which appertain to so sacred and grave a trust.

Then shall be said, all kneeling:

Lord, have mercy upon us.

Christ, have mercy upon us.

Lord, have mercy upon us.

OUR FATHER Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; But deliver us from evil; For Thine is the kingdom, The power, and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.

- V O Lord, save Thy people:
- R And bless Thine inheritance.
- V Endue Thy Ministers with righteousness:

R And make Thy chosen people joyful.

V O Lord, let Thy mercy be shewed upon us:

R As we do put our trust in Thee.

ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, by Whose Spirit the whole body of the Church is governed and sanctified; Receive our supplications and prayers which we offer before Thee for all estates of men in Thy Holy Church, that every member of the same, in his vocation and ministry, may truly and godly serve Thee; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

GRACIOUS Lord, Who during Thy life on earth didst accept the ministry of women: Bless, we beseech Thee, Thy servant; that, strengthened by the assurance of Thy presence, she may carry the gospel of Thy love into the hearts and homes of Thy people; Who with the Father and the Holy Ghost livest and reignest, one God, world without end. Amen.

O ALMIGHTY and most merciful God, of Thy bountiful goodness keep this Thy servant, we beseech Thee, from all things that may hurt her, that she, being ready both in body and soul, may cheerfully accomplish those things that Thou wouldst have done; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

PREVENT us, O Lord, in all our doings with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then may be sung a Hymn.

To her who is admitted to serve as a

Lay Worker the Bishop delivers her licence,
and says:

I hereby authorize you to serve as a Lay Worker in the Parish of —————————————in our Diocese.

The Bishop shall then say: The Lord be with you.

Answer: And with thy spirit.

Let us pray.

O ALMIGHTY God, Who makest us to will and to do of Thy good pleasure; Give Thy servant grace that she may be faithful to the charge committed to her, and that she may be a godly example to the people among whom she is called to work, so that this life ended they may come together to Thy heavenly Kingdom, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Bishop shall bless her, saying:

UNTO God's gracious mercy and protection we commit thee. The Lord bless thee and keep thee. The Lord make His face to shine upon thee and be gracious unto thee. The Lord lift up the light of His countenance upon thee, and give thee peace, both now and for evermore. Amen.

ADMISSIONS OF OTHER LAY MINISTERS

The Priest:

WILL YOU faithfully and reverently execute the duties of your office to the best of your ability, as unto the Lord and not unto men.

Answer: I will so strive, the Lord being my helper.

SERVERS

THE LESSON. ST. LUKE 12:35

LET your loins be girded about, and your lights burning; and ye yourselves like unto men that wait for their Lord, that when He cometh and knocketh, they may open unto Him immediately. Blessed are those servants, whom the Lord when He cometh shall find watching. Verily I say unto you, that He shall gird Himself, and make them to sit down to meat, and will come forth and serve them.

THE ADMISSION

I ADMIT you to the Office of Server in this Church; and I give you this Candle as a Token of your Ministry; In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

V I will go unto the altar of God:

R Even unto the God of my joy and gladness.

Let us pray.

O GLORIOUS King, before whose heavenly throne the angels stand to do Thy will: Bless, we

beseech Thee, the Servers of Thy Church, that ministering before Thine earthly throne they may serve Thee with reverence and true holiness, to the honour and glory of Thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE CONCLUSION

Lord, have mercy upon us.

SACRISTANS or ALTAR GUILD MEMBERS.

And they lodged round about the house of God, because the charge was upon them, and the opening thereof every morning pertained to them. And certain of them had charge of the ministering vessels, that they should bring them in and out. Some of them also were appointed to oversee the vessels, and all the instruments of the sanctuary.

I ADMIT you to the office of Sacristan in this Church; and I give you this Purificator as a Token of your Ministry; In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

V In His temple doth everything speak of His honour:

R Holiness becometh Thine house for ever.

Let us pray.

O GOD, Who of old didst give the Levites the charge of the instruments of Thy holy temple: Give Thy grace, we beseech Thee, to the Sacristans of Thy Church, that devoutly caring for the vessels and vestments of Thy worship, and adorning the place of Thy sanctuary, they may make the place of Thy presence glorious; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

CATECHISTS or TEACHERS.

THE LESSON. DEUTERONOMY 4:1

NOW therefore hearken, O Israel, unto the statutes and unto the judgments, which I teach you, for to do them, that ye may live, and go in and possess the land which the Lord God of your fathers giveth you. Ye shall not add unto the word which I command you, neither shall ye diminish ought from it, that ye may keep the commandments of the Lord your God which I command you. Only take heed to thyself, and keep thy soul diligently, lest thou forget the things which thine eyes have seen, and lest they depart from thy heart all the days of thy life: but teach them thy sons, and thy sons' sons.

OTHER LAY WORKERS.

THE LESSON. ROMANS 12:6

Amen.

I ADMIT you to the Office of Warden (or Vestryman) in this Church; and I give you this Book of Canons as a Token of your Ministry; In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

V I am Thy servant, O grant me understanding:R That I may know Thy testimonies.

Let us pray.

O ETERNAL God, the fountain of all wisdom: Enlighten with Thy grace the Wardens and Vestrymen of Thy Church, and so rule their minds, and guide their counsels, that in all things they may seek Thy glory and the welfare of Thy holy Church; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE RECEPTION OF MEMBERS FROM OTHER CHURCHES

WHO HAVE BEEN BAPTIZED AND WHO HAVE RECEIVED EPISCOPAL CONFIRMATION

If the Bishop be present, the officiating Minister shall present the candidate with the following words:

REVEREND Father in God, I present unto you this person, who desires to be received into the Anglican Church of Canada.

Then shall the Bishop (or Priest, if authorized by the Bishop) speak to the candidate as follows:

DEARLY BELOVED, it is fitting that before we admit you to the Anglican Communion, we should receive full assurance that you understand what is required of you. You shall, therefore, answer plainly to these questions:

- Q. Do you declare that you have been baptized with Water in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost?
- A. I do.
- Q Do you desire to be admitted into the Anglican Communion?
- *A*. I do.

- Q Do you believe that the Anglican Church of Canada is a true part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church?
- *A*. I do.
- Q. Will you be a loyal member of the Church, accepting its doctrine and discipline?
- A. I will by the help of God.

When required by the Bishop there shall be a renewal of Baptismal vows by the candidate. Then the Bishop shall say:

ALMIGHTY God Who hath given you a will to do all these things: Grant also unto you strength and power to perform the same, that He may accomplish His work which He has begun in you: through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Here the candidate shall say: Amen.

Then the Bishop, taking him by the right hand, shall say to him:

BY the authority committed unto me in the Church of God and upon your solemn profession and earnest request, I receive you —name— into the Anglican Communion, and into membership in the Anglican Church of Canada, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

The candidate shall kneel and receive a blessing.

N.B. The Bishop may authorize a priest to use this Office in his stead.

Before this Office is used, the candidiate shall sign a written renunciation of allegiance to any other Church of which he has been a member. It shall be attested by the Incumbent and two members of the congregation and, when so required, shall be read aloud by the candidate at the beginning of this Office.

THE BLESSING OF A CIVIL MARRIAGE

This form may be used when the Priest is satisfied that the Marriage is worthy of the Church's blessing.
The Priest, standing before the Altar, with the Husband and Wife standing before him, shall say:

DEARLY beloved, forasmuch as you have been joined together in holy Matrimony, which is an honourable estate instituted of God, and have come hither to ask for the blessing of the Church; I require that you promise, by the help of God, to fulfil the obligations which Christian marriage demands.

Then, addressing the Husband, the Priest shall say:

N. DOST thou promise to love this thy Wife, to comfort, honour, and keep her, in sickness and in health; and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto her, so long as ye both shall live?

And the Husband shall answer: I do.

Then addressing the Wife, the Priest shall say:

N. DOST thou promise to love this thy Husband, to comfort, honour, and keep him, in sickness and

in health; and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto him, so long as ye both shall live?

And the Wife shall answer: I do.

Then the Priest shall say:

The Lord be with you.

Answer: And with thy spirit.

Let us pray.

Then the Priest may bless the Ring or Rings; the Wife (and husband) extending the hand (or hands) toward him, he shall say:

O GOD, Whose blessed Son sanctified, with His presence, the marriage at Cana: Bless, we beseech Thee, this ring, to be the token of the union of this man and woman in holy Matrimony; that ever growing in love, they may abide in Thy peace, and continue in Thy favour unto their life's end; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Priest and the Married Persons, still standing, shall say the Lord's Prayer.

OUR FATHER, Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Then the Priest shall say:

O ETERNAL God, creator and preserver of all mankind, giver of all spiritual grace, the author of everlasting life: Send Thy blessing upon these Thy servants, this man and this woman, whom we bless in Thy Name; that they, living faithfully together, may surely perform and keep the vow and covenant betwixt them made, (whereof this ring is a token and pledge,) and may ever remain in perfect love and peace together, and live according to Thy laws; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then the Priest may add one or both of the following prayers:

O ALMIGHTY God, creator of mankind, Who only art the well-spring of life: Bestow upon these Thy servants, if it be Thy will, the gift and heritage of children; and grant that they may see their children brought up in Thy faith and fear, to the honour and glory of Thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O GOD, Who hast so consecrated the state of Matrimony that in it is represented the spiritual marriage and unity betwixt Christ and His Church: Look mercifully upon these Thy servants, that they may love, honour, and cherish each other, and so live together in faithfulness and patience, in wisdom and true godliness, that their home may be a haven of blessing and of peace; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee

and the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

Then the Priest shall join their right hands together, and say:

THOSE whom God hath joined together, let no man put asunder.

Then the Husband and Wife kneeling, the Priest shall add this Blessing:

GOD the Father, God the Son, God the Holy Ghost, bless, preserve, and keep you; the Lord mercifully with his favour look upon you, and fill you with all spiritual benediction and grace; that ye may so live together in this life, that in the world to come ye may have life everlasting. Amen.

BLESSING OF THE CRIB ON CHRISTMAS EVE

A Procession shall advance to the Crib, while the people sing

A HYMN

Arrived at the Crib, there may follow a short explanation of the Service or an Address.

Then the Priest shall say:

Let us pray.

THANKSGIVING and honour and glory be unto Thee, Almighty God, Who for us men and for our salvation didst give Thine only Son to be born in great humility of the Virgin Mary his mother. Accept and bless to our use this Christmas Crib, that it may set before us the exceeding love of our Saviour, and bring us with the shepherds and kings to pay to Him our true devotion; to Whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all praise and worship, world without end. Amen.

IN THE FAITH of Christ and in Thy Name, O God most holy, do we bless and hallow this Crib of Christmas; to set before the eyes of Thy children and servants the great love and great humility of Jesus Christ Thine only Son; Who for us men and for our salvation came down as at this time from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost

of the Virgin Mary his Mother, and was made man; to Whom with Thee and the same Spirit be all honour, majesty, glory, and worship, world without end. Amen.

LORD JESUS, Child of Bethlehem, for love of men made man; Create in us love so pure and perfect that whatsoever our heart loveth may be after Thy will, in Thy Name, and for Thy sake; Who now livest and reignest in the glory of the Eternal Trinity, God for ever and ever. Amen.

OUR FATHER Who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, On earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

- V Glory to God in the highest:
- R And on earth peace, goodwill towards men.
- V Blessed is He that cometh in the Name of the Lord:
- R Hosanna in the highest.

Then shall a hymn be sung, and the service concluded with the blessing, unless it be followed by the Midnight Eucharist.

THE BLESSING OF PALMS

O GOD, Whose Son for the salvation of mankind came down from heaven, and when the hour of His Passion was at hand willed to enter into Jerusalem riding upon an ass, and to be hailed as King by the multitude; increase the faith of them that trust in Thee, and mercifully hear the prayers of Thy suppliants. Let Thy manifold mercies come upon us; and vouchsafe to bless these branches of palms, that all who carry them may be fulfilled with Thy benediction. And grant that as the Hebrew children met the same Thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ with branches of palms in their hands, crying Hosanna in the highest; so we also, carrying these emblems, may with good works go forth to meet Christ, and attain to everlasting felicity, through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

WE BLESS, and sanctify these branches of palm, O Lord, that we who bear them in Thy Name may ever hail Jesus as our King, through the same Thy Son, Jesus Christ our Saviour, to Whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

- V O Saviour of the world, Who by Thy Cross and precious Blood hast redeemed us:
- R Save us and help us, we humbly beseech Thee, O Lord.

THE BLESSING OF FLAGS

ALMIGHTY GOD, who from ancient times hast put it into the hearts of Thy people to make offerings for Thy service and the use of Thy Church, and Who hast been pleased at all times to accept gifts at their hands; Accept, we pray Thee, these flags which we now set apart in Thy Name, and as a sign of our duty towards our Queen and country. May Thy blessing rest upon the gifts and the givers thereof, that Thy Church may be benefitted and Thy name exalted and glorified continually; we ask this in the Name and for the merits of Thy Son Iesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O LORD Jesus Christ, Who hast promised that the gates of hell shall not prevail against Thy Church, bless and hallow, we beseech Thee, these flags, and grant that all who behold them may be reminded of our fellowship with one another in Christ and aroused to greater loyalty and determination to persevere as Thy faithful soldiers and servants unto their life's end. All of which we ask in Thy name, O Captain of our Salvation, Who livest and reignest with the Father and the Holy Ghost, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

SPECIAL PRAYERS

THE ANGLICAN COMMUNION

ALMIGHTY and Everlasting God, Who hast established Thy Church throughout the world, and hast gathered to Thyself a great company to worship Thee out of every nation: we praise and bless Thee for the fellowship which is ours in the Anglican Communion. Strengthen, we beseech Thee, the bonds of common faith and service which unite us. Give grace and wisdom to those whom Thou hast called to direct and order the life of Thy Church, (and especially to Thy servant —————) that enlightened by Thy truth and upheld by Thy power, they may exercise their ministry to Thy glory, and the building up of the Body of Christ. We ask this in the Name of Thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to Whom with Thee and the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.

ALMIGHTY God, our heavenly Father, we pray Thee to bless the churches of the Anglican Communion throughout the world. Grant that being faithful to the trust which Thou hast committed to us, Thy Holy Spirit may enkindle our zeal and strengthen our service, until all tongues confess and bless Thee, and the sons of men love Thee and serve Thee in peace, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOR A DIOCESAN CENTENARY

GOD of our fathers, Who by Thy Spirit hast builded up this Diocese within Thy Holy Church, we give Thee humble thanks for all, whether known to us or unknown, who in these hundred years have herein wrought for Thee; we praise Thee for treasures of truth and love, for fruits of faith and work, through them bestowed on us; and we beseech Thee so to renew in us Thy Spirit that we may steadfastly seek Thy will for us and for our children, and both in life and worship may show forth Thy love and magnify Thy name, through Iesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

GRANT, Almighty God, that the purpose wherewith Thou didst call this Diocese into being may be fulfilled, and Thy life continually renewed in our several parishes; that this celebration of Thy power in the ministry of our Bishops and Priests, and of all other Thy faithful servants in the Church of this Diocese may be acceptable unto Thee, and may bring forth fruits to Thy glory, Who ever livest and reignest God for ever and ever. Amen.

O GOD of our fathers, Who hast brought and blessed Thy Church in this Diocese through a hundred years; accept our thanksgiving and guide and prosper by Thy Holy Spirit our new resolves, to the setting forward of Thy kingdom and the salvation of Thy people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The above prayers may be adapted for a parochial centenary or other anniversary.

O HEAVENLY Father, we pray for those who, out of bitter memories of strife and loss, are seeking a more excellent way for the nations of the world, whereby justice and order may be maintained and the differences of peoples be resolved in equity. Bestow Thy blessing, we beseech Thee, upon the United Nations, and upon all who labour for peace and righteousness among the peoples; that the day may be hastened when war shall be no more, and Thy will only shall govern the nations upon earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

FOR THE HEALING OF THE WORLD'S DIVISIONS AND SORROWS

ETERNAL God, the Father of all mankind: We commit to Thee the needs of the whole world: where there is hatred, give love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is distrust, faith; where

there is sorrow, hope; where there is darkness, light; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O MOST Holy Spirit of God, from Whom alone floweth the fulness of wisdom and life: Come in Thine everlasting power and glory upon Thy Church and into the hearts of men; to bring to the world a new birth of holiness, new understanding of truth, and new unity in love; in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord, Who with the Father and Thee liveth and reigneth, one God for ever and ever. Amen.

FOR CHOIRS AND MINISTERS OF THE SANCTUARY

O LORD God Almighty, Whose glory Cherubim and Seraphim and all the hosts of heaven with ceaseless voice proclaim; Hear and accept, we humbly beseech Thee, the praises of Thy Church below; and pour down upon Thy ministers in choir and sanctuary such a spirit of faith, reverence, and joy as shall lift both their hymns and their lives unto Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THANKSGIVING FOR THE PRAYER BOOK

O GOD, Who through the witness and ministry of our fathers in the days of old hast given unto us a marvellous tradition of faith and worship in our Book of Common Prayer and hast spread the fame of it throughout the world, we pray Thee that we may ever be thankful to Thee for the same and wholly walk in the light thereof until all nations shall worship and serve Thee, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ALMIGHTY and eternal God, by Whose providence this Church and people have received the Book of Common Prayer for the ordering of their prayers and praises; grant that, being ever thankful for the same, they may receive the help of Thy grace to worship Thee with understanding and with holy fear, in spirit and in truth, and in the blest communion of Thy saints; through Christ our Saviour, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Ghost, one God, world without end. Amen.
